assassinated our Father of the Nation. Today, our friends have pushed him away. That is an uncomfortable truth, but the project does not end there. As I said, everything comes from votes.


All institutions come from votes. Therefore, it is clear that the RSS must take over all the institutions that emerge

Attack on Maoism, 1106 Naxalites killed in 1825 days

Under a strategy formulated by the Union Home Ministry, a strong crackdown on Maoism is underway. Since 2019, 1,106 Naxalites have been killed. Additionally, 7,311 Naxalites have been arrested, and 5,571 have surrendered. Since 2014, 9,588 Maoists have surrendered, with 2,167 of these surrenders occurring this year. Due to the positive results of various government initiatives, violent incidents have decreased



by 81 percent in 2024 compared to the peak in 2010. Union Minister of State for Home Affairs Nitin Gadkari, in response to a question during a Parliament session, stated that Left Wing Extremists have no faith in the Indian Constitution or Indian democracy. They have

no faith in the founding principles of the Indian nation. These Left Wing Extremists have killed thousands of innocent people, orphaned thousands of children, and ruined the lives of thousands of women. The problem of Left Wing Extremism has been ongoing since 1967.

Court refuses urgent hearing on IndiGo's recent crisis

During the discussion on electoral reforms in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday, Congress member Manish Tewari made three demands for electoral reforms. He called for changes in the selection of Election Commission officials, the abolition of the Special Revision (SIR) of voter lists, and a ban on direct cash transfers before elections. Manish Tewari stated that on June 15, 1949, Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar presented a draft of the Election Commission, and several members advocated for its permanent status. Following this, Dr. Ambedkar established it as a permanent institution.

Nawabganj Police Reveal Adampur Incident, Case Registered Under Serious Sections

Prayagraj. Nawabganj Police have taken major action in a case of assault related to a land dispute. Police have arrested nine wanted accused in the case. This action was taken under the direction of the Police Commissioner and Additional Commissioner of Police, and under the supervision of the Deputy Commissioner of Police and Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police, Ganganagar. The incident occurred on December 8, 2025, in village Jhokri Adampur. A fight broke out between two sides of a family over a land dispute. It is alleged that the accused abused the plaintiff's brothers, threatened to kill them, and assaulted them with sticks and other weapons. The plaintiffs sustained serious injuries in the attack and were subsequently hospitalized for treatment. Based on the complaint, a case was registered at

Nawabganj Police Station under serious sections of the Indian Penal Code under case number 538/2025. Acting swiftly, the police arrested all nine wanted accused on December 9, 2025, near Adampur Jhokri village. The arrested accused include Birendra Kumar Shukla, Sachchidanand Shukla, Ashok Kumar Shukla, Anmol Shukla, Aditya Shukla, Yagya Narayan Shukla, Premshankar Shukla, Shivshankar Shukla, and Ramkumar Shukla. All are residents of Jhokri Adampur village, Nawabganj police station. According to police records, several of these accused have previously been charged with serious crimes, including assault, rioting, extortion, attempted murder, and fraud. Police officials stated that further legal proceedings are being initiated against the arrested accused. The police stated that strict action against criminals will continue to maintain law and order in the area.

CM Yogi meets citizens at Janta Darshan, assures swift redressal of grievances

Despite his packed schedule, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath held the Janta Darshan. Committed to the welfare of all sections of society, he regularly reaches out to the public through this platform, listens to their concerns and ensures timely resolution. On Monday, he met each citizen who came with grievances, patiently hearing them out and instructing officials to provide effective solutions. Reassuring the attendees, he said, "Return home with peace of mind, every issue will be addressed proper-

Horticulture Minister Dinesh Pratap Singh launched the Makhana Vikas Yojana

The Makhana Vikas Yojana will be an important means of increasing the income of Uttar Pradesh farmers by connecting them with high-value crops. This scheme will prove to be a milestone in making Uttar Pradesh a better state. Following the formation of the National Makhana Board by the Government of India in 2025, the scheme has been implemented in 10 states in the first phase, including Uttar Pradesh. This was stated by Dinesh Pratap Singh, Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Horticulture, Agricultural Marketing, Agricultural Foreign Trade and Agricultural Exports, at a press



conference held at Gautampalli, Lucknow on Monday. On this occasion, he announced the launch of the Makhana Vikas Yojana in the state. The implementation of this scheme in the state will be undertaken by the Horticulture Department Uttar Pradesh. The Horticulture Minister informed that the action plan prepared by the Horticulture Department for the financial year 2025-26 has been approved by the Government of India. Despite limited time remaining in the financial year, the

Central Government has approved a sum of 158 lakh for implementation. This funding will be used to select and construct ponds for makhana cultivation, train farmers, conduct front-line demonstrations, buyer-seller meets, promotion through makhana pavilions, participation of exporters in international exhibitions, and conduct district and state-level seminars. Work will also begin toward establishing a "Center of Excellence for Makhana." Minister Singh stated that makhana is popular as a superfood due to its medicinal properties and high market value. Until now, it was cultivated primarily in Bihar, but the climate and waterlogged areas of Uttar Pradesh are particularly conducive to makhana.

