Bangladesh minorities' body expresses concern over safety ahead of puja

DHAKA: Amid a number of incidents of attacks, the Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian Unity Council has said there is growing concern and anxiety among devotees regarding the Sharidya Durga Puja celebrations that begin on Sunday. The organisation said that though devotees are being assured by the highest levels of the govt, including the chief adviser, army chief and home affairs adviser, about the smooth conduct of the Sharidya Durga Puja festivities, the overall situation on the eve of the festival has only fed their apprehensions and anxiety. A statement of the central committee, signed by Manindra Kumar Nath, acting general secretary of the Bangladesh Hindu Buddhist Christian Unity Council, on Friday highlighted attacks on at least nine puja mandap and temples and vandalism of idols from Sept 2 to Sept 23. Muhammad Yunus, who is now in New York, on Saturday conveyed his greetings to the Hindu community of Bangladesh. Emphasising Bangladesh's tradition of communal harmony, he said, "This country belongs to all of us. It is a safe abode for all people." He noted that the destruction of evil forces and the triumph of truth.

Wankhede sues Aryan Khan's show for defamation

NEW DELHI: IRS officer and former Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) zonal director Sameer Wankhede has filed a defamation suit in Delhi high court against the makers of the Netflix drama series 'The Ba***ds of Bollywood'. The suit filed on Thursday seeks an injunction and Rs 2 crore in damages for misleading and negative portrayal of anti-drug enforcement agencies and maligning his reputation.

The series, directed by Aryan Khan, son of actor Shah Rukh Khan, was released on Sept 18. Wankhede is known for arresting Aryan Khan in a drug case in 2021.

India and the European Union reach a trade deal

Indian and European Union leaders announced the agreement

New Delhi

After 18 years of lengthy negotiations between India and the European Union (EU), a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) was finalized on Tuesday. Indian and European Union leaders announced the agreement during the 16th India-EU Summit on Tuesday. The agreement is expected to be implemented in 2027. Following this deal, the tax on European cars such as BMW and Mercedes in India will be reduced from 110% to 10%. Additionally, taxes on liquor and wine imported from Europe to India may also be reduced. Currently, European liquor attracts a 150% tariff, which will be lowered to 20-30%.



India is the world's fourth-largest economy, while the EU is the second largest. Together, they account for approximately 25% of the global economy and about one-third of total world trade. Modi said: FTA with 27 countries on the 27th Regarding the India-European Free Trade Agreement, PM Modi said that on

January 27, India signed this FTA with 27 European countries. This will boost investment, create new innovation partnerships, and strengthen global supply chains. This is not just a trade agreement, but a roadmap for shared . The Prime Minister stated that under this agreement, India and the European Union will

jointly advance the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor. He said that at a time of global upheaval in the international order, reforms in international institutions have become very important. Following this, PM Modi addressed the India-EU Business Forum. He said that today, trade, technology, and rare minerals are being used as weapons to exert pressure, therefore India and the EU should work together to reduce their dependence. IPS officer 'suicide' case: Wife names Haryana DGP in complaint



CHANDIGARH: IAS officer Amneet P Kumar, wife of senior Haryana IPS officer Y. Puran Kumar who allegedly shot himself dead on Tuesday, lodged a complaint with Chandigarh police on Wednesday night seeking an FIR against Haryana DGP Shatrujeet Singh Kapur and Rohtak SP Narendra Bijarnia, and demanded their arrest. Amneet sought an FIR under BNS Section 108 (abetment to suicide) and provisions of the SC & ST

(Prevention of Atrocities) Act. "This is not a case of ordinary suicide but the direct result of systematic persecution of an honest officer from a Scheduled Caste community by powerful superiors," the IAS officer claimed in a complaint lodged at 8.55 pm on Wednesday. 





