Donation boxes kept for the proposed Babri Masjid-style mosque by suspended TMC MLA Humayun Kabir in West Bengal's Murshidabad district are nearly full, with cash-counting machines whirring through the night as donations continue to pour in both physically and online.

Eleven large stainless steel donation boxes were placed at the venue, with Kabir appealing for public contributions for the mosque's

Since then, supporters have continued to arrive with cash and even bricks for the structure, locals said. Cash-counting began at 7 pm on Sunday and continued till midnight, carried out by a team of 30 people using special machines.

The remaining seven boxes are scheduled to be opened from 5 pm on Monday, with the same team overseeing the process. To

ensure transparency, the counting was live-streamed, Kabir said.

Kabir claimed the response had "exceeded all expectations", with donations allegedly also coming in from outside India.

Arrangements are being made to shift the collected money to a secured room with CCTV surveillance, and discussions are underway with banks regarding its safe handling, they added.

Trai rejects DoT view to hike satcom spectrum charge to 5%

Telecom regulator Trai on Monday rejected the Department of Telecom's view, suggesting a 5 per cent annual spectrum fee to be charged from satcom (satellite communications) players instead of 4 per cent, and let go of a Rs 500 fee per connection.

Citizens, not illegal migrants, have right to resources: Yogi

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has said that the citizens of the state have the first right over public resources and not illegal migrants.

In a letter addressed to the people of Uttar Pradesh, he referred to a recent Supreme Court observation that the country cannot lay out a red carpet for infiltrators and asserted that such elements would not be accepted at any cost.

Yogi Adityanath wrote that the state government has launched strict and decisive action against Rohingya and Bangladeshi nationals staying

illegally in Uttar Pradesh. He said that security of the state, social balance and a strong law and order system remain the highest priorities of his administration.

All urban local bodies have been instructed to identify suspected foreign nationals and prepare lists. He said that illegal occupants put a burden on public resources and hamper welfare benefits meant for the poor. A special document verification campaign is underway to detect infiltrators and send them to detention centres for further legal action.

Detention facilities are being established in every division to support the process.

Punjab Cong suspends Navjot Kaur Sidhu

Navjot Kaur Sidhu, former Punjab legislator and wife of cricketer-turned-politician Navjot Singh Sidhu, a former Punjab Congress chief, was suspended from the primary membership of the Congress on Monday, days after she reportedly remarked that "one who gives a suitcase of Rs 500 crore becomes the chief minister".

The announcement about her suspension came from state party chief Amarinder Singh Raja Warring on X in which he shared the party's official letter about it.

Her remark had whipped up a political controversy on Saturday when she reportedly alleged that "one who gives a suitcase of Rs 500 crore becomes the chief minister". She stated this while replying to a question during her interaction with newsmen after meeting Punjab governor Gulab Chand Kataria over the issue of the law-and-order situation in the state.

The said comment was lapped up by the rival political parties which targeted the

Congress over its "internal functioning" ahead of the 2027 assembly polls.

However, sources held that the party took a serious note of her remarks which seemed to be aimed at the state leadership with the state rural polls - Zila parishad and Panchayat Samiti election - being around the corner.

This despite her statements on Sunday that she was shocked to see the twist given to a straight comment. Stating that their Congress party had never demanded anything from them and that on being asked about Navjot becoming a chief minister face from any other party, she had stated that they did not have money to offer for a CM post.


She was responding to a question on Navjot Singh Sidhu's return to active police when she also said that he would only contest again if the party declared him its CM face for 2027.

dum maro dum! Silicon Valley of India now a drug hub?

The Silicon Valley of India is fast becoming the narcotics hub of the country and the year-end rush to dump the city with narcotic substances for the several bashes planned is giving anti-narcotic bureau officials sleepless nights.

The narcotics mafia in Bengaluru is so huge that even

across Asia and Africa. While major supplies from Asia come via the Golden Crescent and Golden Triangle cartels, the mules would transport narcotics via air, water and road. The African cartel is active via Tanzania, Nigeria and Ivory Coast, where the citizens of those countries come on either education or business visas.

