CBSE cracks whip over

school suicide

Following an alleged suicide of a Class IV student, the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) on Tuesday cancelled the affiliation of Neerja Modi School of Jaipur for senior secondary level (classes 9-12) with immediate effect. The CBSE said the incident exposed "grave, flagrant, and willful non-compliance" with mandatory child safety norms, concluding that the Neerja Modi School was "not fit for continuation of affiliation". A 9-year-old girl, Amyra, died by jumping from the fourth floor of the school building on Nov 1. According to the order, Amyra was a victim of continuous bullying at the school.

POLL PUSH | Union home minister meets party leaders, including disgruntled Dilip Ghosh, 'rejuvenates' workers

After setting target, Shah pep talk for Bengal BJP

KOLKATA

Union Home Minister Amit Shah's three-day visit to Kolkata concluded on Wednesday leaving every Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) worker excited.

On Wednesday, Shah met with party's machineries, from former MPs to MLAs and also disgruntled party leaders, and gave them a road-map for the upcoming 2026 Assembly elections.

According to party sources, the former MPs were asked to visit their constituencies at least four times a week.

"The party leaders will have to prove their credibility in order to get tickets to contest the upcoming polls. The Union Home Minister also asked the MP and former MPs the difficulties they have faced during the Lok Sabha elections and also discussed ways to overcome the hurdles. Shah had also instructed the partymen to make corruption and infiltration during Trinamool Congress (TMC) regime the main poll plank for the saffron camp," said party sources.

Shah also held separate meeting with disgruntled party leader Dilip Ghosh along with Leader of Opposition Suvenu Adhikari, former state president and MoS Sukanta Majumdar and present state president Samik Bhattacharya.

Speculations have started whether Ghosh will be active during the 2026 polls as Ghosh was sidelined after he met Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on the day of Jagannath temple inauguration at Digha on April 30.

Matua politics: BJP warns Abhishek

Kolkata: Once again ahead of Trinamool Congress (TMC) National secretary Abhishek Banerjee's visit to Matua's Thakurbari in Bongaon in north 24 parganas on January 9, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MP and MoS Shantanu Thakur warned that Banerjee will not be allowed to offer prayers if he comes with force. "If Abhishek Banerjee comes to Thakurbari to show his power with police force, I will not allow him to offer puja. If he does so, then thousands of Matuas will congregate and will hold 'Dhikkar Michhil' (protest rally). Matuas don't need the support of TMC. His aunt (Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee) should first apologise for pronouncing our ancestor's name wrongly," said Thakur.

While leaving the venue, Ghosh said that he was called and he gave a patient hearing.

"I can't say anything much but can say you can see Dilip Ghosh active in 2026 polls," he mentioned.

BJP leader Shishir Bajaria stated, "Shah had asked us to leave everything and to concentrate on 2026 elections so that lotus blooms in Bengal."

Notably, apart from the state leaders, the meetings were also attended by the party's central observers for Bengal like Sunil Bansal,

Shupendra Yadav, Biplob Deb and Amit Malviya.

On the other side, while Shah's convoy was on its way to Thanthania Kali temple where Shah offered prayers in North Kolkata, Congress staged a protest at College street and called Shah to be 'anti-Bengali'.

Leader of Opposition Suvenu Adhikari mentioned that everyone is 'rejuvenated' after meeting Shah.

"This time it is evident that 'Ashol Parivartan' (real change) will come to Bengal

and BJP will form the government ousting TMC," added Adhikari.

Meanwhile, taking potshots at Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee's comment against the Union Home Minister, BJP spokesperson and Puri MP Sambit Patra added, "When party's national president JP Nadda had visited Bengal, his convoy was attacked and now Mamataji is saying that if she wanted, she would have locked Home Minister of the country at the hotel he was putting up. This is shameful."

60 injured as two loco trains collide inside Chamoli tunnel

CHAMOLI

Around 60 people were injured late on Tuesday night after two loco trains collided inside the under-construction Vishnugad-Pipalkoti hydropower project of THDC in Chamoli district, officials said.

The accident occurred at 9.30pm inside the 13 km-long tunnel of the 444 MW hydropower project being built on the Alaknanda river. At the time of the mishap, more than 100 officers, employees and workers were present inside the tunnel, where construction work was underway.

Officials said tunnel excavation was being carried out using a tunnel boring machine, with several heavy machines deployed inside the tunnel to expedite the work. Two of these machines, used to

transport workers and construction material within the tunnel, collided with each other, leading to the accident. Following the collision, construction work inside the tunnel was immediately halted.

District Magistrate Gaurav Kumar and Superintendent of Police Surjeet Singh Panwar rushed to the district hospital in Gopeshwar and reviewed

the condition of the injured. Kumar said around 60 people were injured in the accident. Of these, 42 injured workers are being treated at the district hospital in Gopeshwar, while 17 injured workers are undergoing treatment at Vivekanand Hospital in Pipalkoti. The condition of all the injured has been reported to be stable.