The GST Council voted to exempt gene therapy used to cure cancer from taxes

Delhi: The GST Council voted to exempt gene therapy used to cure cancer from taxes, and postponed a proposal for lower rates while lowering the tariff on fortified rice kernels used in PDS to 5%. The council determined that 18% GST would be applied to the margin of suppliers for all used cars, including electric vehicles. Even though there won't be any tax transactions involving private citizens, businesses or used car sellers would be subject to the fee. Pradhan defends UGC 2025 draft, calls Cong claims 'false'

Delhi: The University Grants Commission (UGC)'s proposed rules on faculty recruitment and promotions in higher education planted seeds of a new political conflict between Tamil Nadu and Kerala and the Centre. Compared to the June 30, 2010 gazette notification, the vice

appointment process appears unchanged. The states' argument that the new legislation will provide chancellors (governors) more VC selection discretion has caused controversy. Kerala called the draft regulations "an overreach by the central govt, rendering states

powerless in the higher education sector," but M K Stalin declared preparations to dispute the governor's VC appointment powers. UGC draft regulations a "direct attack on federalism and state rights" since they offer state governors substantial authority.

UGC bans 3 private universities from PhD admissions for 5 years



follow the provisions of the UGC PhD regulations and also the academic norms for the award of PhD degrees... the responses received from these universities were not found satisfactory." UGC chair M Jagadesh Kumar stressed PhD program integrity and said additional Indian universities are being reviewed. Jyoti Arora, principal of Mount Abu Public School in Rohini, northwest Delhi, claimed that based on prior trends, 20-25% of first-list candidates will not take admissions. 100 students are on the first list. We will see some rejections since parents apply to numerous institutions and occasionally wish to wait for their first choice, Arora said.

According to DoE, admission is based on points from various categories. Most schools consider distance between the student's home and school, if the candidate has siblings in the same school, and whether anyone in the

IIT Kharagpur teachers petition governors. Restore HoD positions

Delhi: The IIT Kharagpur Teachers' Association (IITTA) urged the institute's board of governors to expunge show-cause notices issued to 86 faculty members, restore their administrative positions, and protect the association's office bearers from arbitrary or retaliatory actions amid the faculty-administration dispute. In September, the IIT Kharagpur teachers' associa-

tion accused director Virendra Kumar Tewari of "nepotism" and "arbitrary faculty recruitment" in a letter to the Union Ministry of

Education, sparking a confrontation. They wanted an academically qualified, inclusive governance-experienced successor. When the administration sent show-cause notices to IITTA office bearers and disciplined them for not answering within seven days, tensions rose. Show cause notices were sent to 86 academic members who signed a petition supporting the IITTA, wors-

ening the situation. The IITTA said several of the 86 academic department heads were replaced. The administration also said people who answered or apologized would not be punished. After an unusual general body meeting the IITTA approached the board of governors. They worry the administration may act fast and deny office bearers a fair hearing.

Three months after the med portal launch, just 6.5k 12L physicians registered.

Delhi: Three and a half months after the national medical registry was began, less than 6,500 doctors have registered and 284 have been approved. The projected 12 lakh doctors working in India would take 40 years to register and approve at the current rate. Union health minister JP Nadda launched the National Medical Register (NMR) Portal of the National Medical Commission (NMC) to register all Indian MBBS doctors. "The uniqueness of NMR is that it is linked with doctors' Aadhaar IDs, which ensures authenticity," claimed the health ministry. NHA and NMC's NMR site will provide dynamic, authentic, and consolidated doctor data, it stated. The government claimed that "the speedy and easy registration process on the portal will facilitate the timely updation of the data", yet doctors have had registration issues. The Kerala State Medical Council confirmed my NMC registration. In 110 days, my application has been returned with unrelated questions four times, including questions about the University and state medical council name changes. They want me to file an affidavit about the Aadhaar card name not matching the pre-Aadhaar registration. The NMR is required by Section 31 of the NMC Act, 2019. "If they cannot put together a digital database for just 12 lakh doctors who come through a highly regulated education system, can you imagine them being able to create databases for other categories in healthcare who would be well over 50 lakh and whose training is very poorly regulated?"