During the last three years, Karnataka has registered over

15,678 narcotics-related cases and arrested over 19,197 people.

Interestingly, 211 foreign nationals have been detained in connection with narcotics transport, over 300 foreigners have been deported in narcotics-related cases. In last 3 years, over 19,308 tons of marijuana and 1,244 tons of synthetic narcotics have been confiscated. In 2025, narcotics worth over Rs 162 crore have

been confiscated in Bengaluru alone. Not just Bengaluru, narcotics networks have reached the taluk levels. The Golden Crescent cartel comprises Afghanistan, Pakistan and Iran. While Afghanistan cultivates pure opium, it is smuggled in through Punjab and Rajasthan. From there, the same is transported to Bengaluru through buses and trains, hiring unsuspecting people as mules.

District Magistrate holds meeting with representatives of recognized national and state political parties regarding the Special Intensive Revision Program

District Magistrate Manish Kumar Verma held a meeting with representatives of recognized national and state political parties in the Sangam Auditorium on Monday regarding the Special Intensive Revision Program of electoral rolls for Assembly constituencies. He reported that approximately 91.37 percent of voter enumeration forms have been collected and digitized by BLOs so far. He informed the political party representatives about the progress of the Assembly-wise SIR and informed them that voters who are not found during the door-to-door survey, are deceased, are duplicates, have completely moved, or are refusing to return the enumeration forms are being verified and included in the ASD list prepared by the respective BLOs. The updated



ASD list is being shared daily with representatives appointed by political parties and BLAs, booth-wise. The ASD list includes the voter's serial number, EPIC number, name, and the reason for inclusion. He stated that if a voter is incorrectly marked in the updated ASD list by the BLO, the objection should be submitted to the concerned BLO or ERO, so that the voter's name can be rolled back. He urged political party representatives to complete and submit the remaining forms as soon as possible, without waiting for the December 11th deadline, so that the remaining voters do not face any technical or other problems in the final days. The

District Magistrate requested the political party representatives' cooperation. He directed all political party representatives to activate their booth-level agents to ensure the remaining voter forms are filled and provided to the BLOs. The District Magistrate said that the work of SIR is very important, it has to be completed on priority basis within the stipulated time period. He told the voters that if you are facing any difficulty in filling your form, then you can contact your BLO and call center number 1950 and 0532-2644024. Apart from this, the facility of filling the form is also available online at <https://voters.eci.gov.in/>.

Voter turnout during Phase 4?

Temperatures are rising and it is amid this unpleasant weather that India is heading to the second phase of its general elections. The Lok Sabha polls are being held in seven phases, with the counting of votes on 4 June. Extreme heat is being blamed for the low voter turnout in the first phase of polling on 19 April when 102 Lok Sabha seats spread across 21 states and Union Territories voted. A dip of 4.4 per cent was recorded in these seats, as the voter turnout stood at 65.5 per cent this year from 69.9 per cent in the 2019 general elections. As 13 states and Union Territories go to polls on 26 April in the second phase, will the heatwave impact the voter turnout?

Which states are going to poll?

The 4th phase of polling will cover 89 constituencies in 12 states and one Union Territory. Kerala's all 20 Lok Sabha seats, 14 in Karnataka, 13 in Rajasthan, eight seats each in Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh, seven in Madhya Pradesh, five each in Assam and Bihar, three each in West Bengal and Chhattisgarh and one each in Tripura, Manipur and Jammu and Kashmir.

Are there heatwave predictions?

There is a heatwave warning for parts of four states – West Bengal, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh and Karnataka – going to polls in the second phase. According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD) forecast, hot and humid weather is expected in Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura, Konkan, Goa, Coastal Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Karaikal, Kerala and Mahe. "Heatwave to severe heatwave conditions likely to prevail in some pockets over Gangetic West Bengal and in isolated pockets over Odisha; heatwave conditions in isolated pockets over Uttar Pradesh, sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Jharkhand, Bihar, Coastal Andhra Pradesh and Yanam, Rayalseema, Telangana and interior Karnataka," as per the IMD. Speaking to NDTV, Dr Naresh Kumar, senior scientist at the IMD, said that the weather agency has issued a red alert for West Bengal for the next three days.