Nimesulide oral dose above 100 mg banned

NEW DELHI

The Union Health Ministry has banned the manufacture, sale and distribution of all oral formulations containing the popular painkiller nimesulide above 100 mg, citing serious risks to health, an official notification said.

The decision was taken following a recommendation by ICMR, the apex health research body of India, it said.

"The Central government is satisfied that the use of all oral formulations containing Nimesulide above 100 mg in immediate release dosage form is likely to involve risk to human beings," the notification issued on Monday said.

It stated it is necessary and expedient in public interest to prohibit the manufacture, sale and distribution of the drug in the country.

Woman gang-raped in car, Cong slams Haryana govt

CHANDIGARH:

A woman was allegedly gang-raped in a moving van through the night and thrown out of the speeding vehicle, suffering serious head and facial injuries, on a desolate road by two men who have since been arrested, police said on Wednesday.

The assault of the mother of three, which brings back the horror of the Nirbhaya rape on another cold December night 13 years ago, took place in the early hours of Tuesday on the winding, little populated Gurgaon-Faridabad, officials said.

Faridabad police produced the two accused, one from Uttar Pradesh and the other from Madhya Pradesh, in a city court on Wednesday and said that the incident is a living

example of the complete collapse of law and order in the state.

The 25-year-old, who had been living at her parents' home after troubles with her husband, suffered severe injuries to head and her face,

which required more than 12 stitches. She has been admitted to a private hospital in Faridabad, adjoining the national capital.

Her condition is critical, and she is not yet fit to record a statement, a police official said.

Meanwhile, Haryana Congress president Rao Narendra Singh asked,

"When women are not safe, what claims is the government making? The failure of the police administration and the government's insensitivity have given criminals a free hand."

UP BJP in damage control after Brahmin MLA meet triggers ripples

LUCKNOW

A closed-door meeting of Brahmin legislators has caused ripples within the Uttar Pradesh unit of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), prompting the leadership to move swiftly to contain discontent and prevent the issue from escalating.

The party has deputed former state BJP president Ramnath Singh to reach out to legislators who attended the December 23 gathering in Lucknow, held during the winter session of the state legislature. The meeting, later viewed by the leadership as a sign of brewing unease, involved around 45 to 50 Brahmin MLAs from

Purvanchal and Bundelkhand, along with a few legislators from other parties. It was hosted at the residence of Kushinagar BJP MLA P N Pathak, also known as Panchanand Pathak, on the occasion of his wife's birthday.

Tripathi met Deoria MLA Shalabh Mani Tripathi and has since contacted several legislators, urging restraint and

asking them to raise grievances only through the party's formal platforms. He reportedly conveyed reservations about the manner in

which the meeting was held and advised MLAs to approach state BJP president Pankaj Chaudhary directly, assuring them that their concerns would be heard.

The same day, Chaudhary met Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and reiterated a tough stand, warning Brahmin MLAs against holding such meetings and cau-

tioning that disciplinary action would follow any repeat.

While Deputy Chief Minister Keshav Prasad Maurya and ministers Dharamveer Prajapati and Sunil Sharma said the meeting's intent should not be viewed negatively or through a caste lens, Chaudhary maintained that party discipline

would not be compromised.

The episode has given the opposition an opening, with the Congress and Samajwadi Party stepping up efforts to woo Brahmin voters. Meanwhile, sources said the Chief Minister's Office and senior BJP and RSS functionaries intervened to prevent the controversy from spiraling further.


The two leaders then visited the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi complex and

Son-in-law who murdered mother-in-law arrested: Dragged mother-in-law onto the street and shot her, pistol used in the murder recovered

Prayagraj. Police have arrested Mohammad Irfan, the son-in-law who publicly shot and killed his mother-in-law. Police from Kareli police station, along with other teams, were conducting raids in search of Irfan. On Wednesday, the police apprehended Irfan. The pistol used in the murder was also recovered from him. Irfan had been having a dispute with his in-laws after an argument with his wife, Chand Bibi. Irfan's wife had been living with her parents for several years. Irfan wanted to forcibly take her back. Chand Bibi's mother, Irfan's mother-in-law, Ashia Khatoon (55), was opposing this. On December 26, Irfan dragged his mother-in-law onto the street, shot her in the head, and fled. Irfan's wife alleges that Irfan wanted her to run a sex racket. When she opposed this, he killed her mother. Ashia Khatoon (55) lived near the Akbarpur Old Mosque with her three daugh-



ters and four sons. Ashia Khatoon's husband, Mushtaq Ahmed Mali, died several years ago. Her daughters are Rizwana, Farzana, and Chand

Bibi. Chand Bibi is the youngest. Her four sons are Naushad, Munna, Irfash, and Dilshad. Her daughter, Chand Bibi, had a love marriage

with Mohammad Irfan 15 years ago.

They have one daughter and one son. Irfan, a resident of Akbarpur,

returned from Saudi Arabia in 2019. He worked as a welder there. After returning from Saudi Arabia, he married Chand Bibi in 2020. He did not return to Saudi Arabia. He started working as a welder in Prayagraj. When Irfan and Chand Bibi had a dispute, she went to live with her mother.