Why The Taliban Foreign Minister Is Really Visiting India


The Acting Foreign Minister of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan, Amir Khan Muttaqi, will be traveling to New Delhi between October 9-16, after having received a waiver from the UNSC sanctions committee. His previous bid to secure the waiver back in September was not successful. During his visit, he is expected to meet the External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar and will arrive in New Delhi after having participated in the Moscow Format Dialogue in Russia. The impending visit has raised - and might answer - important questions about how India's relationship with the Taliban-led regime has evolved in the past four years. While there is an acknowledgement of the inevitability of engaging with the Taliban because of strategic and security considerations, concerns about what form this engagement would take and whether India can secure its interests for real, persist.

India's Reaction In 2021

When the Taliban usurped power in August 2021 and anointed themselves at the helm in Afghanistan, India's response to the developments was simultaneously knee-jerk and gradual. As the fighting intensified, India did not take much time to shut down its consulates and close its embassy. It was also quick in revoking visas and arranging the evacuation of Indian citizens from the country. But there was still a degree of dilly-dallying on how it intended to engage with the regime. A few weeks after the group's return, the Indian ambassador in Qatar met the head of the political office of the Taliban in Doha in order to seek assurances about protecting India's security and interests in the country. Subsequently, after a visit by the then Joint Secretary of the Pakistan, Afghanistan and Iran division in the Ministry of External Affairs to Kabul in June 2022, New Delhi operationalised a technical mission in the country to facilitate and monitor the delivery of aid. This ad hoc, reluctant engagement has now metastasised into a tacit acceptance of the inevitability of grappling with the reality of the Taliban.

The Dubai Meeting

At the beginning of this year, the Indian Foreign Secretary met Muttaqi in Dubai - the first high-level engagement between the two sides. The meeting saw a discussion over a broad spectrum of issues between the two countries - from humanitarian and development assistance to the importance of the Chabahar port for the purposes of trade and delivery of aid. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs under the Taliban defined India as a key 'economic and regional player' in their statement. After the terrorist attack in Pahalgam in April, a delegation led by India's Joint Secretary in the PAI division also met Muttaqi. This was followed by a telephonic conversation between the Indian External Affairs Minister and Muttaqi, where India expressed gratitude for the Taliban's condemnation of the attacks in Pahalgam. The January meeting between Misri and Muttaqi came in the backdrop of Pakistan's air-strikes in Afghanistan the previous month and New Delhi's condemnation of the same, while the April meeting and the consequent call happened in the context of the Pahalgam terror attack and India's retaliatory strikes on Pakistan under Operation Sindoos. The Taliban had condemned the attack and spoken against how it had an adverse impact on regional peace and stability. The deterioration of ties between Pakistan and Afghanistan has consequently given India more space to engage with the Taliban.



Nitish Kumar Is Still The 'X' Factor In Bihar - And NDA Knows It

With poll dates announced in Bihar, election fever has gripped the state once again. As the political landscape heats up, one question dominates conversations across teashops and television debates alike: is Nitish Kumar still the X-factor that determines electoral outcomes in Bihar? The answer, it appears, is far more complex than a simple yes or no.

A Kingmaker's Legacy

Nitish Kumar's political career presents an impressive track record that few can match. Whichever party he has allied

with has tasted victory in Bihar - the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in 2005 and 2019, the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) in 2015, and the BJP again in 2020. This remarkable streak has earned him the reputation of being Bihar's ultimate kingmaker, who has donned the hat of King for almost 20 years - a leader whose support can swing the entire electoral arithmetic in favour of his chosen partner. His political strength rests on a carefully cultivated vote bloc comprising Kurmi-Koeri communities (7%), Hindu

Extremely Backward Classes (EBCs, at 26%) Mahadalits, and Womenfolk. These constituencies have remained largely loyal to him through various political upheavals, drawn by his relatively clean image and development-focused governance.

Development Agenda

Nitish Kumar's governance model has been distinctly welfare-oriented, particularly focusing on women's empowerment and marginalised communities. His flagship schemes like Jeevika Didi, cycle distribution for school

girls, and the controversial prohibition policy have become defining features of his political legacy. He introduced 20% reservation for EBCs in local bodies and pushed women's representation in panchayats to 50% - moves that significantly expanded political participation among previously under-represented groups. In what is termed his last innings, Nitish has opened the budget purse wide, launching a slew of schemes targeting women, youth, senior citizens, farmers, and laborers.

