Flights to be fully normal by February 10: IndiGo

IndiGo canceled more than 550 flights on Thursday and another 400 on Friday, disrupting the travel plans of hundreds of passengers. On Thursday, IndiGo informed the

Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) that its flights would be fully normal by February 10, 2026. That day, the company also sought a temporary relaxation of flight duty rules, as the country's largest airline canceled more than 550 flights, disrupting the travel of hundreds of passengers.

Land acquisition for fencing remains the biggest problem

Border Security Force North Bengal Frontier Inspector General Mukesh Tyagi stated that fencing along the border is essential to prevent Bangladeshi infiltration. Land acquisition for this purpose is becoming difficult. Fencing is not possible due to the lack of land. 104 kilometers of the border remains completely open. Of this, more than 56 kilometers are riverine areas, where fencing is not possible, while



the remaining 56 kilometers are open land. BSF has requested land from the Bengal government. The BSF has requested land from the Bengal government for this purpose. 251.92 crore has been deposited in the treasury, yet only 20 acres of land has been made available so far. This could allow for approximately five kilometers of fencing. He clarified that "limited support is being received from the state government."

The shooters, waiting for the target, mistakenly killed Shivani. Two shooters and the woman have been arrested, with investigations ongoing for others.

tions, documentation related to procurement and sale was found suspicious. Pending detailed investigation, sales of codeine-based and narcotic syrups have been halted in over two dozen medical stores. The department has reiterated that any information regarding unauthorised drug storage,

transport, or sale may be shared through the dedicated WhatsApp number issued for public reporting.

District-wise figures indicate that the highest number of FIRs were recorded in Varanasi, followed by Jaunpur, Kanpur Nagar, Ghazipur, and four each in Lakhimpur Kheri

and Lucknow. Fifty-two additional FIRs were filed across several districts including Bahraich, Bijnor, Prayagraj, Sitapur, Sonbhadra, Balrampur, Raebareli, Hardoi, and others. Officials confirmed that action under the NDPS Act has been taken wherever applicable.

The FSDA stated that the special drive will continue, with enhanced scrutiny of suspicious medical stores and distributors to curb illicit narcotic movement within the state.

"I am innocent": shubham jaiswal

Varanasi: A separate development in Varanasi involved the individual identified as the key operator in a codeine-syrup supply chain issuing a video statement claiming innocence. He asserted that the syrups he sold were neither counterfeit nor linked to reported child deaths and alleged coercion by certain officials. The individual also denied political links and said his business followed licensing norms. While he remains untraceable, police have arrested several associates, including a former police constable. Authorities noted that the ongoing statewide crackdown is independent of his claims, and investigations will proceed based on evidence.

Packaging hubs for local crops to get fast-track approval



Deputy CM Maurya orders swift action on new incubation centre and crop-based packaging hubs

During a district-level review meeting at Maa Sheetla Atithi Grah in Sayara, the Deputy CM instructed officials of Kaushambi to expedite measures for setting up additional food-processing units. He stressed that packaging centres for crops produced in large quantities—particularly guava, banana, ber and chilli—should be established and linked with systematic branding and marketing to improve market reach.

He directed the Chief Veterinary Officer to ensure adequate winter arrangements at all cow shelters, including sufficient fodder and protection against cold. Officials were also told to operationalise the newly built incubation centre without delay.

The Deputy CM asked

departments to support self-help group women in setting up small enterprises such as school-uniform stitching through training and access to facilities. The electricity department was instructed to maintain scheduled power supply and replace faulty transformers within the prescribed timeframe. A proposal for an additional meeting hall at the Sayara guest house was also sought.

He directed that only suitable schools be selected as examination centres and asked the health department to ensure accessible medical services.

Sixth grader dies of cardiac arrest

A 12-year-old Class 6 student, Arney Singh, died from suspected cardiac arrest at Mountfort Inter College in Lucknow on Friday after collapsing immediately after submitting his English unit test paper. The tragedy has caused immense grief for his family; his grandfather is a High Court advocate in Lucknow.

School staff administered CPR and immediately rushed him to Bhawra Devras Civil Hospital, where a team of four doctors also attempted resuscitation but were unsuccessful. Doctors declared the cause of death as cardiac arrest.