Irfan was having a dispute with his wife. It was because of this dispute that Irfan came to his in-laws' house again today. A fight broke out there. After the argument, Irfan dragged his mother-in-law out of the house onto the street and shot her in the head. Panic spread in the area after the incident. The police arrived at the scene after being informed, but the accused had already fled.






It's curious even scientists discard spirit of science in daily life, become unscientific: Nehru

In the course of less than four months, we have put up, declared open, or are going to declare open, three national laboratories. I suppose before this year is out, some more national laboratories will also be started. This is a great venture testifying to the faith which our scientists and, I hope, our Government have in science. I suppose the putting up of fine and attractive buildings does some service to science; nevertheless, buildings do not make science as Dr. Raman has often reminded us. It is human beings who make science, not bricks and mortar. Properly equipped buildings, however, help the human being to work efficiently. It is, therefore, desirable to have these fine laboratories for trained persons to work in and for persons to be trained for future work. You, Sir, referred to the spirit of science. I wonder what exactly that spirit is and to what extent we agree or differ in our ideas of it. Is science, as is often supposed, a handmaiden to industry? It certainly wants to help industry, though not merely for the sake of helping industry but also because it wants to create work for the nation, so that people may have better living conditions and greater opportunities for growth. That I suppose will be agreed to but there is something more to it. What ultimately does science represent? You, Sir, just referred to scientists declaring war on nature. May I put it in a different way? We seek the co-operation of nature, we seek to uncover the secrets of nature, to understand them and to utilise them for the benefit of humanity. The active principle of science is discovery. Now, what is, if I may ask, the active principle of a social framework or society? Usually, it stands for conservatism, remaining where we are, not changing and carrying on, though, of course, with some improvement and further additions. Nevertheless, it is a principle of continuity rather than of change. So, we come up against a certain inherent conflict in society between the co-existing principles of continuity and of conservatism and the scientific principle of discovery which brings about change and challenges that continuity. So the scientific worker, although he is praised and patted on the back, is nevertheless, not wholly approved of, because he comes and upsets the status quo of things. Normally speaking, science seldom really has the facilities that it deserves except when some misfortune comes to a country in the shape of war. Then everything has to be set aside and science has its way, even though it is for an evil purpose. It is interesting to see this conflict between the normal conservatism of a static society and the normal revolutionary tendency of the scientist's discovery which often changes the basis of that society. It changes living conditions and the conditions that govern human life and human survival. I take it that most people who talk glibly of science, including our great industrialists, think of science merely as a kind of handmaiden to make their work easier. And so it is. Of course, it does make their work easier. It adds to the wealth of the nation and better conditions. All this science does. But surely science is something more than that. The history of science shows that it does not simply better the old. It sometimes upsets the old. It does not merely add new truths to the old ones but sometimes the new truth it discovers disintegrates some part of the old truths and thereby upsets the way of men's thinking and the way of their lives. Science, therefore, does not merely repeat the old in better ways or add to the old but creates something that is new to the world and to human consciousness. If we pursue this line of thought, what exactly does the spirit of science mean? It means many things. It means not only accepting the fresh truth that science may bring, not only improving the old but being prepared to upset the old if it goes against that spirit. It also means not being tied down to something that is old.

Though an uneasy ceasefire between Israel and Iran continues, just two days ago, on 24 June, the Iranian parliament threatened the closure of the Strait of Hormuz. But this was not the first time that Hormuz, situated at the narrowest point of the Persian Gulf, has turned into a flashpoint between Iran and the West. Since at least 1300 CE, Hormuz has been the hinge of Eurasian trade, where thousands of Indians, Arabs, Iranians, Mongols, and Turks made their fortunes. Goods poured through Hormuz, to and fro the Mediterranean, West and Central Asia, South and Southeast Asia, and China. But in the 16th century, the Portuguese adventurer Alfonso da Albuquerque took control of the port. The shockwave rippled through the Western Indian Ocean; the decades after saw the end of Hormuz's prominence, the development of Iran's first maritime policy, and the immigration of tens of thousands of Indian traders and investors into the Gulf and Iran. This is the story of how Hormuz shaped the history of India and the world. Just as the Gulf's geography offered opportunities throughout time, it also created challenges. Its character was utterly unique, nothing like our world of monolithic nation-states. Sam Dalrymple, historian and author of *Shattered Lands: The Five Partitions of India*, described Gulf towns to me as "trading islands/oasis towns wedged between the sand sea and the salt sea. They make less sense as states and more as oases filled with traders." Their population was never

consistent: it waxed and waned with the trading seasons, which in turn depended on the monsoon. Outside these ports, weather conditions were extreme: storms, unseasonal winds, scorching heat and humidity. The Gulf's northern edge, shielded from the Iranian Plateau by a mountain range, allowed little room for coastal states to grow. In the south, the vast Arabian desert was home to small tribes that occasionally preyed on sea traffic. Hormuz rose to prominence because it was able to offer safe ground for international trade, without the risk of piracy. This wasn't what one would expect from looking at it. Barely a few kilometres across, sweltering Hormuz was encrusted in salt, with only one freshwater source. Its rulers solved this problem by importing water on barges from the shore. Markets were kept open all night to avoid the daytime