"Temperatures in Bihar will exceed 40 degrees Celsius. A heatwave is expected in eastern Uttar Pradesh after 24 hours and in western Uttar Pradesh after two days. The temperature will remain hot and humid in Kerala too," he said.

Gujarat, central Maharashtra and north Karnataka are most vulnerable to heatwaves, followed by Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, north Chhattisgarh, Odisha and Andhra Pradesh, as per the IMD.

What is the EC doing?

A day back, the IMD Director General, Mrutunjay Mohapatra, assured the Election Commission of India (ECI) that heatwave is not a major concern for the second phase of elections. The ECI Monday (22 April) formed a task force consisting of officials from the IMD, the poll body, the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), and the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare to assess the impact of heatwave and humidity five days before each phase of polling. This came after the election commission held a meeting with the IMD and representatives of the Union Health Ministry to comprehend the developing weather situation and discuss mitigation measures. Planting trees is a simple solution to counter air pollution

As Delhi grapples with yet another harrowing bout of air pollution caused by Ghazipur landfill fires, the city, especially its eastern part, finds itself ensnared in a blanket of toxic smog, pushing its air quality index to alarming levels again. With readings skyrocketing to several times the World Health Organization's recommended limit, the severity of the situation has prompted drastic measures, including school closures and restric-

tions on construction activities. This onslaught of pollution not only poses immediate health risks but also casts a long shadow over the residents' quality of life, with projections suggesting a staggering reduction of 10 years in life expectancy. Health experts equate breathing this hazardous smog to smoking a staggering 14 cigarettes every day. Laden with nanoparticles capable of infiltrating the lungs and bloodstream, this lethal smog poses a grave threat, fueling respiratory ailments and health complications. In the face of this crisis, the urgent need for effective solutions to combat air pollution has never been more evi-

dent. It is no news that the scourge of pollution has seeped into every facet of our lives – the water we drink, the soil we rely on for sustenance, and the very air we breathe. This dire reality confronts millions in bustling metropolises across the globe, where densely packed populations are disproportionately exposed to harmful contaminants. As these pollutants infiltrate our environment, they accumulate, magnifying in intensity as they ascend the food chain. With urbanisation advancing at breakneck speed and our demands on natural resources escalating, we stand close to tainting the very essence of our existence.

Clean air to fill our lungs, uncontaminated food to nourish our bodies – these are not luxuries, but fundamental necessities for our survival. Can we, in good conscience, stand idly by as our cities succumb to this relentless march of degradation? The time for action is now.

What is pollution?

Before we unpack why pollution occurs or how to mitigate it, it is vital to ask, what do we exactly mean by pollution in our cities. Pollution occurs when high concentrations of substances persist in the environment due to human activities or natural events, which have harmful effects to the environment.

The remarkable rise of Biharis in Delhi: From cheap labour to influential vote-bank



The emergence of the Purvanchalis/Biharis as the most influential electoral community is a story of a long journey of struggle and perseverance. During the watershed Assembly election in Delhi in 2013, the then Chief Minister Sheila Dikshit was looking forward to a fourth term. The confidence emanated from the development overhaul she carried out during the 2010 Commonwealth Games.

Though the Congress government at the Centre was mired in allegations of corruption, Dikshit felt assured of steering clear of it. However, then Congress member of Lok Sabha from West Delhi, Mahabal Mishra, had warned Dikshit about an impending defeat and had suggested to her that she could gamble by giving a large chunk of tickets to the party workers from Purvanchal (migrants from east UP and Bihar). Dikshit, who was never comfortable with Mishra, saw it as a ruse on the part of the Purvanchali leader to create a claim for himself as a rival to her. As the results came out, she was dismayed that her development drive was drowned in the cacophony let loose by the Anna Hazare movement, whose product is the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP). The arrival of Arvind Kejriwal and the AAP marked the beginning of a new