IndiGo flight chaos continues at Lucknow airport

IndiGo services at Lucknow's Chaudhary Charan Singh International Airport were severely disrupted for the fourth consecutive day on Friday, December 5, 2025, with numerous flights either canceled or delayed by several hours.

The widespread chaos stems from technical issues, a persistent pilot shortage, and the enforcement of a new DGCA rule. The new DGCA regulation, which prevents pilots appointed as inspectors from flying commercial routes, has created a sudden and significant pilot deficit for IndiGo and other airlines, acutely affecting airports across North India.

25 districts allocated each to CM and deputy CMs for accelerating SIR process

The government noted that recent political criticism has increased tensions in some areas, but maintained that routine electoral verification should continue as usual. The administration also reiterated that identifying unauthorised residents falls under procedural norms of electoral rolls and should be completed accord-

ingly. In a separate briefing, officials stated that the SIR-related household sheets received by residents must be submitted through the BLOs to ensure their names appear correctly during voter-list publication. Authorities also called on residents to report details of those living without authorisation, as required under the verification process.

Senior officials acknowledged increased political reactions to the campaign but said that administrative instructions remain focused on accuracy of the electoral roll rather than political outcomes.

Lawyers staged a road blockade to protest the shooting, demanding the attacker's license be revoked

Lawyers protested on Friday against the deadly attack on advocate Vijaykant Pandey

Prayagraj. Lawyers protested on Friday against the deadly attack on advocate Vijaykant Pandey. They blocked the road in front of the District Magistrate's office, demanding the cancellation of the attacker's license and a permanent ban on his entry into the court premises. The incident occurred late Thursday evening.

Advocate Vijaykant Pandey had stopped at a shop at Baba Chowraha to buy sweets. When his nephew Om Shiv Pandey arrived, an argument ensued, leading to Om Shiv Pandey firing his licensed revolver. The attacker fired five bullets in quick succession, three of which hit Vijaykant. He fell to the road, seriously injured. The inci-



dent spread panic in the area, and the shutters of nearby shops were immediately closed. Shivkuti police arrived at the scene upon receiving information. The injured Vijaykant was immediately admitted to Swarup Rani Nehru Hospital. After the victim revealed the attacker's name, police arrested Om Shiv

Pandey shortly after. On Friday morning, lawyers protested by blocking the road in front of the District Magistrate's office gate. They stated that the attack on a fellow lawyer was a very serious matter and that their protest would continue until strict action was taken.

The lawyers warned that

if the administration did not take strict action, the movement would be expanded. They stated that this attack was not just an attack on one individual, but an attack on the safety of the lawyer community. The administration and the Bar Council must take decisive action as soon as possible.

Live footage of the incident, CCTV footage of firing on lawyer goes viral

Prayagraj. CCTV footage has surfaced in the case of the firing on lawyer Vijaykant Pandey. This footage depicts the entire incident. The video reveals that initially, a heated argument broke out between the two parties in front of a shop. This argument quickly escalated into a scuffle, and pushing and shoving ensued. First in the shop, then outside. A small girl, believed to be the daughter of Omshiv Pandey, the accused in the shooting, is seen amidst the commotion. During the scuffle, the girl appears to fall from the shop. The dispute then escalates to the street outside the shop, and ultimati-

ly, one party opens fire. The video also shows people running away after the shots were fired. The shooting occurred on Wednesday evening. Yugank Pandey, son of injured advocate Vijaykant Pandey, stated in his complaint to the police that his father had gone to Santosh Sweet House, Teliyarganj, to buy sweets around 6-7 pm on December 4th. As soon as he left the shop, his car was forcibly stopped by Omshiv Pandey, his father. Omshiv Pandey has been in custody since the incident and is being interrogated. The role of other accused is being investigated. CCTV footage that has surfaced is being included as evidence in the investigation.

Xi Jinping's Europe tour: A visit that raises eyebrows

On his first visit to Europe post-pandemic, Xi Jinping met French President Emmanuel Macron. Xi lauded China's ties with France as a "model for the international community amid threats of a trade war over Chinese electric cars and French cognac". Xi Jinping's tour through Europe, analysts point out, highlighted China's audacious strategy to exploit the fissures within Europe amid great power contestation. Among many other developments, the armed forces of China and France announced the setting up of a new inter-theatre cooperation and dialogue mechanism. This collaboration between the two militaries' naval and air forces is aimed at further deepening mutual trust and cooperation and jointly safeguarding regional security and stability.