heat. In *The Persian Gulf: A Political and Economic History of Five Port Cities*, historian Willem Floor further explains that the rulers of Hormuz imposed an embargo on timber, oars, coir, iron and steel, which prevented their rivals from building ships. They then took control of nearby ports, establishing a chokehold on the Gulf. Though Hormuz's rulers were Muslim, the island made no segregations on ethnic or religious lines. The second-largest ethnic group on the island were Indians, who conducted a roaring trade in horses in the 13th century CE. In *'India's Sea Trade with Iran in Medieval Times'*, historian Shireen Moosvi discusses the Somanatha-Veraval inscription, recording the construction of a mosque in Somnath in 1264 by the Hormuz merchant Nuruddin Firoz. The Sanskrit portion of the inscription describes the

mosque as a dharmashanam, and mentions the direct involvement of Gujarat's ruling Chalukya king and his officials in the grant. If this Hormuz merchant had such influence, writes Moosvi, "Hormuz merchants must surely have formed an elite group of some importance... in the Chaulukya kingdom of Gujarat." For the next century, Hormuz continued to flourish. According to Moosvi, Hormuz's networks extended as far as Uzbekistan and Turkey. Goods shipped from Hormuz reached, in relays, all the way to China. The Chinese admiral Zheng He brought his vast armada there multiple times in the 15th century, where he exchanged ceramics and silks for the luxuries of Western Eurasia. Strategic resources such as horses were shipped to India from Hormuz; in return, India provided necessities such as rice to the Gulf ports, as well as cloth, metals, woods, and spices. In his edited volume *India and the Indian Ocean, 1500-1800*, MN Pearson notes that exchanges overwhelmingly favoured India. Vast quantities of silver and salt were required to balance the trade. In the early 1500s, the Portuguese erupted into the Indian Ocean. From their galleons—artillery platforms designed for deep-sea and coastal voyaging—they attempted to take control of trade gateways in the Indian Ocean, including Hormuz. They stationed a permanent garrison on the island in 1515, but immediately ran into problems. At the same time, the Mughal Empire of the Indian subcontinent consolidated its reach into Afghanistan. Conquering Kandahar, the Mughals stabilised overland routes from India to Central Asia, further weakening the appeal of Hormuz. According to Floor, the Ottoman Empire, which controlled Iraq, attempted to get rid of the Portuguese in 1552 but failed. It would be an Iranian power which finally expelled them and restored some normalcy to the Gulf trade.

But Hormuz would never again be independent. Up to this point, riven by internal strife, the Safavid dynasty of Iran had paid little attention to events in Hormuz—though they were technically its overlords. However, Shah Abbas I (r. 1587-1629), a contemporary of the Mughal emperor Jahangir, eventually consolidated power. He was alarmed by the loss of both Kandahar and Hormuz, crucial to Iran's trade with the steppe and the ocean.

Delhi's new fuel policy is forcing people to buy new cars. It won't reduce pollution

There is an old saying in English—'missing the woods for the trees'. It means getting so focused on the minor details that you overlook the bigger picture. And honestly, this is what I feel about the new 'fuel policy'. Starting 1 July, all end-of-life vehicles (EOL) in the national capital will be denied fuel and can also face deregistration, impounding or scrapping. Reportedly, many Delhi residents have been lining up at car showrooms, panic-buying new vehicles. A very close friend's mother called me up and asked, "Beta, should we buy a new car?" Let me tell you a bit about aunty—she's a retired government service officer and lives comfortably with her husband on a decent pension in one of those societies in Greater Noida. Other than the twice-a-week run to the shops and the occasional drive to meet friends in Delhi, their 11-year-old Hyundai i10 barely gets used. Yet because of the new fuel policy announced by Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta—where

older vehicles will not be allowed to refuel, first in Delhi and later across the entire National Capital Region (NCR)—she is genuinely wondering what to do. Now, let me make it clear that money is not a problem in this case. This retired couple can easily afford a new car. It is just that they don't see the need for one. And they shouldn't have to. You can think of thousands of cases like this of retired folks with perfectly functional and perfectly maintained vehicles that will now have to be junked because of this new policy. This is a waste of resources. If it is pollution reduction that we are chasing, the policy doesn't consider the massive carbon cost of building a new car from the ground up. I've read a few arguments in favour of shared mobility. The governments like Karnataka are trying to ban it altogether. And honestly, with how expensive and unreliable cabs have become, I've decided I'd rather just drive to the airport and pay the usurious parking fee myself.