Analysis - Bihar 2025: The Poll That Could Turn On 6,300 Votes



The latest Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of Bihar's electoral roll has concluded with a significant reduction of 51 lakh voters, amounting to a 6% drop from the rolls as of May 2025. In comparison, the previous SIR conducted between 2002 and 2003 led to a sharper 14% reduction in eligible voters. However, that exercise was spread over a longer period and occurred between two elections, not immediately before one. As a result, the revelation that more than one in ten voters were either ineligible or non-existent did not spark the kind of debate we're witnessing today. A detailed analysis of the electoral impact of both revisions offers a trove of insights into why this current exercise could significantly shape the upcoming election outcome.

Historical Benchmarks and Electoral Shifts

Working on an analysis that benchmarks all elections since the 2000 Bihar Assembly election tracks the reduction in voter numbers, turnout trends, and electoral outcomes. The first election after the 2002-03 revision was held in February 2005. The voter count had dropped

from approximately 6 crore to 5.26 crore. The result was a hung assembly, with the UPA led by Lalu Prasad Yadav struggling to retain power. By October 2005, the voter count further declined to 5.13 crore under the vigilant oversight of Election Commissioner KJ Rao. This election delivered a clear majority to the NDA, which won 143 of the 243 seats. Interestingly, as long as the absolute number of voters remained below the pre-SIR benchmark of 2000, the NDA maintained its dominance. The 2010 election was a landslide for the NDA. While many contextual factors influenced these outcomes, the correlation with voter count benchmarks is hard to ignore. However, as voter numbers began inching

back toward the 2000 levels, the NDA's grip weakened. In 2015, they lost. In 2020, they scraped through with a razor-thin margin - just 0.03% of the vote. While factors like the LJP's role and Nitish Kumar's shifting alliances were critical, one unmistakable pattern emerged: lower voter counts tend to favour BJP-led alliances. This seems to be an implicit understanding shared by both the BJP and its rivals.

Why This SIR Matters More

If the current SIR reduced voters by 6%, that is less than the 14% reduction of the previous one, why does it feel more consequential?

A microscopic look at the 2020 results reveals the answer. The NDA won the state by a margin of just

11,150 votes, narrower than the margin in many individual assembly seats. Had just 12 seats swung the other way, Bihar would have had a different Chief Minister.

In fact, only 6,292 voters across those 12 seats needed to vote differently to change the outcome. That's what makes this SIR so pivotal. Even a few hundred ineligible or non-existent voters could tip the balance in multiple constituencies. The average margin across the state was 16,832 votes, or roughly 10%. Yet the distribution of support for both the ruling party and the opposition was so evenly spread that small shifts could have led to dramatically different results.

The Jan Suraj Factor and Caste Dynamics

Adding to the complexity is the emergence of Prashant Kishor's Jan Suraj Party, which is expected to cut across caste lines and appeal to a broad voter base.

This new entrant could disrupt traditional voting patterns and further fragment the vote. A parallel can be drawn with Maharashtra's 2024 Lok Sabha election, where the NDA and the Congress-led

alliance were separated by just 0.5% in vote share. Despite the narrow margin, the NDA suffered a decisive defeat. However, the NDA's women-centric welfare schemes, especially the Ladli Bahin initiative, helped them break caste barriers and reach deeper into the electorate than ever before. This experience has likely informed the NDA's strategy in Bihar, where they hope to replicate that success and appeal beyond traditional caste lines, much like Jan Suraj aims to do.

A New Political Landscape

They are literally the backbone of the security forces, too, up in those dizzy environments. Why are 5.3cr cases pending in Indian courts? Missing lawyers & witnesses, long stays...

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court, while adjudicating a matter related to inexplicable delays in disposal of cases in trial courts last week, observed that a speedy trial, as part of the right to life, is an unimpeachable right. But what happens when counsels are not available in over 62 lakh cases, accused are absconding in more than 35 lakh cases, witnesses are missing in nearly 27 lakh cases, and over 23 lakh cases are stayed by different courts?