Such a move towards forging closer Sino-French military ties, especially amid Beijing's assertive manoeuvres in the Indo-Pacific and the South China Sea, begs the question: Can Europe, and particularly France, remain a reliable ally, or will it become more accommodating of China's controversial actions in its neighbourhood? Countries like India are watching closely, concerned about France and Europe in the future and potentially succumbing to China's diplomatic and economic enticements. China claims to be "not at the origin of the Russian-Ukraine crisis, nor a party to it, nor a participant", and thus legitimises its silence. Can we anticipate a similar approach by Europe on issues concerning Taiwan and the Philippines? In the past few years, France's relationship with China has been marked by a mixture of scepticism and strategic engagement, reflecting broader geopolitical objectives and national interests. In the recent past, France has been quite critical of China, viewing it as a 'strategic threat'. The 2021 update to France's 2017 Defence and National Security Strategic Review painted China as a 'systemic rival', 'economic competitor', and 'sometimes an important diplomatic partner'. Even as Paris sought engagement with Beijing in 2019, substantial tensions clearly existed. During Xi Jinping's previous European tour, President Macron rallied a united European front to challenge Beijing on critical European issues like unfair trade practices, restricted market access for European companies, opaque financing under the BRI, and human rights abuses in Tibet and Xinjiang.

Recent events and official statements have further underscored this stance. A parliamentary report on foreign interference in France, requested by Marine Le Pen's far-right party, highlighted China's "aggressive and increasingly malicious methods". Labelling China as the "second most serious threat to France after Russia", the report echoed sentiments from Bernard Emié, Director of French External Intelligence (DGSE), who described China as an 'aggressive power' with 'unbridled diplomacy'. Furthermore, the issue of France selling arms to Taiwan resurfaced during the pandemic when Taiwan announced plans to buy defence equipment from France to upgrade missile systems on French warships purchased in 1991 and 1992. Beijing expressed 'serious concern' and urged Paris to avoid actions that could strain Sino-French ties. Following Chinese air intrusions into Taiwan's air defence zone, a French delegation led by former defence minister Alain Richard visited Taipei to meet with President Tsai Ing-wen.

This visit was seen as a powerful symbol of France's commitment to opposing China's unilateral aggression and supporting peace, security, and stability in the Indo-Pacific.



As India votes for 5th phase, it's the contest of two economic outlooks

The day Aam Aadmi Party's national convener and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal unveiled his 10 guarantees was also the day when Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced her government's commitment to economic freedom by opposing the very idea of wealth redistribution. It became very clear that day that the INDIA bloc must remain in the Opposition and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) should come back to power. Though Kejriwal did not consult his alliance partners about the 10 guarantees he promised, there is a likelihood of them agreeing with him. For, on their part, they have also made equal

ly outlandish promises. Kejriwal has pledged, among other things, free 24-hour power supply, free healthcare that is not based on insurance schemes, freedom to the Indian Army to get back the Indian territory occupied by China, abrogation of the Agniveer scheme, legal status for MSP on all crops according to the Swaminathan Commission report, two crore jobs for the youth, and ease of doing business for traders. A few days later, Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi said that the INDIA coalition, if victorious in the ongoing general elections, will work for the empowerment of women: "Our sisters across the country are ready to form

the INDIA Alliance government with enthusiasm. From July, Rs 8,500 deposited in women's accounts every month, i.e., Rs 1 lakh annually, will change the financial condition of every family." If wishes were horses, our politicians would bring heaven to earth, but that's not the reality. Sometimes it takes a lifetime for a wish to be realised, sometimes more than that. Just as calamities cannot be wished away, good outcomes cannot be ushered in just by wishing them.

If Kejriwal pledges to offer free 24-hour power supply and free healthcare, for instance, he should also enlighten us where the money would come from to ensure such freebies. After all, it

costs a great deal to run power plants, transmit and supply electricity, pay doctors and paramedics, run hospitals, and so on. In the final analysis, it is the public exchequer that will bear the costs. And since it is the taxpayer money that makes the public exchequer, ultimately taxpayers will be burdened with these expenses — that is, the people who pay direct and indirect taxes. In short, all people, as indirect taxes are paid even by the poor. Freebies, after all, are not free. The same is true for the Congress' promise of offering the largesse of Rs 1 lakh per annum to women. If the grand old party wins and redeems its pledge,