UDF must look beyond Muslim votes to win 2026 polls

There is a new 'captain' in Kerala. After the Congress-led United Democratic Front wrested the Nilambur seat from the Left Democratic Front, the state media lavished praise on Leader of the Opposition VD Satheesan for helming a crucial electoral win. On 23 June, the day of the Nilambur bypoll verdict, Satheesan watched the proceedings from the District Congress Committee (DCC) office in Ernakulam. As soon as the UDF ensured its victory, Congress leaders vied among themselves to shower praises on the LoP, led by MP Hibi Eden. It was a mark of appreciation for Satheesan, who didn't bow down to former Nilambur MLA PV Anvar's diktats and ensured a win despite the latter re-entering the fray. It was PV Anvar's resignation that facilitated the by-election in the first place, even if he sought to extract his pound of flesh for extending his support to the UDF. Leaders within the Congress—such as Ramesh Chennithala and ally Indian Union Muslim League (IUML)—advocated Anvar's accommodation, with the by-poll becoming a bellwether ahead of the 2026 assembly election. Nevertheless,

Satheesan stood his ground and took ownership of the decision to keep Anvar out. It was a marked departure from the consensual ways that have defined the Congress in recent times. The consensual approach was necessitated on account of the party's weakening organisational apparatus, leaving it at the mercy of various stakeholders and its supporters frustrated. The UDF's morale-boosting win and the credit to Satheesan prompted former LoP Ramesh Chennithala to come out publicly, stating how nobody hailed him as 'captain' when he led the UDF to bypoll victories in the past.

Power struggles in the Congress aside, the UDF seems to be taking the wrong lessons from the bypoll by extrapolating it to 2026. On the contrary, the ruling Communist Party of India-Marxist (CPI-M) is leveraging even the loss to build its narrative for the upcoming assembly election. The Left's route to a solitary seat in successive Lok Sabha elections in 2019 and 2024 was marked by a shift in its Hindu vote base to the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP). The Left has traditionally been the 'Hindu party'

Europe's factories to African startups—how India can act as a bridge between economies

Not long ago I heard a global CEO joke that India's payment apps impress the world, yet our biggest export deals still settle in dollars. The comment stayed with me because it captured the paradox of modern India: a country with the tools and talent to bridge East and West, but not choosing to think bigger. Today's global landscape is splintering. Rising tensions between the United States and China have prompted supply-chain realignments from Vietnam to Mexico. Political blocs, tariff walls, and digital standards

are being remade in real time. In this environment, many countries must choose sides. India, by contrast, can carve a third path: a true bridge economy that unites disparate markets through aligned infrastructure, finance, and digital networks. The first piece of this bridge is production. India's Production Linked Incentive-driven factories are churning out smartphones, solar panels, and auto components on a scale unseen a decade ago. Exporters in Pune now ship precision parts as easily to Stuttgart in Germany

as they do to Lagos in Nigeria. Our manufacturing base overlaps the needs of advanced economies (where quality matters) and the rising purchasing power of the emerging economies. That dual fit is rare, and it underpins India's unique value proposition. Digital rails reinforce this bridge. UPI's transaction volumes surpassed global giants like Visa, turning wallets into gateways. Early UPI trials in the UAE and Singapore show how a rupee-linked digital corridor can settle micropayments instantly, without inter-

mediary banks. If India extends these rails to East Africa, Southeast Asia, and the Gulf, small businesses from Nairobi to Jakarta could transact with Indian partners as effortlessly as they do with local vendors. Digital payment networks are the plumbing of the 21st-century bridge. With our digital rails in place, the next step is ensuring those goods move as smoothly across ports and borders. Yet infrastructure alone is not enough. Logistics bottlenecks still cast a shadow on our ambition.

MNREGA Scam in Mustafabad: Village Head, Secretary and Technical Assistant Accused of Embezzling Rs. 29 Lakhs

If you want to see a clear picture of corruption in the MNREGA scheme, Mustafabad Gram Panchayat serves as a prime example. Here the village head, secretary and technical assistant colluded to get payments five times for the same road construction work by giving it different names. An investigation by the MNREGA ombudsman, based on complaints from villagers, revealed a scam of Rs. 29,75,153. Bilal Ansari, a resident of the village, along with other villagers, had complained to MNREGA

Ombudsman Umesh Tiwari about the irregularities in the panchayat. Based on the complaint, the ombudsman conducted an on-site inspection of the development works carried out in the Gram Panchayat with the village head Abu Sahma, technical assistant Amol Srivastava and the secretary. During the investigation, major irregularities were found in various works, including interlock paving from the main road to Imran house from Dastgir house to the canal from Akhtar Master house to the canal bridge from Ghanshyam field to Mukhtar field from the asphalt road to

Raghuraj field from Santosh field to Murtaza field, from Lucknow road to Karbala from Lucknow road to Bechan field, from the asphalt road to Laharpur from the asphalt road to Sapsa border, from Radheshyam field to Inder field, from Chaudagra to Raju house

from Harsakari to Satyanarayan Yadav from Harsakari to the Zila Parishad gate, from the asphalt road to the brick pavement from the road to Suhail plant and from Lucknow road to Sattar Khan field, including earthwork, pond renovation and cremation ground pond excavation. Ombudsman Umesh Tiwari stated that during the site inspection, no official of the Gram Panchayat presented any documents, nor was any information board displayed at any of the work sites. The panchayat neither provided any documents nor presented its side

of the story. The investigation revealed that payments were repeatedly claimed for the same work by changing the name of the task and manipulating the records. Payments were even obtained by creating fake muster rolls for a road built with contributions from the villagers, which constitutes serious unethical conduct and a criminal act. The Lokpal (ombudsman) has termed this entire episode a blatant misuse of public funds and has recommended the recovery of Rs. 29,75,153 in proportion to the amount involved, to be deposited into the state treasury.