As of Sept 25, 5.34 crore cases are pending across all courts in the country, including 4.7 crore pending trials in district and subordinate judiciary, 63.8 lakh in high courts, and 88,251 before the SC. While reasons for delay are not available for cases pending before the Supreme Court and high courts, the National Judicial Data Grid (NJGD) has cited 15 reasons behind delays in 1.78 crore cases before lower courts, out of the 4.7 crore pending with them. Of the cases with available reasons, 81% are criminal and 19% civil. For roughly three crore cases, no reasons have been provided. The main reasons cited are "counsels not available" in over 62 lakh cases; absconding accused in over 35 lakh cases; missing witnesses in nearly 27 lakh cases; stay by various courts in over 23 lakh cases; "awaiting documents" in over 14 lakh cases; and "parties not interested" in almost 8 lakh cases. The other reasons cited by the NJGD include frequent appeals, unavailable records, miscellaneous applications blocking trials, parties seeking additional witnesses, and legal representatives of deceased parties not being on court records.





61 years in Mumbai

Javed Akhtar remembers coming to Mumbai with 27 paisa, shares his journey of struggle and hard work

Veteran lyricist and screenwriter Javed Akhtar first arrived in Mumbai on October 4, 1964, at the age of 10, with just 27 naya paisa in his pocket. On Saturday, reflecting on his 61 years in the city, he penned an emotional note expressing gratitude for how kind life has been to him.

Taking to his X (formerly Twitter) and wrote, "On 4th October 1964 a 19-year-old boy had embarked at Bombay central station with 27 naya paisa in his pocket. Went through homelessness, starvation, unemployment but when I look at the grand total I feel life has been too kind to me."

Born in 1945 in Gwalior, he added, "For that I can not but help but thank Mumbai, Maharashtra, my country and all those who looked at work kindly. Thank you, thank you so much."

Talking about his journey, Javed told Hindustan Times in 2006 that he slept wherever he could, sometimes on a verandah, sometimes in a corridor, and sometimes under a tree, alongside several other homeless, jobless people like him. "At last, in November 1969, I got some work which in film parlance is called a break," he added.



From playing Dhritarashtra in *Mahabharat* to leading a cybercrime thriller, Thakur Anoop Singh shares his story of grit, growth, and discipline




'Discipline is key to success'

In an exclusive interview with **FPJ**, actor Thakur Anoop Singh opened up about his upcoming film *Controll*, a cybercrime thriller based on true events surrounding digital frauds. Best known for his roles in *Romeo S3*, *Dharmarakshak Mahaveer Chhatrapati Sambhaji Maharaj*, *Mahabharat* (as Dhritarashtra), and popular South films including *Yajmama*, *Rogue*, and *Naa Peru Surya*. Naa Illu India, Singh is now stepping into the lead role of Abhimanyu in *Controll*. Directed by Saffar Abbas, the film is set to release on October 10. In this candid conversation, Singh discussed his first reaction to the script, his preparations, the discipline that drives him, and his vision for the future.

Excerpts:

Q. The film *Controll* is based on true events surrounding digital frauds and cybercrime. What was your first reaction when you heard...



the script?

A. My first reaction was the relatability factor that the script carries. I've personally seen friends experience similar scams, and that made it feel very real to me. I thought, if this could happen to people I know, imagine how many others must have gone through it. The script felt both informative and impactful. I found the story challenging because it allowed me to portray a victim's perspective and show what happens to a victim's family when they're scammed. That's what made it such an interesting subject for me.

Q. The film deals with such a relevant issue. Did you research or meet any real-life victims of cyber fraud?

A. As I mentioned earlier, I already knew people who had gone through

such scams, so I observed them closely. I studied how hackers create fake OTPs or links, and how they manipulate victims into panicking and making mistakes. My friend's mother, who's in her 60s, was once scammed. I often say that our parents belong to the last innocent generation, and this incident really hit home. I saw firsthand how they struggled to recover the money which they never could and how the scammer, despite their pleading, stayed cold and unapologetic. It showed me the mindset of such criminals. I tried to bring that anger and helplessness into my performance as Abhimanyu in *Controll*.