Strict vigil on illegal mining: 5000 vehicles inspected, over 1.5 crore in fines imposed

Reviewing the special enforcement campaign conducted by the Department of Geology and Mining, Uttar Pradesh Secretary and Director Mala Srivastava issued strict and clear instructions to the interstate border districts. She stated that transportation of minerals from other states should be ensured only through an ISTP. She directed the concerned departmental officials to ensure that overloading is prohibited under any circumstances. Loading standards must be fully complied with at the source point. To prevent illegal transportation and overloading, checkgates equipped with IOT-based PTZ and ANPR cameras must be kept operational 24/7. She instructed the concerned officials that strict, consistent and effective enforcement,

in accordance with the government mandate, is the department top priority. It was reported that, as part of a special campaign launched by the Geology and Mining Department to completely control illegal mining, illegal transportation and overloading in the state, over 5,000 vehicles transporting minerals were inspected over the past three days. Most vehicles were found without the required transportation documents. Strict action was taken against approximately 400 vehicles found to be involved in illegal transportation/ over-

loading, resulting in fines totaling over ₹1.5 crore. Seven FIR were also registered during the campaign. Fines were imposed as per the rules on 54 vehicles in Sonbhadra, 23 in Mirzapur, 32 in Jalaun, 21 in Ballia, 15 in Gorakhpur and 255 vehicles in the remaining districts, totaling approximately 400 vehicles. For the successful conduct of this campaign, Special Secretary/Additional Director Arun Kumar directed all teams to ensure consistent and strict enforcement of illegal mining and transportation, with no laxity at any level.

In a major crackdown on a counterfeit currency racket, a joint team of Kotwali Police, SOG and Surveillance Unit arrested six members of a cheating gang involved in circulation of fake notes on Monday. The arrests were made during a suspicious vehicle checking drive near the Devkali outpost following a tip-off from an informer. Police stopped a Hyundai Creta car without a registration number, fitted with a red-blue beacon and a fake judge emblem. Upon checking the vehicle, all six accused were taken into custody.

Superintendent of Police Abhishek Bharti, while addressing the media at the Kotwali premises, identified the arrested accused as Manish Pachauri, Munesh Chandra, Rahul Sharma, Dilip, Akash Vichpuriya and Indrajeet Yadav. The police recovered counterfeit currency worth 2.20 lakh, several mobile phones, two bags containing "children bank" notes worth approximately 75 lakh and 5.07 lakh in genuine Indian currency from their possession.

Additionally, a fake judge



insignia, red-blue beacon and a journalism-related microphone ID were also seized from the vehicle.

During interrogation, the accused confessed that they used social media platforms, especially Instagram, to trap people by offering 4 lakh in fake currency in exchange for 1 lakh in real money. Most of the seized counterfeit notes were of 500 denomination. The accused further revealed that they prepared bundles by placing one genuine note on the top and bottom while stuffing children bank notes in between. By creating urgency, they would collect the genuine cash and flee.

To avoid arrest,

they used a vehicle displaying a judge logo, red-blue beacon and sometimes even impersonated journalists using a fake microphone ID. SP Abhishek Bharti appreciated the police team for their effective action. The arresting team included Kotwali In-charge Inspector Rajkumar Singh, SWAT Team In-charge Prashant Singh, Surveillance In-charge Samit Chaudhary, Sub-Inspector Jitendra Tiwari and SI Zakir Hussain who played a commendable role in the successful operation.

Further investigation is underway to identify other members linked to the gang and trace their wider network.

Bail granted to female constable accused of bribery

The Allahabad High Court has granted bail to a female constable accused of bribery. Justice Sameer Jain issued the order on Archana Rai's bail application. The constable is accused of accepting a bribe to remove the name of an accused in a dowry harassment case from the investigation. On October 17th, the Anti-Corruption Team caught Inspector Sumitra Devi and Constable Archana Rai, posted as the Kotwali Police Station in Varanasi, accepting a bribe of ₹10,000 from complainant Meraj of Bhadohi. The complainant alleged that the two had demanded money to remove the names from the dowry harassment case during the investigation. On the complaint, the Anti-Corruption Team arrested both of them and filed a corruption case against them. The accused, Constable Archana Rai, who is currently in jail, had filed a bail application in the High Court. The petitioner's lawyer stated that the allegation of demanding a bribe primarily lies with Inspector Sumitra Devi, and Archana Rai, as a subordinate, merely followed the instructions of her superior. The lawyer stated that the allegations against the petitioner are false and she has been sent to jail as a co-accused.

During the meeting the minister conducted a detailed evaluation of various government schemes implemented under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY), fish production enhancement and advanced animal health services in Kamrup district. He instructed all departmental staff to execute these schemes in an organized manner with transparency and within the stipulated timelines. Minister Paul also urged for stronger coordination at the grassroots level between the Fisheries and Veterinary departments. He announced plans to develop cow reserves (Goo Reserves) across the state soon, focusing on establishing them with adequate production capacity. Highlighting Kamrup potential in fish production, the minister called on the Fisheries department to take special initiatives to develop Kamrup as an export-oriented district. To realize this goal, he emphasized the need to enhance production of improved fish species, modern training systems and expanded marketing networks. At the conclusion of the meeting, Minister Paul expressed satisfaction with the progress of government schemes in Kamrup and praised the efforts of the district administration and departmental officials. He encouraged continued collaborative work to further economic and social development and build a self-reliant Kamrup.