War history, masterfully told onscreen

Ikkis is a war drama based on the true story of Second Lieutenant Arun Khetarpal, India's youngest awardee, who laid down his life at the age of 21 in the 1971 India-Pakistan War during the Battle of Basantar.

Actors' Performances

Ikkis switches between the present (just after the Kargil War, post-1999), when Brigadier ML Khetarpal, Arun's father, played by Dharmendra, visits Pakistan to meet Brigadier Khwaja Mohammed Nasir of the Pakistan Army, played by Jaideep Ahlawat, and the past (1971), during the war.

The movie makes you emotional on various occasions, a majority of them when Dharmendra is on screen. I don't



know whether to call this his best performance or to give credit to Sriram Raghavan for using him in a manner in which, at least in my experience, I haven't seen him utilized this well in an emotionally charged role. It is a combination of both?

Rahul Dev plays the role of the stoic Lt Col Hanut Singh, in a way that makes you feel he might as well be an army man in real life.

Sikander Kher has a roughly 60-second intro scene, which is excellent because of its mix of surprise and humour.

Seeing Asrani in one of his last cinematic roles was a pleasant surprise, and once again, the way Raghavan has used him in a cameo is just so apt.

It must be mentioned, regarding director Raghavan,

that we have a lot of patriotic, army-based films which regularly go a bit over the top. In this case, however, he does not let that happen. This is where I would like to talk about Agastya. I went into the hall with absolutely zero expectations regarding his performance. However,

whether it was emotion, anger, or romance, he delivers on all fronts.

A section of the audience was applauding when Dharmendra first comes on screen, even before he had said his dialogue. I would like to mention here that even if you were someone seeing Dharmendra

for literally the first time in this movie, you would have given that same kind of applause after witnessing his entire performance. Music

Never did I feel that the music during the war scenes was overdone. The tempo for each moment—whether it is the tank fights, the emotionally charged instances, or any other—adds to the storytelling, never venturing into the melodramatic zone.

Final Verdict

The movie is a must-watch because it's about the true story of the bravery of a 21-year-old who sacrificed his life for the nation, and cinematically, it has been done justice.

Israel to ban dozens of aid agencies from Gaza

TEL AVIV

Israel has announced it will stop dozens of aid organisations working in Gaza within 36 hours for failing to meet stringent new requirements to hand over personal details of Palestinian and international staff deployed in the devastated territory, 'The Guardian' reported.

The list of groups hit by the ban include some of the world's best known humanitarian organisations such as ActionAid, International Rescue Committee and Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF).

Tuesday's announcement by the ministry of diaspora affairs comes amid recent fierce storms, which destroyed thousands of tents in Gaza, exacerbating an already acute humanitarian crisis.

Foreign ministers of 10 nations expressed "serious concerns" about a "renewed deterioration of the humanitarian situation" in the devastated territory, saying the situation was "catastrophic".

The statement added, "1.3 million people still require urgent shelter support. More than half of health facilities are

only partially functional and face shortages of essential medical equipment and supplies. The total collapse of sanitation infrastructure has left 74,000 people vulnerable to toxic flooding."

The ministers called for the UN and its partners to continue their work in Gaza, and for the lifting of "unreasonable [Israeli] restrictions on imports considered to have a dual use". Hundreds of items have been blocked by Israel from

Tatiana Schlossberg, the granddaughter of former US President John F Kennedy, has died at 35. Her family announced her death in a social media post shared by the John F Kennedy Library Foundation, writing: "Our beautiful Tatiana passed away this morning. She will always be in our hearts."

In November, Schlossberg, a climate journalist, announced her diagnosis of an aggressive form of cancer. She said in an essay she had been given less than a year to live.

Schlossberg was the daughter of designer Edwin Schlossberg and diplomat Caroline Kennedy, and is survived by her husband George Moran and their children, Edwin, 3, and Josephine, 1.

In a 'New Yorker' article 'A Battle With My Blood' last month, Schlossberg revealed she had been diagnosed with acute myeloid leukaemia in May 2024, after giving birth to her second child.

Hadi murder suspect in Dubai

Dhaka: In the Bangladeshi student leader Osman Hadi's murder case, prime accused Faisal Karim Masud has denied any role, claiming he was in Dubai, contradicting Bangladesh police's allegations about his presence in India, reports said. In a viral video (veracity was not verified), Masud said he did not kill Hadi, claiming a radical political group was involved.

Masud accepted he went to Hadi's office before the shooting but insisted his relations with Inqilab Moncho spokesperson was business related. The video has sparked fresh debate and uncertainty over what really happened.