Ayatollah's succession in Iran

The rough weather in north-west Iran took the lives of Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi and Foreign Minister Hossein Amir Abdollahian on Sunday (May 19), along with seven others, in a helicopter crash while returning after inaugurating a dam in East Azerbaijan with his Azerbaijani counterpart, Ilham Heydar oghlu Aliyev. The two Presidents looked happy and comfortable despite some intra-regional competition, especially in the wake of the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict. The death of President Raisi, along with his foreign minister, has indeed caused a vacuum on key developments and initiatives, especially at this time when the region is going through a highly volatile war in Gaza, which threatens to expand beyond. In March and April, Iran and Israel had nearly come to a direct confrontation that could be avoided due to pragmatism and intervention by the US and others in the region. Limited strikes saved the face for both. President Raisi, despite his conservative approaches domestically, tried to be pragmatic even as, under his watch, Iran continued on its path to increase the enrichment of uranium to keep the pressure on the West and pursued the quest to acquire parity with Israel in the nuclear domain. Perhaps the biggest credit could go to him for the Saudi-Iranian rapprochement, along with working for a regional modus vivendi

with the Arab world. His Act East policy also brought about closer relations with India and China while they worked to closely enrich ties with Russia. At the same time, in the wake of Abraham Accords and the further potential normalisation of ties between key Arab countries and Israel, Tehran emerged as a major protagonist of the Palestinian cause, given its hold on Hamas in Gaza. However, the mutually assured destruction (MAD) syndrome between Tehran and Tel Aviv continues apace and could threaten stability in West Asia. Raisi successfully secured the release of \$6 billion in exchange for some US prisoners and even restrained Shia Iraqi militias from attacking US military assets. Although Iran has been able to blunt the impact of the severest sanctions to a considerable extent, it may have been severely compromised in the

area of spare parts and technology. The fact that the President was riding in a 15-year-old helicopter not only questions the choices of the pilot or the leadership in such a weather but also confirms the existence of restrictions on imports of spare parts that may have been imposed due to sanctions. What really caused the crash will only be confirmed by detailed investigations of the wreckage and Black Box. The untimely death of President Raisi has also caused a leadership vacuum, as he was mostly slated to succeed the Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Khamenei, who is 85 and is said to be ailing. But as was witnessed in the wake of the helicopter crash, Khamenei immediately took hold of the situation, assuring the country that there would be no governance crisis. As such, he decides in the end, and the armed forces, security, and intelligence outfits, as

well as the Revolutionary Guards (IRGC), look up to him for instructions. He also did not want to convey to his detractors, both internally and externally, that they could exploit the crisis and the transition. As for the succession issue, although the demise of Raisi has caused a vacuum, the argument for Mojtaba succeeding his father, Ayatollah Khamenei, would become more eloquent and vociferous even though the Supreme Leader personally appears not to be in favour of dynastic rule, as quoted by many insiders, for he would not like to be accused of nepotism. One more name that is being prodded to us is that of white-turbaned Ali Reza Arafai, whom the black-turbaned Supreme Leader called an original intellectual and prudent jurist. One would have to see if the colour of the turbans would matter at all. He is a member of the Assembly and was also appointed to the Guardian Council. His name has been circulating for quite some time. In any case, the presidium of an assembly of experts will identify the next leader in due course. But the 'Supreme Leader' will also have to be accepted by the masses since Iran is facing significant domestic discontent as well as huge external challenges, especially from the West and Israel. Of course, losing the President and foreign minister, especially at such a difficult time, is a challenge in itself for any

The new Great Game: China, US and India

The original "Great Game" was fought in the mid-1800s between the Russian Empire and the combined might of the British, French and Ottoman Empires over control of Central Asia. The British feared an attack by the Imperial Russian Army through Afghanistan on their Indian colony. The Ottomans, though in decline, wanted to guard against Russian incursions into their Balkan possessions. As a report by Kallie Szczepanski (thought.com) described it: "Britain's Lord Ellenborough started 'The Great Game' on January 12, 1830, with an edict establishing a new trade route from India to Bukhara, using Turkey, Persia, and Afghanistan as a buffer against Russia to pre-

vent it from controlling any ports on the Persian Gulf. Meanwhile, Russia wanted to establish a neutral zone in Afghanistan allowing for their use of crucial trade routes." The Great Game officially ended with the Anglo-Russian Convention of 1907, which divided Persia (Iran) into a Russian-controlled northern zone, a nominally independent central zone, and a British-controlled southern zone. The Convention also specified a borderline between the two empires running from the eastern point of Persia to Afghanistan and declared Afghanistan an official protectorate of Britain." Russia's invasion of Ukraine nearly two centuries later has triggered a new Great