Anti-Corruption Team Attacked While Arresting Bribe-Taking Officer

Anti-Corruption Team Officers were attacked in Prayagraj. The team caught a clerk from the Prayagraj Development Authority red-handed accepting a bribe of 78,000 on Tuesday afternoon at around 3 p.m. The officers were trying to take the accused clerk away, but the clerk created a ruckus and started shouting. Hearing the noise, several of the accused's fellow employees also arrived and scuffled to free the bribe-taking clerk. When the team resisted, the employees kicked and punched them. Despite the employees' protests, the team apprehended the accused clerk. Police are now investigating CCTV footage installed at the Prayagraj Development Authority to identify those who attacked the team. It's worth noting that Pranesh Pandey of Shantipuram was allotted land through a lottery from the Prayagraj Development Authority five years ago. He lost his job during the lockdown, and therefore faced difficulty in raising the money for the registration. After the allotment, the accountant and clerk kept the file pending for two months. Later, he went to the Prayagraj Development Authority office to register the land.



There, he met Junior Assistant Ajay Kumar. Pranesh Pandey explained that Junior Assistant Ajay Kumar demanded 10,000 rupees to move the process forward. Frustrated, he contacted the Anti-Corruption Organization through the number printed in the newspaper and filed a complaint. Upon receiving the complaint, the Anti-Corruption Unit conducted a preliminary investigation. Upon finding the complaint to be true, a plan was developed to catch the accused clerk red-handed. A trap team was deployed. On Tuesday afternoon, Pranesh Pandey went to the Prayagraj Development Authority to pay the bribe. He discussed his work with Junior Assistant Ajay Kumar. Ajay Kumar demanded a bribe.

The complainant asked him to pay only 8,000 rupees upfront and promised to pay the remaining amount after the work was done. The clerk agreed and took the complainant to the anti-corruption team.

the 8,000 rupees. Meanwhile, the Anti-Corruption Team, present nearby, caught the accused red-handed. PDA clerk surrounded and beaten by employees while being taken away. They surrounded the team and tried to free the bribe-taking clerk. During this, the anti-corruption team was also assaulted. Nevertheless, the anti-corruption team apprehended the accused and took him to the Civil Lines police station. Officers there have initiated legal action against him. The facts related to the entire bribe-taking incident are being recorded at the police station. Officers from the Anti-Corruption Prayagraj unit stated that legal action is being taken against the accused and preparations are underway to send him to jail under the necessary sections. CCTV footage being scanned to identify the attackers. The Civil Lines police station is scanning CCTV footage installed at the Prayagraj Development Authority located at Indira Bhawan to determine who attacked the anti-corruption team.

In a review meeting held under the Special Intensive Revision Campaign (RAKF) in Yamunapar district, Uttar Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Brijesh Pathak said that in a democratic system, it is absolutely essential for every eligible citizen to be included in the voter list. 

Ensure the withdrawal of stored potatoes, strict instructions to cold storage owners

Gazipur. The District Horticulture Officer, Ghazipur, stated that the withdrawal of potatoes stored in private cold storages in Uttar Pradesh is nearly complete, but some cold storages in the district still have stored potatoes. Currently, the potato storage period in private cold storages in the district is scheduled from February 15th to November 30th, so that farmers have ample opportunity to withdraw their stored potatoes from the cold storages. The Uttar Pradesh Cold Regulation Act, 1976 provides that if the renter/farmer does not lift the goods stored in the cold storage within a period of fifteen days from the date specified in the receipt, the licensee/cold storage owner shall immediately issue a notice to the renter/farmer, requiring him (renter/farmer) to surrender the duly dis-



charged receipt and lift the goods immediately after paying all the charges payable to the licensee/cold storage owner, and shall send a copy of such notice to the licensing officer/district magistrate of such sale at least forty-eight hours before the sale, and the licensing officer/district magistrate shall supervise such sale either himself or through an officer authorized by him in that behalf. The compliance of the above mentioned provisions laid down in the Uttar Pradesh Cold Regulation Act 1976 should be ensured by the concerned.


France offers a welcome breather for India

PTI Between them, US President Joe Biden and rival Republican Party's Nikki Haley seem bent on pushing India closer to France for a balanced relationship in the western world that has all the ingredients of strategic stability, both in the bilateral and multilateral contexts. That is if one were to leave out India's Russia relations, which many believed were rocky but became sort of rock steady all over again owing to the Ukraine War, where the long American arm was seen all over the place.

Yes, Nikki Haley, 51, is not even Biden's likely rival in the US presidential polls in November. She did not mean to question, challenge or rebuke India, either. Instead, by claiming that India was moving closer to Russia than the US, implying that the Biden presidency did not inspire confidence not only in New Delhi, but also in Tokyo and Seoul, Canberra and Wellington, Haley was only targeting the incumbent back home. But her choice of India, and not any of America's NATO allies, for example and her choice of words, gave the impression that she was trying to convince a certain section of Republican voters that she was all American, and not Indian. It has to be front-runner and former president Donald Trump. Haley is trailing the Republican primaries and polled lower than their kind of NOTA in Nevada, but that does not make sure that Trump's name will be on the ballot. Indications are that at some point, either the Republican Party bosses or American courts could make it embarrassing for Trump's name to be on the ballot. Haley seems hoping for that day and is persisting in the primaries precisely for this reason. Maybe, like a typical Indian-origin woman that she is, Haley is hoping for 'sympathy votes' or 'survivor's votes', first in the primaries and later in the presidential poll. Of course, there is a long way to go this time than any time in the past.