"I am Faisal Karim Masud. I want to state I am not involved in the murder of Hadi in any

way. This case is completely false and based on a fabricated conspiracy," Masud said.

"Because of this false implication, I was forced to flee the country and come to Dubai. I came here with great difficulty, though I held a valid 5-year Dubai visa," he added.

He claimed his family was being falsely implicated and is being severely harassed and tortured, despite being completely innocent. "They have no involvement whatsoever.

This kind of inhuman treatment of my family is unjust and unacceptable. I strongly protest against it," he said.

About ties with Hadi, Masud said, "Yes, I did go to Hadi's office. I am a businessman; I own an IT firm. I was previously employed at ministry

of finance. I went to meet Hadi about a job. He promised to arrange it and asked for an advance payment."

"Accordingly, I gave him 500,000 taka. He asked me to donate to his programmes, and I provided funds whenever he requested. Last Friday, I gave him money for one of his programmes," he added.

Masud accused Jamaat of Hadi's murder, saying, the student leader was "a product of Jamaat" and he was killed by "Jamaat elements". "This incident is the work of Jamaat. Neither I nor my younger brother was on that motorcycle, and we have been deliberately framed. My family is suffering unjustly. This level of harassment is disturbing and unacceptable." — Agencies

France to ban social media for U-15s

PARIS

The French government on Wednesday said it would ban social media for children Under-15. If the bill is passed, France would be one of the first democracies to do so.

The bill, scheduled to be presented in Parliament in January, and, if passed, to be enforced in September 2026, is a two-fold initiative. The law will ban social media sites from serving anyone under 15, in addition to enforcing the long-standing prohibition on mobile phone usage in high schools. The proposal follows Australia's decision to prevent its young citizens from accessing social networking sites, which has stirred a controversy over the use of social media and its impact on mental health.

According to **President Emmanuel Macron** and his cabinet, the law is intended to ensure "appropriate



measures are put in place to protect youngsters from inappropriate content, bullying, and sleep disturbances that have become distressingly frequent in adolescents."

There is increasing evidence, over the past decade, of the consequences of excessive social media exposure on the health and well-being of adolescents and also adults. There is mounting research evidence in Europe, the US, Australia, and Asia of increasing levels of teenagers suf-

fering from anxiety, body image disturbances and self-harm.

The implementation of the ban is not going to be easy. According to teachers' unions, the use of phones, although banned in middle schools, is not implemented consistently. High schools are expected to be more problematic, since students are older and independent.

"We do not have the human and technical capacity to implement it," said Jean-Rémi Girard, head of National Union of High School, Middle School, Primary Schools, and Higher Education (SNALC). Whether the policy is right is no longer the question, the challenge is to make it practical.

Notably, under-16s in Australia were banned from using major social media sites, including Tiktok, X, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, Snapchat and Threads on December 10. The ban is the first of its kind and was being watched closely by other countries.

Jailed Lai's teeth rotting, fingernails falling off: Daughter



The daughter of **Jimmy Lai**, the pro-democracy tycoon jailed in Hong Kong, has expressed concerns about her father's deteriorating health in prison, saying his fingernails "sometimes fall off" and his teeth are rotting.

Lai, 78, has been detained since December 2020 and faces life in prison. Earlier this month he was convicted of colluding with foreign forces under the city's controversial national security law.

Hong Kong and Chinese authorities have denied that Lai has been mistreated in prison, saying he is in "good health". The BBC has seen a letter written by Lai's family urging UK PM Keir Starmer to call for Lai's release when he meets Chinese President Xi Jinping next month.

His daughter Claire Lai, who's in exile in London, said she fears she "may never see

him again". "Of course I worry that my father is going to be a martyr, and I don't want him to be a martyr. But I would not be here today. I would not be speaking out if I didn't think this was his best chance of reuniting with our family."

"He is diabetic, he has heart issues which he never had in the past. He has fingernails that turn purplish grey and sometimes fall off. He has teeth that are rotting. He has back and waist pains. Some days it's painful for him to stand. Sometimes he can't stand. And some days he can't even get out of bed," she said.

Isiah Whitlock Jr, 'The Wire' and 'Veep' actor, dies at 71

Isiah Whitlock Jr, known for his memorable acting roles on 'The Wire' and 'Veep', has died at the age of 71, according to his manager. "It is with tremendous sadness I share the passing of my dear friend and client Isiah Whitlock Jr," manager Brian Liebman wrote on Instagram.

Whitlock, who also featured in 'Goodfellas' and 'The Chappell Show', was a long-time collaborator with director Spike Lee, who also shared a heartfelt tribute to him.

"Today I learned of the passing of my dear beloved brother Isiah Whitlock. God bless," Lee wrote, alongside a photo of the two men shaking hands. "If you knew him — you loved him. A brilliant actor and even better person," Liebman wrote.

In statements to Hollywood news outlets, he added Whitlock passed away in New York after a short illness.