Game but with vastly different actors, motives and possible outcomes. In the mid-1800s the United States did not count. It was convulsed by a Civil War (1861-65) between northern unionist states and southern confederate states over slavery. China had been humiliated by Britain during the Opium Wars (1839-60). It lay in repose. India was a British colony, robbed of its wealth and morale. Today Russia lies weakened, its Soviet-era satellite states absorbed into NATO. They form a Western knife aimed at Moscow's jugular. Ukraine remains a non-NATO buffer state. If it joins NATO in future, Russia would be completely encircled by the US-led West.

The emergence of new-era 'Leviathans'

In China, the fear of chaos that can come from within and from without is a central rationale that legitimises Xi Jinping's power grab. Image: REUTERS Thomas Hobbes' seminal work, Leviathan, published in 1651, posits the necessity of a powerful, centralised authority to prevent societal chaos and ensure peace and security. Hobbes had a way with words; he famously said that without an all-powerful state, whom he calls the Leviathan, life would be nasty, brutish, and short. Those powerful words have a global resonance today, giving the state across the world a free run. We saw it in Washington when more than \$3 trillion was printed in monetary easing. In Paris, monetary welfare spending is out of hand, and the Leviathan dares not withdraw the free fund, for that itself causes riots and chaos. In China, state capitalism is running wild, and in India, the state subsidises everything from fertiliser and maternity care to free food to the tune of \$10 billion a year. Everywhere, a man who wrote 350 years ago rules. In our turbulent world, Hobbes's premise of avoiding chaos is so powerful that both autocracies and democracies are utilising it to empower the state further. It is not as if he has not been proved right. In fact, rarely in contemporary history has Hobbes gone wrong. In Iraq, Libya, and Egypt, when the Leviathan was toppled, it created chaos beyond imagination, only to be replaced by the iron fist of the state. In China, the fear of chaos that can come from within and from without is a central rationale that legitimises Xi Jinping's power grab. Indeed, it's replacing the promise of prosperity as the basis of the communist party's hold over China. The fact that the Federal Reserve's policy of quantitative easing following the 2008 financial crisis and the purchase of government securities to increase the money supply were unquestioned exemplifies Hobbes' idea of the sovereign exercising control to prevent economic disorder and maintain stability. That, in the bastion of capitalism, it did not raise concerns about the erosion of financial autonomy and the distortion of free markets underlines the astonishing relevance of Hobbes. France's robust welfare state epitomises Hobbes' notion of the sovereign's responsibility to ensure the well-being of its citizens. The French government maintains an extensive social safety net, including comprehensive healthcare, unemployment benefits, and retirement pensions. During the COVID-19 pandemic, France's welfare spending surged as the government implemented measures to protect jobs and support incomes. However, this extensive welfare system can be critiqued for fostering dependency and reducing individual responsibility. The welfare-to-GDP ratio in 2023 was an astonishing 36 per cent. This is clearly unsustainable, but every time France has tried to pull back the Leviathan or cut back welfare, there have been dramatic riots. Once you create the Leviathan, clearly, there is no way back. In 2020, the French government introduced the 'Solidarity Fund', providing financial aid to businesses affected by the pandemic, and expanded unemployment benefits to cover those furloughed under the 'partial activity' scheme. These interventions, amounting to over €100 billion in expansive welfare spending, can lead to high taxation, which burdens individuals and businesses, and totally stifles entrepreneurial spirit and innovation. Additionally, the extensive welfare system creates a culture of dependency, reducing the incentive for personal initiative and self-reliance. France and its Leviathan are in a doom loop. China's model of state capitalism illustrates Hobbes' concept of the sovereign's expansive control over economic life. The Chinese government exercises significant influence over the economy through state-owned enterprises (SOEs), which dominate key industries such as energy, telecommunications, and finance. While this control allows the state to direct economic development and maintain social order, it also restricts economic freedom and individual rights. The role of SOEs in China's economic strategy is particularly evident in the "Made in China 2025" initiative, aimed at transforming China into a global leader in high-tech industries. The state provides substantial funding.