genre of politics. During the past three decades, Delhi has undergone a deep demographic change. The migrants arriving in the city, which is North India's El Dorado, have given a new character to its social and cultural life. From being poor tenants in the unauthorised colonies, they are now proud holders of plots but have been fighting with successive governments for the assertion of their civic rights. Their struggle has not been limited to the recognition of their housing plots. They eke out a living fighting various forces of corruption aka government. The Congress and the BJP all those years instead of holding their hand depended on poll malpractices, exploiting their poverty to get their mandate. The migrants from the eastern districts of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Jharkhand and some districts of Madhya Pradesh bordering these areas for

long looked for a role in the politics of the national capital. When Kejriwal, during the campaign in 2015, said to accept liquor and money from the Congress and the BJP but vote for him, he showed that he had his ear to the ground. In that poll, the AAP had put up Purvanchali candidates in 15 out of 70 seats and they all romped home. Today, Mahabal Mishra is AAP's candidate from West Delhi. His son Vinay is an AAP MLA from their traditional Dwarka seat. For the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, for which voting is scheduled in Delhi on May 26, the BJP has fielded one Bihar candidate Manoj Tiwari, the sitting MP from the North East Delhi seat. AAP-Congress has fielded three Biharis – Kanhaiya Kumar from North East Delhi, Somnath Bharti from the New Delhi seat and the veteran Mahabal Mishra from the West Delhi seat.

While Kanhaiya Kumar and Manoj Tiwari are imports into the capital's politics, Mahabal Mishra and Somnath Bharti have grown politically in the national capital. One may recall that Mahabal Mishra was the first Bihar to win an electoral battle, winning a seat as a corporator from Nasirpur in Outer Delhi in 1996.

Though before him, a Purvanchali, Lal Bihari Tiwari had won Assembly polls from the East Delhi seat of Ghonda and become a minister in the state BJP government. Later, Tiwari won three consecutive Lok Sabha polls in 1997 (bypoll), 1998 and 1999. However, there is a marked difference in the politics of Tiwari and the present-day Bihar politicians in the capital – from meek submission to that of aggressive assertion. According to the data released by the Election Commission, Delhi has a total of 1,47,42,145 voters – 79,98,652 male, 67,42,330 female and 1163 from the third gender. This is up by about 6.5 per cent from 1,38,46,482 in 2019. According to estimates, 33.5 per cent of the total 1.48 crore voters across the seven Lok Sabha constituencies are Purvanchalis. Their presence varies from 24 per cent in Chandni Chowk to 41 per cent in East Delhi. On the

North East Delhi seat, they constitute 40 per cent of the votes, while they account for 37 per cent of votes in New Delhi, 34 per cent in West Delhi, 31 per cent in North West Delhi and 27 per cent in South Delhi. Today, there isn't a constituency in Delhi where the 'Chhath' festival of Bihar is not celebrated.

But will the Biharis vote as a bloc or would have ideological preferences depending on their allegiance in the home state? This is something which the political parties, especially the BJP, would be accountable for. There are two other crucial seats – New Delhi and West Delhi, where the BJP needs to crack the Bihar pot to sail through.

The selection of Bihar candidates for the Lok Sabha polls from Delhi by both the major formations – Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Aam Aadmi Party-Congress alliance clearly indicate that Purvanchalis, rather Biharis, have become a major political entity in the national capital. Today, they are not just at par but more influential than other major electoral blocks like that of Punjabis, Vaishyas, Gujjars, Jats and minorities. Numerically, the two formations together have fielded two Vaishyas, two Gujjars, two Punjabis, one Jat, three Scheduled Caste (two from reserved seats).

Why Iran, Israel avoided crossing red lines

Rewriting the rules of engagement is challenging, but undoubtedly both Iran and Israel have made a symbolic statement and managed the escalation cycle wherein they have played to the gallery as far as their domestic audience is concerned. On April 14, Iran launched its first direct military offensive against Israel. The attack consisted of over 300 Shahed drones, cruise missiles, and ballistic missiles. The launch was detected immediately, and the Israeli forces on high alert had approximately two hours of response time before the drones reached Israeli airspace.