UKRAINIAN UAV ATTACK ON PUTIN'S RESIDENCE

Russia releases video proof

MOSCOW

Russia on Wednesday published video proof of its claims, showing a downed drone it said was launched by Ukraine at President Vladimir Putin's residence in the north-west.

The video, released by Russia's defence ministry, shows the damaged drone lying in snow. It described the incident as a "targeted, carefully planned" attack that had been "carried out in stages".

Officials said the UAV was part of a mass drone launch aimed at Putin's residence. They claimed the home was not damaged, and Putin's whereabouts at the time were not revealed.

Moscow called the alleged drone attack a "terrorist act" and a "personal attack" on Putin. In response, Russia said

it would harden its stance in peace talks concerning the Ukraine war. The US-based Institute for the Study of War expressed scepticism over Russia's claims, saying there was no supporting footage or evidence associated with deep strikes from Ukrainian forces to back up the assertion Putin's house had been targeted.

Power company DTEK said two of its energy facilities suffered significant damage.

The company said 10 substations that distribute electricity in Odesa were damaged in December alone.

German bank heist

Thieves use drill to steal €30m

BERLIN

Just days before the New Year, valuables worth around €30 million (\$33 million) were stolen from a bank in the western German city of Gelsenkirchen, in what police described as one of the largest bank heists in the country in recent years. Authorities confirmed the incident on Tuesday, DW reported.

Police believe the robbery was carried out by a well-organised and well-prepared group, citing the planning, technical skill and coordination involved in the operation.

According to investigators,

estimate placing total losses at approximately €30 million.

The theft came to light on Monday after a fire alarm was triggered inside the building, prompting emergency services to respond. Several witnesses later told the police they had seen men carrying heavy bags inside the parking garage stairwell at night.

Investigators are reviewing CCTV footage that reportedly shows a black Audi RS 6 leaving the garage early on Monday morning. The occupants were masked, and police confirmed the vehicle was using a licence plate stolen earlier from the northern German city of Hanover.

More than 3,000 safe-deposit boxes were damaged during the break-in. The lockers reportedly contained cash, gold and jewellery. Based on an average insured value of €10,000 per box (\$10,900), police have made an initial

investigation into the theft. The police are investigating whether the heist was carried

Sarfaraz stars in Mumbai win

JAIPUR

Sarfaraz Khan ended 2025 with a magnificent 75-ball 157 studded with 14 sixes as Mumbai inched closer towards knock-out with a 87-run victory over Goa in a group C game of the Vijay Hazare Trophy here on Wednesday.

Mercurial Carlsen wins record-extending 9th title

Erigaisi becomes second from India to win a World Blitz medal

DOHA



Relieved after defending his world blitz crown, chess megastar **Magnus Carlsen** acknowledged it was an extremely tough field and admitted he was fortunate to win a record-extending ninth title following the reverses in the early rounds of the tournament.

World No.1 Magnus Carlsen showed his endgame genius yet again to add the Blitz crown to the Rapid gold medal he won last week by defeating Uzbek Grandmaster Nodirbek Abdusattarov 2.5-1.5 in the title showdown on Tuesday.

The third-place finish for 22-year-old Erigaisi, impeccable in the 19-round qualification (Swiss), suffered a massive meltdown in the semifinal to settle for a bronze medal in the World Blitz Championship.

The third-place finish for 22-year-old Erigaisi on Sunday, not only helped him win the Blitz and Rapid gold, it also made him only the second male chess player

AIFF asks clubs to confirm participation in delayed ISL

NEW DELHI

clubs will not be able to play the mandatory 24 matches in the season -- including top division league and domestic cup -- to be eligible to feature in the AFC Champions League 2.

In that regard, the ISL clubs had urged the AIFF to request the Asian Football Confederation for a one-time relaxation in the minimum requirement of 24 matches so that they can play in the ACL 2.

The representatives of the clubs and a committee

formed by the AIFF have had five meetings since December 24 on how to hold the 2025-26 ISL season.

"... the meetings held on 28th December 2025, wherein the ISL Clubs requested the All India Football Federation to take up the matter with the Asian Football Confederation regarding a one-time relaxation in the minimum requirement of 24 matches," the AIFF said in a letter to the ISL clubs.

"Considering the urgency of the matter, it would be highly appreciated if the above confirmation is received by tomorrow, i.e., 1st January 2026. We trust you will appreciate the seriousness and time-sensitive nature of the situation."

The AIFF also said it is

required to submit the outcome of the meetings it had with the ISL clubs to the Sports Ministry before January 2, 2026.

"Further, the Hon'ble Supreme Court is scheduled to resume after vacation on 5th January 2026, and all stakeholders may be required to file relevant documents in accordance with legal advice."

The AIFF had proposed two competition formats for the ISL 2025-26 season, which it wants to start in the

first week of February.

The first option is a conference-based league structure where the 14 participating teams would be divided equally into East and West groups. Teams would play against each other only within their respective conferences.

The top four sides from each group will advance to a single-leg championship round to decide the ISL winner. All the matches would be played at two centralized venues.