Disappointment for India

Biden kept India waiting and eventually turned down the invitation to be the chief guest at the annual Republic Day celebrations. Information about India's invitation having spread after a time (generally it is kept secret until accepted – which again used to be a formality), Biden's avoidably-delayed rejection was a disappointment for India. It is not known how the Indian-American supporters of Biden and the Democratic Party feel about it. Not-so-official news sources claimed that Biden's decision owed to the election year commitments on campaigns and other essentials. In his place, another Democratic president, Barack Obama, took a short break from his so-called pressing engagements back home to be present in Mumbai first and Delhi next, where he was the chief guest at the 2015 Republic Day. Of course, in true American form and style, it was not a visit confined to honouring contemporary India's tryst with destiny. Obama did hard-selling business in an election year and took back orders for Boeing, which he said would ensure 20,000 Americans did not lose their jobs. Biden was constrained by domestic perceptions, both inside the Democratic Party and outside. Maybe, Team Modi too thought that having Biden would be a high-profile commencement to the ruling BJP-NDA's campaign for the Lok Sabha polls in the summer. To an extent, it compares with the 'Namaste Trump' show that India put out for the US President of the time, in February 2020 amid the farmers' rally in New Delhi. The Ahmedabad rally in particular was only a mirror-image of the Trump show for the Indian prime minister, 'Howdy Modi' in Houston months earlier in Houston, Texas.



Haldwani to Bareilly, seven decades of pseudo secularism has come home to roost

Haldwani, a small but bustling town in Uttarakhand, is the gateway to the Himalayas and ascent to tourist spots like Nainital and Bhimtal. Today, it is a far more dramatic dot on Bharat's map. On February 9, the town with an 18.55 percent Muslim population erupted with violence which left two dead and 250 injured. Islamist mobs attacked a demolition squad with accompanying cops and mediapersons when it went to demolish an illegally built mosque and madrasa. The mob hurled petrol bombs and stones, nearly set policemen on fire, and used women and chil-

dren as human shields.

Uniform Civil Code Bill tabled in Uttarakhand Assembly: How was the draft prepared?

Drone shots later revealed that the violence was unprovoked and planned. Images showed heaps of stones stored on rooftops. The very next day, 100 km away in Uttar Pradesh's Bareilly, another Islamist mob attacked the police with stones after Muslim cleric Tauqeer Raza was detained for giving a 'jail bharo' over the Gyanvapi mosque issue. Raza did not forget to mention the Haldwani mosque demolition as ghee on fire. Earlier in the week, a mob


surrounded a police station in Madhya Pradesh's Damoh after a dispute between a tailor, his customer, and a cleric who intervened. A man in the crowd, Akram Khan, took a loudspeaker and threatened violence.

The Left-Islamist ecosystem has been shaken by the Pran Prathista at the Ayodhya Ram Mandir. The legal challenge to the Gyanvapi mosque in Varanasi, built after demolishing a part of Kashi Viswanath temple, has created further flutter. The mood of the nation after the Ram temple opening and a fast-crumbling Opposition alliance

point to another election victory for Narendra Modi.

One takes to the streets, of course, and with wanton violence, tries to overturn court orders or people's verdict. For seven decades since Independence, a perverted secularism actively supported by political parties have signalled to Muslims that they should never peacefully coexist with the majority, must always be in victimhood mode, and heed the law of the land only if it suits them. The community has been told that its power lies in existing as an impoverished and irascible mass.

Narasimha Rao was a Batman of Indian politics, Bharat urgently needed to acknowledge



the same question. Many were quick to reply this time: The government that year had "introduced new economic policies that opened up the Indian economy", Baru was told. And who was responsible for this? "Manmohan Singh," pat came the reply! Some even credited P Chidambaram and Kamal Nath! Later, in an interaction with this author, Baru expressed his surprise at the height of Indian ignorance: "No one mentioned PV Narasimha Rao. Ironically, this incident took place in Hyderabad, which was Rao's own city."

When I asked Baru why Rao had been forgotten, he cited two reasons. "One, he faced several corruption cases, especially towards the fag end of his rule. But most importantly, the Congress decided to erase the memory of Narasimha Rao, to make the point that no person from outside the family can ever be a successful PM. After all, what did Rao prove? He

proved that someone doesn't need to be related to the Nehru-Gandhi family to be a successful prime minister. By becoming the first PM outside the family to run the country for a full term, he effectively challenged this notion." It's ironic to see the Congress disowning one of its own prime ministers, especially the one "whose impact on the nation's fortune went way beyond the economy", as Baru wrote in 1991. But then it was an obvious outcome for a non-Gandhi leader in the Congress. It had happened in the past with Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and it took place after Narasimha Rao, as was the case with Pranab Mukherjee. Anyone seen to be eclipsing the halo of the Gandhi-Nehru family was systematically targeted to be pushed to the footnotes of the party's – and by extension, the nation's – history. This explains Sonia Gandhi's hostility for Rao, to the extent that the former Prime Minister was denied a well-