The strike was then taken apart as it moved across the Middle East by members of the US-led Middle East Air Defence Alliance, which included jets from the RAF, the Jordanian Air

Forces, and the US Air Force. Most of the surviving munitions were then intercepted by Israel's Air Defence Systems, which include the Iron Dome, David's Sling, and Arrow 2 and 3. At least five penetrated through these defences and struck targets in and around an Nevatim Air Base in the Negev Desert. These five hits resulted in no casualties and caused only structural damage.

The world was on edge, and there was danger that a threatened Israeli retaliation would result in a regional, if not wider, conflict. Crude prices spiked, markets dropped across the globe, and gold reached new heights. For India, one of the major dangers of escalation was the blocking of the Straits of Hormuz, as it would result in disruption of both crude and

natural gas. The Israeli reaction took place within the week. On April 19, they struck a military airbase near the city of Isfahan, and Iranian officials also claimed to have shot down small drones near the northern city of Tabriz, but this was downplayed. Isfahan Province, in the centre of Iran, is home to significant Iranian military infrastructure, including a large air base, a major missile production complex, and nuclear facilities. As per reports in the Jerusalem Post, the Israelis were targeting an air defence radar site near Isfahan that's part of the protection of the Natanz nuclear facility. The choreography of missile strikes once again ensured that there were no casualties and, moreover, no targeting of Iranian nuclear facilities.

'Mind your own democracy'

When prejudiced opinion posts masquerade as journalism, it violates one of the four foundational pillars of democracy. As mainstream media is pivotal in shaping popular perceptions and helps the voter make informed choices in an election year, much of the Western observers' anti-India blitzkrieg must be discounted by the discerning voter due to its inherent bias and colonial mindset.

A free, fair and thriving multi-party democracy is at work at the scale of 970 million, as Indians ready to exercise their franchise in the general elections. Stunningly ignoramus and half-informed foreign scribes that write for global media outlets, West's India watchers, activists and NGOs are on overdrive to undermine the integrity of the Indian democratic process.

The woke brigade of journo who anoint themselves as upholders of liberal democracy are completely disconnected from the vox populi of the voting nation. Their feedback loops are through proxy, based on what they hear and perceive, and not by touring the expansive electoral terrain.

The voter-on-the-ground, primarily comprising rural and urban middle classes, neither read the likes of The Economist, New York

Times, UK Guardian, Chatham House, Le Monde France, La Croix International Catholic News etc., nor hear the views on BBC, CNN or Bloomberg. Besides, in a country with 80 per cent of the population comprising Hindus, the resurgence of Hindu nationalism renders the opinions of the elitist Western collective as redundant and powerless to influence or impact India's electoral outcomes. For too long, international institutions of the West have held sway in determining the pecking order of 170 nations, whether it is in determining their sovereign credit ratings or democratic credentials. In proportion to India's growing heft, and being the

largest democracy, it is a step in the right direction that India has set in motion the process of redefining the codes for an alternative 'Global Standard for Elections', and creating its own metrics of gauging the democracy ratings index in collaboration with the Observer Research Foundation. Much has transformed during Modi's decadal tenure. India has indeed emerged as the nation of the decade, and a critical player in just about every issue pivotal to playing peacemaker on geo-political tensions, or issues facing the planet. India's inclusive economic growth under Modi and its expanding global ascendence has made it a formidable global power. It is therefore no surprise that Modi as the front runner is poised for a successive third term, and is expected to return in a stronger avatar in 2024. Should that happen, the pace of economic reforms and saturation of flagship schemes is expected to accelerate. An industrial prime minister helming the fifth largest economy is an intimidating prospect for the US and Western nations, as the more the axis of economic power steadily shifts towards India, one expects negative news blitzes from foreign soil to further intensify.

Why West fears a stronger India

This is exactly what the Western mainstream media in cahoots with India's opposition parties, and external lobbyists are striking at. They would prefer an electoral outcome that throws up a rag-tag coalition with a weakened prime minister, one who would be subservient to their business and political interests in preference to a strong, assertive and nationalist PM who would pursue nation-first interests, undaunted by the US or the Western powers. We are living through a period of tumultuous change, as the global order crumbles, and the writ of multilateral institutions is ineffective in controlling geopolitical tensions.

preventing any ineligible individuals from being added as voters.