NETWORK | Raids across districts seize large quantities of narcotic syrups

Statewide raids expose Codeine network, FIR count climbs to 128

LUCKNOW

The UP government has intensified its state-level crackdown on the illegal misuse of codeine-based cough syrups and other narcotic-category medicines. Acting on directions from the CM, joint teams of the Anti-Narcotics Task Force and the Food Safety and Drug Administration (FSDA) conducted rapid inspections across districts, leading to the seizure of large quantities of unauthorised narcotic medicines. A total of 128 FIRs have been registered across 28 districts, and more than half a dozen individuals involved in unlawful drug storage and distribution have been arrested.

According to the FSDA Commissioner, inspections have been carried out at numerous establishments where sizeable stocks of codeine-based syrups and psychotropic-category medicines were recovered. In many locations, documentation related to procurement and sale was found suspicious. Pending detailed investigation, sales of codeine-based and narcotic syrups have been halted in over two dozen medical stores. The department has reiterated that any information regarding unauthorised drug storage,

transport, or sale may be shared through the dedicated WhatsApp number issued for public reporting.

District-wise figures indicate that the highest number of FIRs were recorded in Varanasi, followed by Jaunpur, Kannur Nagar, Ghazipur, and four each in Lakhimpur Kheri

and Lucknow. Fifty-two additional FIRs were filed across several districts including Bagrai, Bijnor, Prayagraj, Sitapur, Sonbhadra, Balrampur, Raebareli, Hardoi, and others. Officials confirmed that action under the NDPS Act has been taken wherever applicable.

The FSDA stated that the special drive will continue, with enhanced scrutiny of suspicious medical stores and distributors to curb illicit narcotic movement within the state.

Varanasi: A separate development in Varanasi involved the individual identified as the key operator in a codeine-syrup supply chain issuing a video statement claiming innocence. He asserted that the syrups he sold were neither counterfeit nor linked to reported child deaths and alleged coercion by certain officials. HC throws out plea against Rahul Gandhi's MP status

LUCKNOW

A Lucknow Bench of the Allahabad High Court on Thursday dismissed a petition seeking Rahul Gandhi's disqualification from the Lok Sabha. The Bench of Justice Shekhar B. Saraf and Justice Manjive Shukla ruled that the Supreme Court had already stayed Gandhi's 2023 conviction in a defamation case from Gujarat, making the plea untenable. The petitioner had argued that Gandhi's earlier conviction rendered him ineligible to serve as a Member of Parliament. The court noted that once the conviction was stayed, the disqualification ceased to operate under law. Accordingly, the petition was dismissed.

In a separate but related order, the court addressed delays in revenue cases pending

Hanuman Garhi Saint Escapes Arson Bid

Suspected attempt to burn a Hanuman Garhi saint alive was reported in Ayodhya after a fire broke out inside the room of Maheshdas, also known as Swami Mahesh Yogi, at his Govindgarh-based ashram early Friday morning. The incident occurred at around 2:45 am when unknown individuals allegedly cut the iron grill of a rear window and threw a burning object inside.

According to the saint, a strong petrol-like smell was present in the room at the time of the fire, suggesting the use of a flammable substance. He was alone in the room when the incident occurred, while his disciples were staying in another section of the ashram. The fire was extinguished in time, preventing major loss or injuries.

Police teams, along with forensic experts, reached the spot soon after receiving information. Officers recovered the cut grill and traces of inflammable materials. Investigators are now reviewing CCTV footage, call records and electronic surveillance data to identify those involved.

IndiGo flight chaos continues at Lucknow airport

IndiGo services at Lucknow's Chaudhary Charan Singh International Airport were severely disrupted for the fourth consecutive day on Friday, December 5, 2025, with numerous flights either canceled or delayed by several hours. The widespread chaos stems from technical issues, a persistent pilot shortage, and the enforcement of a new DGCA rule.

The new DGCA regulation, which prevents pilots appointed as inspectors from flying commercial routes, has created a sudden and significant pilot deficit for IndiGo and other airlines, acutely affecting airports across North India.

SIR Push: CM and Deputies take direct charge

The UP government has intensified its efforts to speed up the State Information Register (SIR) process, with the final date for submitting SIR forms set for 11 December. To ensure maximum coverage before the deadline, the administration has assigned 25 districts each to the CM and the two Deputy Chief Ministers for monitoring and review.