Q. How was your experience working with Saffar Abbas, the director of the film?

A. It was a great experience. Saffar Abbas has previously worked as an associate director with Abbas-Mustan, so he came with a lot of experience. *Controll* was his first film as an independent director, and it was my second film as a protagonist. We bonded well even before the shoot—we did a lot of workshops together. His clarity and experience reflected on set, and overall, it was a very positive and collaborative experience.

Q. Many people first noticed you in *Mahabharat*. Do you feel that role shaped your career in a significant way?

A. Absolutely. Playing Dhritarashtra in *Mahabharat* gave me tremendous confidence and experience. It wasn't directly responsible for my move into films, but it definitely motivated me to take that step. Working on such a massive production helped me understand the craft better and prepared me for larger roles. That experience gave me the self-belief to approach filmmakers and tell them I was ready for films. So yes, it played an important role in shaping my journey.

Q. What advice would you give to young people who want to maintain discipline in their career and health?

A. Discipline has brought me where I am today. It's all about managing your time, diet, and routine. You can't live carelessly thinking you can fix things later. The body adapts quickly to whatever lifestyle you choose, so you must stay consistent. My advice to youngsters is: if you have a vision, stay disciplined in every aspect of life. That's the only way to achieve your goals and sustain success.

VHP to govt over AIMPLB's stir against waqf law

NEW DELHI: Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP) urged on Saturday Centre and state govt to stay alert against possible violence during nationwide protests announced by All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB) and other Muslim bodies against Waqf Amendment Act.

VHP said it was "strange" that while challenging the law in court, the organisations were simultaneously launching street agitations instead of waiting for Supreme Court's verdict. VHP president Alok Kumar cited recent incidents of violence during Milad-un-Nabi processions to caution that fresh mobilisations could "disrupt law and order, invite



conflicts and promote violence." He called upon society, particularly Hindus, to remain "vigilant and prepared" in coordination with local authorities. According to Kumar, AIMPLB's four-page "road map" for the second phase of its 'Save Waqf Campaign' calls for a nationwide bandh on Oct 3, when Muslims

have been asked to shut shops and offices between 8am and 2pm, barring medical establishments. The plan also includes marches towards Rashtrapati Bhavan in Delhi, Raj Bhavans in state capitals, and mass courting of arrests. "This is being promoted as Bharat Bandh on social media," Kumar said. VHP also appealed to SC.

Pradhan Mantri Kalyan Yojana relies on NCERT

Delhi: Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan voiced his faith in NCERT's ability to push educational reforms and bring about a paradigm change in teaching and learning, despite the fact that the council has been criticized for its textbook updates. In his support of NCERT's initiatives to implement the reforms proposed in NE, Pradhan compared it to a "Gyan Kumbh" that has had a profound impact on the lives of many Indians. 

Rolling out the first



such structured mentorship and collaborative action programme, involving 72

mentor cities and 200 mentee cities, housing and urban affairs minister Manohar Lal Khattar said the aim is to ensure that "every city benefits from the collective knowledge pool of Swachh Bharat Mission". The

minister said, "Swachh Shehar Jodi is not just a ceremonial partnership. It is one of the largest structured, time-bound and outcome-driven mentorship arrangements in urban waste management sector."

Assess UV technology in sewage treatment, NGT directs IIT Delhi

Delhi: National Green Tribunal (NGT) asked IIT Delhi to examine the effectiveness of UV technology in sewage treatment and directed the DPCC to take punitive action against 14 STPs, which, as per a report, failed to meet the standards.

A tribunal

bench, headed by NGT chairperson Justice Prakash Srivastava, in an order took notice of a report by Delhi Jal Board (DJB).

The report stated that of 37 STPs in the city, seven were yet to be installed with a disinfection system, four had not installed any sys-

tem, while among others, 15 had deployed UV and 11 had chlorination-based disinfection systems to treat bacteria in sewage before discharging the treated water into drains. For those yet to be installed, the process was initiated or tenders awarded.