The Chief Minister stated that with panchayat elections scheduled for next year followed by the Assembly elections, the organisation's

groundwork must remain strong. Teams were instructed to inform citizens about ongoing central and state schemes during voter-list outreach.

Meanwhile, preparations were in place to show the Chief

Minister the under-construction War Memorial in the city, where arrangements including a red carpet had been made. However, due to unspecified reasons, the visit did not occur, leaving the preparations unused.

Illegal cough syrup trail reaches Nepal and Bangladesh

Authorities in Uttar Pradesh have constituted a state-level Special Investigation Team to investigate the alleged supply of toxic cough syrup in multiple districts. The SIT will function under an Inspector General-rank officer, senior officials confirmed during a briefing on Monday.

According to the DGP and the Principal Secretary (Home), no deaths linked to the cough syrup have been reported so far. However, the state has intensified action against illegal drug networks involved in the distribution of the product. A total of 128 FIRs have been registered against individuals connected to the supply chain, including licensed stockists who allegedly diverted medicines for unauthorized sale.

Officials stated that five key accused had been identified, of which three have been arrested. Preliminary inputs suggest that the same syrup was being smuggled into Bangladesh and Nepal. Investigators are examining the financial trail of the involved firms and individuals to establish the scale of the operation.

Authorities said that no offender would be exempted and added that extradition proceedings would be initiated against accused persons who fled to Dubai.

Small Question, Big Change: College led revolution

While anaemia remains a silent crisis across India, it takes on an especially urgent face in Uttar Pradesh. According to recent data from the Anaemia Mukt Bharat initiative, 67.1% of children aged 6-59 months and 59.1% of adolescent girls aged 15-19 years are anaemic (DHS Program; Press Information Bureau; UNICEF). In Uttar Pradesh, 52.9% of adolescent girls and 50.6% of women of reproductive age are affected. Yet, the real challenge, experts say, lies not only in the scale of

the problem but in how communities choose to respond to it. In Majhigawan village of Sandeela, teachers at Gandhi Inter College became a vital link between classroom learning and community behaviour. Their engagement helped transform awareness about nutrition into practical action. Among them, Dr. Ravendra Singh stood out for his patient, human approach—one that turned small classroom interactions into lasting lessons about health.

When he noticed students' limited understanding of their

own health, Dr. Singh began ensuring regular haemoglobin (Hb) testing for every adolescent. He used simple, clear explanations to teach why iron tablets matter, why they shouldn't be taken with milk, and how ordinary food can boost haemoglobin levels.

One day, he saw a boy dozing off during class. Instead of reprimanding him, Dr. Singh gently asked, "Why are you sleepy? Did you check your blood level?" The student hesitated, then admitted feeling tired often. Tests later showed his Hb level was just 7.3. The teacher's calm explanation of how low haemoglobin causes fatigue and poor concentration resonated deeply with the class—sparkling curiosity and conversation among peers.

That small moment led to a deeper transformation. For Dr. Singh himself, the experience became personal when he got his own Hb tested for the first time.

No Palestinian state, declares Netanyahu

ISRAEL

Israel will not allow the creation of a Palestinian state, since its true purpose is the destruction of "the one and only Jewish state," Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said.

Netanyahu made the remarks on Sunday in Jerusalem during a joint press conference with German Chancellor Friedrich Merz. While Merz reaffirmed Berlin's commitment to the creation of an independent Palestinian state, Netanyahu openly disagreed with him, claiming that such an entity would be "committed to our destruction at our doorstep."

"They already had a state in Gaza, a de facto state, and it was used to try to destroy the one and only Jewish state," Netanyahu stated, referring to the Palestinian enclave that has been effectively run by the militant group Hamas.

Israel believes that there's "a path to advance a broader peace with the Arab states" and to "establish a workable peace with our Palestinian neighbors" that does not involve the creation of an independent entity, he added.