deserved memorial in Delhi, even when lesser worthies could find space in the national capital. Author Vinay Sitapati, in *Half Lion: How PV Narasimha Rao Transformed India*, gives a graphic detail on how the late Prime Minister was denied a rightful place and space in Delhi after his death. "The home minister, Shivraj Patil, suggested to Rao's youngest son, Prabhakara, that 'the body should be cremated in Hyderabad'. But the family preferred Delhi. After all, Rao had last been chief minister of Andhra Pradesh more than thirty years ago, and had since worked as Congress general secretary, Union minister, and finally prime minister – all in Delhi. On hearing this, the usually decorous Shivraj Patil snapped, 'No one will come,'" Sitapati writes. Thereafter, Ghulam Nabi Azad and YS Rajasekhara Reddy reached out to Rao's family – Reddy, being the chief minister of Andhra Pradesh, promised a grand memorial for Rao in Hyderabad! Later in the day, prime minister Manmohan Singh entered the room and asked Prabhakara: "What do you want to do with the body?" To this, Rao's son replied, "These people say it should be in Hyderabad... This (Delhi) is his karmabhoomi. You should convince your Cabinet colleagues." Manmohan nodded. Sonia Gandhi was standing near, but

mostly kept quiet. When Sanjaya Baru arrived, Ahmed Patel sought his intervention. Baru's bureaucrat father knew Rao from the 1960s – and he was close to the family. "Sonia's political secretary tapped him on the shoulder. 'You know the family,' Patel said. 'The body should be taken to Hyderabad. Can you convince them?'" Sitapati quotes Prabhakara as saying, "We sensed even then that Sonia-ji did not want Father's funeral in Delhi. She did not want a memorial (in Delhi)... She did not want him (to be seen) as an all-India leader." The next morning, when Rao's body, draped in the national flag, was being taken to the airport, it was planned to stop at 24 Akbar Road, the Congress headquarters. "As the body approached 24 Akbar Road, located adjacent to Sonia Gandhi's residence, the funeral procession slowed. The entrance gate to the compound looked firmly shut. There were several senior Congressmen present, but hardly any cadres had been rustled up. No slogans filled the air, just deathly silence. The carriage stopped on the pavement outside, as Sonia Gandhi and others came out to pay their respects." "It was customary for the bodies of past Congress presidents to be taken inside the party headquarters so that ordinary workers could pay their respects.

Why India's \$100 bn proposed trade deal with Europe is different

In the pursuit of economic growth, the Maldives seems to have missed a crucial lesson: relying solely on a handful of major players isn't a sustainable strategy. The key to sustainable growth lies in opening up to broader economic participation.

India is a case in point
India stands on the brink of sealing a significant trade deal that could have far-reaching implications. Negotiations with Europe are nearing completion, with the potential for India to attract a staggering \$100 billion in investment. This proposed agreement with Europe is noteworthy for several reasons. Unlike conventional trade deals focused on tariff reduction, India is poised to open up its markets in exchange for substantial

investment, a move that could inject significant capital into its economy over the next 15 years. The pact, unlike typical free trade agreements, comes with binding investment guarantees, a rare feature that could set a precedent for future trade negotiations. The investment is slated to originate from a special bloc of European nations known as the European Free Trade Association (EFTA), comprising Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Switzerland. While negotiations involve this bloc rather than the entire European Union, the agreement could serve as a model for broader regional trade engagements.

The potential investments are earmarked for both new and existing manufacturing projects,

promising to create over a million jobs and bolster India's industrial landscape. Beyond the economic windfall, the deal offers additional perks for India, including enhanced visa provisions for Indian professionals seeking access to the EFTA countries. In return, the EFTA nations seek expanded market access for their goods in India, spanning processed foods, beverages, electrical machinery, engineering products, pharmaceuticals and medical devices. While the deal holds immense promise, its fruition has been a long time coming, with negotiations spanning back to 2008. However, recent reports indicate that key issues have been resolved, paving the way for a potential agreement, pending finalization.

Anchored in Shivaji's spirit, India's naval operations get a desi touch in international waters

By carrying out back-to-back rescue operations in the past month, the Indian Navy has emerged as the bright spot in the otherwise unstable waters of the Red Sea. The Israel-Hamas war has not only thrown the Middle East into a flux but its effects are now also spilling over to South Asia and the wider expanse of the Indian Ocean Region.

The worsening security concerns in the Red Sea due to constant attacks from the Yemen-based Houthis on cargo ships have further been exacerbated with Somali pirates also targeting the ships passing through this region. As the security situation in the Red Sea and also in the Arabian Sea has deteriorated, the Indian Navy has now emerged as the net security provider in the Indian Ocean Region. Indian Navy has always been exemplary in its duty and in particular, has always been proactive in benign causes like Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR) operations. However, with the spill-over effects of the war in the Middle East threatening the security of the Indian Ocean Region, India is asserting its position as the resident power and as the primary stakeholder in the security architecture of the region. India's rescue



operations and in particular the role of the Indian Navy not only correspond to the existing global order. The current security concerns may have pronounced the role of the Indian Navy. But there is also a strong civilisational undertone to India's naval operations. This undertone could be considered from decolonisation and indigenisation perspectives. The decolonisation narrative has been a major issue in the Indian political discourse for a long time. However, in the past few months, there has been a tangible and accelerated effort towards decolonisation and indigenisation across different spheres. Some important steps in this direction include the use of the name Bharat instead of India. This was the highlight when India hosted the G20 Summit in September 2023 as the placard in front of Prime Minister Narendra Modi displayed the name Bharat. Besides, three criminal justice laws, the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, the Bharatiya Suraksha Sanhita and the Bharatiya Sakhyam Act, recently passed by the Indian parliament also seek to replace the colonial-era Indian Penal Code, the Code of Criminal Procedure and the Indian Evidence Act. The recent consecration of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya is projected as one of the most prominent steps towards decolonisation. Also, the scope of the decolonisation narrative has now expanded. For decades, only the 200-year British rule in India was earmarked as the colonial period in the collective memory of the Indian people. Now the 200-year period is being replaced by a period of about 1,000 years which includes the Islamic invasions in India. This indigenisation process which is becoming visible in the political, legal and cultural domains is gradually gaining emphasis in the security domain as well. Just as the decolonisation debate had been restricted to British rule, the same principle was evident in Indian strategic thought as well for a long time. As one of the relics of British rule, the continental mindset had remained a norm in Indian strategic thought for a long time.