According to the administration, district-level meetings have been mandated to ensure that eligible citizens complete



and submit their SIR forms on time. The initiative aligns with the Election Commission's ongoing voter-list verification campaign aimed at preventing exclusion of genuine voters. Officials emphasised that Booth Level Officers (BLOs) must carry out their responsibilities without influence from

political disputes surrounding the SIR process. They were reminded that voter-list entries—including removal of deceased voters, eliminating duplicate registrations, identifying irregular entries, and adding new eligible voters aged 18 and above—must follow standard electoral procedures.

The government noted that recent political criticism has increased tensions in some areas, but maintained that routine electoral verification should continue as usual. The administration also reiterated that identifying unauthorised residents falls under procedural norms of electoral rolls and should be completed according to the election process.

Senior officials acknowledged increased political reactions to the campaign but said that administrative instructions remain focused on accuracy of the electoral roll rather than political outcomes.

Ukrainian and US negotiators will resume discussions on Friday after nearly five hours of talks with Russia ended without any progress on Kyiv's peace proposals.

The Ukrainian delegation is being led by National Security Secretary Rostem Umerov and Chief of the General Staff Andrii Hnatov, while the US team is headed by Special Envoy Steve Witkoff.

President Volodymyr Zelensky, in a post on X, emphasized that Ukraine's immediate priority is to obtain full clarity on what transpired during Moscow's latest engagements with Washington. He said Kyiv remains determined to ensure that its national interests remain central to all diplomatic efforts. Zelensky added that Ukraine is preparing for "any possible developments" and is

committed to working constructively with international partners to achieve what he called a "dignified peace."

"Ukrainian representatives will continue their discussions in the United States with President Trump's team," Zelensky wrote. "Our task is to fully understand what was said in Moscow and what new pretexts Putin is presenting to prioritize military solutions influenced by 'radical nationalist groups.' Putin also said Russia remains open to negotiations but will not accept terms that threaten its security, criticizing Ukraine's 28-point peace proposal as unchanged from earlier rejected positions."

Nirav Modi cites lack of legal papers in London jail, seeks relief

Fugitive businessman Nirav Modi has told the High Court in London that severe restrictions inside HMP Pentonville are preventing him from preparing for his upcoming civil trial, prompting a request to postpone the January 2026 proceedings. Modi, wanted in India over the USD 2 billion Punjab National Bank fraud case, has been unable to access key legal documents since being moved from HMP Thameeside in October for an unrelated debt matter.

At a pre-trial review regarding an unpaid USD 8 mil-

lion Bank of India loan, Justice Simon Tinkler noted Modi may be unable to properly defend himself without access to his handwritten notes and disclosure papers. He warned that the absence of documents could compromise a fair trial and ordered the immediate transfer of all legal materials from Thameeside to Pentonville.

Modi's lawyer, James Kinman, said his client's cramped cell, lack of workspace and absence of IT facilities make preparing a defence nearly impossible. Bank of India's counsel, Tom Beasley, opposed the adjournment, accusing Modi of delaying tactics and noting



his pending extradition case in India.

Modi, who attended the hearing via video link, confirmed he still lacked essential paperwork. The court will revisit the adjournment request on December 19. Meanwhile, a separate hearing to reopen Modi's extradition appeal is also scheduled this month.

If Freddy, the Teddy Bear mascot and friends are shy about screen time, the sound department more than makes up for it. The score walks a playful tightrope between mischief

and menace, enriching scenes even when the visuals hesitate. Mechanical whirs, distorted laughter, and arcade hums conspire to create an atmosphere that often feels more unsettling than the scripted scares themselves.

Visually, the film is a marvel. The animatronics, crafted with painstaking detail, move with unnerving grace, and the expansive sets shimmer with creativity. Yet the beauty becomes bittersweet because these lovingly designed elements rarely get the spotlight they deserve. Sudden jump scares replace sustained dread, turning potential horror into fleeting shocks.

Overall, this film is an ambitious, visually impressive sequel that never quite harnesses its own power, yet it entertains just enough to keep viewers curious about what might come next. Fans of the franchise will appreciate the scale, craftsmanship, and expanding mythology, but those seeking a genuinely terrifying night at the movies may walk away craving something more intense.