Israel's prime minister has repeatedly rejected the two-state solution proposed by the UN Security Council. The scheme entails the creation of a Palestinian state

Palestine is the only solution: Pope

A two-state resolution is the only option that can guarantee justice for Israelis and Palestinians, Pope Leo XIV has said. He made the remarks while flying from Türkiye to Lebanon on Sunday for the second leg of his first international trip as pontiff. The Vatican formally recognized Palestinian statehood in 2015, and the Holy See has repeatedly backed a two-state solution. His comments on the flight, however, marked his strongest call yet for official international recognition amid the war in Gaza.

US President Donald Trump said Sunday (Dec 7) that he was "a little bit disappointed" with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky for not engaging with or reading his proposal aimed at ending the war with Russia. Speaking to reporters on the red carpet at the Kennedy Centre Honours, Trump said he had been in touch with both Vladimir Putin and senior Ukrainian officials while expressing his disappointment with Zelensky.

Talking to the press, the POTUS said, "So we've been speaking to President Putin and we've been speaking to Ukrainian leaders -- including Zelensky, President Zelensky -- and I have to say that I'm a little bit disappointed that President Zelensky hasn't yet read the proposal, that was as of a few hours ago."

The comment came after several days of talks between US and Ukrainian officials wrapped up on Saturday (Dec 6) without any major breakthrough. Zelensky, however, did agree to continue discussions in the hope of moving closer to what he



US NOT IDIOT WITH CHEQUEBOOK

His comment, posted on X on December 7, triggered a wave of reactions, with users pointing out that his own wife, Usha Vance, is the daughter of Indian immigrants. Many also referenced Erika Kirk while mocking the Vice President's stance.

Vance was responding to a post claiming that immigration crackdowns benefit American workers. He argued that those who support the "old system" profit from it, while ordinary Americans suffer. However, his critics quickly highlighted what they view as hypocrisy, given that Usha Vance is the first Asian American and first Hindu American Second Lady of the United States.

Social media users accused

While Paris supports the European Commission's broader plan for a "reparations loan" to provide Kyiv with €90 billion over the next two years, it rejects any move that would require commercial banks to transfer Russian funds into an EU-backed loan mechanism.

French officials argue that private banks operate under different contractual obligations than Euroclear, the Belgium-based clearinghouse that holds the bulk of frozen Russian assets and whose profits the EU hopes to tap. Commission President Ursula von der Leyen last week outlined two options: EU-level borrowing backed by the bloc's budget, or a reparations loan financed through income generated by immobilized Russian assets.

Meanwhile, the US is reportedly urging some EU countries to block the reparations-loan proposal, insisting frozen Russian funds should remain leverage for eventual peace talks.

audience, the Duke of Sussex said people often asked him if growing up in the British Royal Family resembled Julian Fellowes' hit period drama. "Yeah," he quipped, "but only one of those worlds is filled with drama, intrigue, elaborate dinners, marriages to Americans—and the other is a TV show."

Harry, who moved to California with Meghan Markle after stepping back from

royal duties in 2020, joked about adjusting to "a new world" in the US where Americans celebrate "independence from my great, great, great, great, great, great-grandfather" every 4 July. The event also honored Downton Abbey creator Lord Julian Fellowes.

The Duke reflected on the show's themes—aristocracy, family tensions, and

historic moments—noting that while the series captures grandeur and drama, royal life involved "far more chaos" than television ever showed.

Looking ahead to the 2026 FIFA World Cup, jointly hosted by the US, Canada, and Mexico, Harry playfully

warned British fans to "behave, get through customs, and past ICE" to support England and Scotland on American soil, calling their joint qualification "a Christmas miracle."

Harry's appearance followed his comedic cameo on The Late Show with Stephen Colbert, where he spoofed himself auditioning for a Hallmark-style "Christmas prince" role and joked about

America's "obsession" with royalty. The Duke, son of King Charles III and the late Princess Diana, spent years serving in the military, including tours in Afghanistan, before stepping back from royal life.