CODEINE | Hidden trail of illegal syrup uncovered

SIT formed to probe illegal cough syrup trade

LUCKNOW

The Uttar Pradesh government has set up a Special Investigation Team to probe the illegal storage and sale of codeine-based cough syrup and other misused pharmaceutical drugs across five districts. The decision follows large-scale seizures and expanding evidence of organised trafficking. Principal Secretary (Home) Sanjay Prasad said the case is being treated with "serious priority" with an IG-rank officer appointed to lead the SIT. Officials from the Food and Drug Safety Authority (FDFA) will also be part of the team.

DGP Rajeev Krishna said the probe has uncovered the operations of major "super stockists" allegedly involved in illegal movement of the syrup. Five key individuals have been identified, including Bhola

Jaiswal from Varanasi, Vibhor Rana from Saharanpur, and Saurabh Tyagi from Ghaziabad, all of whom have been arrested. Two more stockists remain under investigation. So far, around 3.5 lakh bottles valued at approximately ₹4.5 crore have been seized, and 32 people arrested.

SIR deadline may get extended

LUCKNOW

The final date for completing the Special Summary Revision (SIR) process in Uttar Pradesh may be extended once again as a significant portion of voter data remains unmapped. Although the state administration has accelerated SIR activities, the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) confirmed through an official post that approximately 30 percent of voters are yet to be mapped. In addition, around 17.7 percent of enumeration forms are still uncollected.

The current deadline for the SIR process is 11 December, but sources indicate that the date may be extended by another 5 to 7 days. Political parties, however, have requested a longer extension of up to 15 days during their recent meeting with the Election Commission of India (ECI).

The CEO stated that 97.3 percent of digitisation work during the enumeration phase has been completed. However, the pending voter mapping and uncollected forms remain major hurdles. During Monday's meeting, the ECI

asked political parties to assist in verifying voters listed as deceased, shifted, or unavailable.

Representatives from the BJP, Congress, SP, BSP, CPI(M), AAP and Apna Dal (S) attended the meeting and supported extending the timeline to ensure accuracy in voter rolls.

The CEO also highlighted the issue of long-term overseas Indian citizens from Uttar Pradesh. These individuals, who retain Indian citizenship while residing abroad for work, study or business, can register as voters by filling Form 6A instead of the standard enumeration form. The form is available online on the Election Commission's portal.

SC warns HC against chilling
remarks in sexual assault cases

The Supreme Court has strongly criticized the Allahabad High Court for remarks in a controversial verdict suggesting that "grabbing private parts or tearing a pajama string does not constitute attempted rape." A bench led by Chief Justice D.Y. Sunakant stated on Monday that the High Court order would be set aside and the trial would continue.

The CJI highlighted that such language can have a chilling effect on victims, potentially pressuring them to withdraw complaints. He emphasized that courts, especially High Courts, must avoid insensitive commentary during hearings or while writing judgments. The bench noted that

detailed guidelines may be issued to prevent recurrence.

The case involves three accused—Pawan, Akash, and Ashok—who allegedly assaulted a 14-year-old girl in Kasganj in November 2021.

The Allahabad High Court had previously downgraded charges of "attempt to rape" against two accused and

ordered the trial under lesser sexual assault provisions. This prompted widespread criticism from legal experts and public opinion.

The Supreme Court, taking suo motu cognizance, had stayed the High Court's order in March 2022. Notices were issued to the Central Government, Uttar Pradesh Government, and other parties for responses. Senior advocates cited similar insensitive remarks in other High Court judgments, prompting the Supreme Court to consider issuing standardized directions for courts handling sexual assault cases.

The trial is set to continue under the original charges, ensuring the legal process addresses the severity of the alleged crime while upholding victims' rights.

The scope of the campaign has narrowed substantially; originally covering 782 blocks in 51 districts, the MDA will now focus only on 52 high-priority blocks across 17 identified districts, including Lucknow, Barabanki, Ayodhya, Prayagraj, and Pilibhit, among others. The next round of MDA is scheduled for February.



Accept peace offers, Trump tells Zelensky

US President Donald Trump has called on Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky to start accepting peace proposals, stressing that Russia's larger size gives it a long-term advantage and could eventually overwhelm Kiev's forces. In an interview with Politico, Trump said Zelensky has yet to review the latest US draft, despite positive feedback from his top officials. He urged Ukraine to consider elections, noting it has been too long since a vote and the people deserve a choice. Trump's initial 28-point plan, which Kiev rejected, has been revised with input from Russia and Ukraine. Moscow has welcomed the proposals but insists on Ukraine recognizing new borders and committing to neutrality, while Zelensky continues to seek a "dignified peace."