Delhi dominates India's top college list

Delhi : Delhi University's Hindu College has topped the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2025 list, followed by Miranda House, Hans Raj, Kirori Mal and St Stephen's, emerging as the top five colleges in the country. Delhi University (DU) also recorded its best-ever performance in the Universities category, rising to fifth position from last year's sixth. It advanced to 12th place in the Research Institutions list and retained the 15th spot overall. Vice Chancellor Yogesh Singh called the achievement "a landmark moment", crediting the collective efforts of faculty, students, alumni and staff. Hindu College Principal Anju Srivastava said the recognition reflected the college's focus on holistic education. "We have created an ecosystem where students get opportunities for research, innovation and practical exposure. Under NEP reforms, they are pursuing interests beyond the classroom with flexibility and industry linkages," she told. Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) secured the second spot among universities. Vice Chancellor Santishree Dhulipudi Pandit said the ranking was a matter of great pride, highlighting JNU's model of "excellence with equity and innovation with inclusion".

CBSE and NCB to Raise Drug Abuse Awareness

Delhi : Together, the NCB and the Central Board of Secondary Education are working to eliminate drug use from schools and raise public awareness about the dangers of substance misuse. The CBSE board headquarters hosted an agreement signing event. The CBSE announced in an official statement that the two organizations have reached an agreement that will allow them to work together on various projects. These projects will include community outreach, counselling services for students and parents, e-modules on drug prevention, capacity-building workshops for teachers and counsellors, and quarterly awareness programs.


BCCI to hold AGM on Sept 28 to elect president, secretary, other office bearers

is set to take place two years from now. Former India all-rounder Ravichandran Ashwin has shared a piece of advice for both of them. The team is set to play only a few ODI matches in the lead up to the Cricket World Cup 2027, so Ashwin has advised the Rohit-

Virat duo to play India A matches as well as domestic tournaments to keep up with the training for the big event. He added that the two players need to show the selectors they are serious about playing the quadrennial tournament. "The India A series is currently

going on. You know that there are not many ODI matches before the 2027 Cricket World Cup. So Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma should be told to play the series. They should be told, 'If you don't play this series, then you don't fit in the plan. If you are not a part of this series,

you need to go and play Vijay Hazare Trophy because that is another thing we can look at the form you are in,'" said Ashwin on 'Ash Ki Baat'. "I have heard it in the past that players don't like to play at times because maybe they are not motivated enough to play India A series. It could happen. Since you want to play 2027 Cricket World Cup, show that you are serious about it. Go and play Ranji Trophy cricket and other tournaments; the selectors will also know, he is serious about playing," he added. Apart from match practice and form, age is another factor that poses a huge challenge to the two players. Rohit is already 38 years old.

Reporters Surround Naqvi Over Asia Cup Trophy Act



Asian Cricket Council (ACC) chief Mohsin Naqvi remained tight-lipped after he was queried regarding the whereabouts of the Asia Cup 2025 trophy. A huge controversy came to light last month after India beat Pakistan in the Asia Cup final in Dubai. After the match, the Suryakumar Yadav-led side refused to receive the trophy from Naqvi, who is also the Interior Minister of Pakistan. The Indian cricket team was not formally presented with the trophy as Naqvi left the stadium with the silverware and the winner's medals. Sources told last week that the Asia Cup trophy is now with the Emirates Cricket Board (ECB). It isn't yet confirmed how and when the trophy will be handed over to India. Earlier this week, Naqvi faced questions about the Asia Cup trophy controversy during

Pakistan spinner Abrar Ahmed's wedding reception in Karachi. In a video shared by TOK Sports, Naqvi evaded the questions from the media, before being eventually escorted to his car by Pakistan pacer Shaheen Afridi. Naqvi has been accused of violating the Code of Responsibilities and Ceremonial Protocols as he refused to hand over the Asia Cup trophy to the winning Indian team. This move violated established ceremonial protocols and his fundamental duties as the ACC Chief to honour the winners, leading to embarrassment. The BCCI has made it clear that they intend to escalate the issue to the ICC, with the matter set to be raised at the upcoming ICC meeting in November. As per sources, the BCCI is also pushing for his impeachment.



Saudi Arabia Win See-Saw FIFA World Cup Qualifier With Indonesia