Fire in Jakarta office kills 22

Battery spark in drone storage area suspected to have triggered deadly blaze

JAKARTA

A massive fire tore through a seven-story office building in Indonesia's capital on Tuesday, killing at least 22 people, including a pregnant woman, authorities said. Thick black smoke engulfed Central Jakarta's Kemayoran neighbourhood after flames erupted

midday, triggering panic among residents and workers.

Central Jakarta police chief Susatyo Purnomo Condro said the blaze began on the first floor of the building, used as a sales and storage facility for PT Terra Drone Indonesia, before rapidly spreading upward. Many employees were out for lunch when a drone battery began sparking in a storage and testing area, according to witness accounts.

"It is suspected that a short circuit or thermal failure in the drone battery triggered an explosion and fire," a survivor named Dimitri told local television.

More than 29 fire trucks and hundreds of personnel battled

the flames for three hours before extinguishing the inferno. Rescue teams recovered 22 bodies—seven men and fifteen women—which were taken to a police hospital in East Jakarta for identification.

Television footage showed firefighters carrying out a tense rescue of more than a dozen trapped workers from the sixth floor using an extended emergency ladder. Several victims struggled to breathe as heavy smoke filled the upper floors while they waited to be evacuated one by one.

Families gathered anxiously outside hospitals and near the burnt building, seeking information about missing loved ones.

Florida Governor Ron DeSantis on Monday designated one of the largest Muslim civil rights and advocacy groups in the US a "foreign terrorist organization," following a similar step by Texas last month.

The directive against the Council on American-Islamic Relations comes in an executive order DeSantis posted on the social media site X. It also gives the same label to the Muslim Brotherhood.

Neither CAIR nor the Muslim Brotherhood is designated as a foreign terrorist organization by the US government.

Weak people leading decaying Europe: Trump

US President Donald Trump has blasted Western Europe as "decaying" and led by "weak" leaders who have mishandled migration and failed to advance peace efforts in Ukraine. In an interview with Politico, Trump said Europe's political class is constrained by political correctness and "doesn't know what to do." Cambodia vows fierce fight against Thailand, toll 10

SURIN (THAILAND)

Cambodia's Senate President Hun Sen vowed a fierce fight against Thailand as renewed clashes along their shared border forced tens of thousands of civilians to flee affected areas. The violence erupted after a Sunday skirmish that killed a Thai soldier, shattering a fragile ceasefire reached in July following deadly clashes over disputed territory.

Thai Prime Minister Anutin Charnvirakul said Cambodia had made no move toward talks and warned that military operations would continue. "We've got to do what we've got to do," he said, stressing that action was necessary to safeguard sovereignty and public safety. Hun Sen posted on Facebook and Telegram that Cambodia initially held its fire but launched counter-attacks overnight, vowing to "weaken and destroy enemy forces."

Thailand accused Cambodia of striking Thai positions

with artillery, rockets, and drones, while Cambodia maintained that Thai forces fired first.

Cambodia's military reported seven civilian deaths and 20 wounded, while Thailand confirmed three soldiers killed.

Thai airstrikes targeted military sites along the frontier and will continue "until attacks stop," raising fears of a widening conflict.

Hungary vows to defy EU migrant quotas

Hungary will not comply with new EU requirements to take in immigrants starting from next year, Prime Minister Viktor Orban has said, blasting Brussels for launching "an absurd and unjust attack" on his country.

The EU Migration Pact, which was agreed upon Monday and is expected to take effect next July, requires every member state to contribute according to its population size and GDP. The goal is to ease pressure on the most heavily affected countries, namely Cyprus, Greece, Italy, and Spain, the European Commission said.

States must either accept a set number of migrants relocated from the hotspots or pay €20,000 (\$23,000) for each person they refuse to take in.

"As long as Hungary has a national government, we will not implement this outrageous decision," Orban, a long-time critic of Brussels' migration policy, wrote on X on Tuesday.

US-India relations stalled, expert warns

The US has revoked 85,000 visas across categories this year as part of tightened public-safety measures, a senior State Department official said. Over 8,000 student visas were cancelled—more than double last year's figure. Nearly half of all revocations were linked to DUIs, assaults and theft.

In testimony to the House Foreign Affairs Committee ahead of Wednesday's hearing, Jaishankar, Executive Director of the Observer Research Foundation America, said the US-India partnership faces a "political standstill" driven largely by trade disputes and US outreach to Pakistan's military leadership. The relationship, strengthened since 1998 through economic convergence and Indo-Pacific coordination, now risks losing momentum amid China's expanding footprint and regional instability.

Jaishankar noted that tensions escalated after India's retaliatory strikes on Pakistan following an April terrorist attack, coupled with Washington's high-profile engagement with Pakistan. He also flagged stalled trade talks and high US tariffs as "acts of political hostility" threatening exporters and investors on both sides.

Despite friction, cooperation continues in defense, space, and energy, including a new 10-year Defense Framework Agreement, major military exercises, the NISAR satellite launch, and India's \$1.3-billion LNG import deal.

He stressed that resolving current disputes is critical to maintain momentum in the bilateral partnership, particularly given the strategic challenge posed by China's growing assertiveness in the Indo-Pacific.

Google is facing a new antitrust investigation by European Union regulators over how it uses online content to power its artificial intelligence models and services. The European Commission said it is examining whether Google violated competition rules by using material from web publishers and YouTube creators for AI Overviews and AI Mode without payment or opt-out options. Regulators are also looking into whether Google's use of YouTube videos for training its generative AI systems unfairly blocks rival AI developers.

Google said the complaint

"risks stifling innovation" and argued consumers should benefit from fast-moving AI technologies.

The probe is being conducted under EU's traditional competition laws, rather than newer Digital Markets Act.



FIRST T20I | Hosts beat South Africa by 101 runs after Pandya's pyrotechnics

Hardik, bowlers star for India

CUTTACK

All-rounder Hardik Pandya's rearguard heroics and top-class bowling from the pacers and spinners helped India overwhelm South Africa by 101 runs in the first T20I, here on Tuesday.

Chasing a competitive 176 for victory, the Proteas were rattled by Jasprit Bumrah, (2/17) Arshdeep Singh (2/14), Axar Patel (2/7) and Varun Chakravarthy (2/19) as they capitulated for just 74 in 12.3 overs.

Earlier, ace all-rounder Hardik Pandya marked his return to competitive cricket with a blistering half-century that helped India recover from some early blows to post a healthy 175/6.

Coming back after 74 days following a left quadriplegic injury that forced him out of the Asia Cup, Pandya walked in at No. 6 and immediately changed the tempo of the match.

India had slipped in both the power play and middle overs losing six wickets, but Pandya, who had proved his fitness at the Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy for Baroda with a 42-ball 77 not out, counter-attacked with clean, fearless hitting to finish on 59 not out off 28 balls, laced with six fours and four sixes.

It was his sixth T20I fifty.

He began with two towering sixes against Keshav

Lutho Sipamla (2/38) in the 19th over, and reached his half-century in 25 balls with a ramped six over third man off Nortje in the final over, celebrating it with a muted raise of the bat.

Pandya's late fireworks helped India add 53 runs in the last five overs, while Nortje, returning from injury, conceded 41 in four, including 12 in the final over.

On a fresh red-soil surface offering two-paced bounce, India struggled early after being sent in. Abhishek Sharma (17), Bhupinder Singh Gill (4) and Suryakumar Yadav (12) all fell inside seven overs as Lungi Ngidi (3/31) exploited the conditions superbly with clever variations.

He removed Gill early as the batter chipped to Jansen at mid-off, and later had

skipper Suryakumar holding out to Aiden Markram.

Gill and Suryakumar took most of the strike in the powerplay, as Abhishek faced only nine balls in the first six overs.

The left-hander tried to force the pace immediately after the field restrictions lifted, but fell to Sipamla, thanks to a stunning sliding catch by the 2.06m Jansen sprinting across from long leg to fine leg. His brief stay of 17 off 12 ended just as he began to find rhythm with back-to-back boundaries.

India made notable selection calls, preferring Jitesh Sharma over Sanju Samson for wicketkeeper's slot, while Hardik returned to lead the all-round options.

The Gambhir-led setup also opted for another like-for-like all-rounder in Shivam Dube.



IPL auction to feature 350 players with 240 Indians

Quinton de Kock the late addition

MUMBAI

A total of 350 cricketers, including 240 Indians, will go under the hammer in the IPL auction to take place in Abu Dhabi on December 16, with South Africa's comeback man Quinton de Kock a surprise late addition to the final list.

Wicketkeeper-batter De Kock, who recently came out of his ODI retirement, has been kept at a base price of Rs 1 crore. The list also includes Australia batter Steve Smith at a base price of Rs 2 crore. Smith last played in the IPL in 2021.

A total of 1,390 players registered for the Player Auction. The number was pruned to 1,005 players before 350 were finally shortlisted to battle for 77 slots available including 31 for overseas players, across the 10 teams for the 19th edition of the world's biggest T20 league. The first set of players in the auction includes India and Mumbai batters Prithvi Shaw and Sarfaraz Khan, who both have kept their base price at Rs 75 lakh each. Shaw had a regular run in the IPL from 2018 to 2024 but had gone unsold in the auction for the last edition, whereas Sarfaraz has not played in the competition since 2021.

The list shared by the IPL features two Australians in Cameron Green and Jake Fraser-McGurk, along with New Zealand and former Chennai Super Kings opener Devon Conway and South Africa's David Miller, with each of them keeping a base price of Rs 2 crore. Venkatesh Iyer, who was released by Kolkatta Knight Riders, has listed himself at a base price of Rs 2 crore. Among domestic players, Kunal

Chandela and Ashok Kumar, who are among the leading run-getters and wicket-takers respectively in the Syed Mushtaq Ali T20 Trophy, are also in the final list.

Three-time winners KKR will go into the auction with the biggest purse of Rs 64.3 crores, followed by five-time champions CSK with Rs 43.4 crores. Sunrisers Hyderabad, who have won the IPL once, have the third highest purse of Rs 25.5 crores.

As many as 21 England players feature in the list, including wicketkeeper-batter Jamie Smith, pacer Gus Atkinson, Liam Livingstone and Test opener Ben Duckett.

Green, expected to garner a lot of attention in this auction, leads the list of 19 Australians, with Josh Inglis, Matthew Short, Cooper Connolly and Beau Webster being the other prominent names. De Kock and Miller are among the 15 Proteas players in the IPL auction, along with fast bowlers Anrich Nortje, Lungi Ngidi, Gerald Coetze and all-rounder Wiaan Mulder.
