
The 'Romeo' helicopter will now destroy Pakistani and Chinese submarines at sea

New Delhi

It has now become easier for India to detect and neutralize Pakistani and Chinese submarines at sea, as the Navy commissioned the second squadron of MH-60R 'Romeo' helicopters at INS Hansa in Goa on Wednesday. The commissioning of INAS 335, in the presence of Navy Chief Admiral Dinesh K Tripathi, is part of the Indian Navy's continuous efforts to modernize and enhance its maritime capabilities. This will further strengthen India's maritime combat capabilities in the Indo-Pacific region. Navy Chief Admiral Tripathi commissioned the second squadron of the American MH-60R Seahawk multi-role helicopters at INS Hansa in Goa. This squadron will be known as INAS 335, while the first squadron, commissioned in March last year, was formally inducted into the air fleet as INAS 334. These advanced helicopters, part of the second 'Romeo' squadron, are capable of anti-submarine warfare, missile attacks, and surveillance. The multi-role American maritime helicopter MH-60R is designed for anti-submarine warfare, anti-surface warfare, search and rescue, and medical evacuation. According to the Ministry of Defence, the commissioning of the second squadron of MH-60R helicopters.

been misused as a weapon." The Finance Minister said in her address that India has never intended to use tariffs as a weapon. The Finance Minister said that today, the weaponization of trade is happening without any criticism, and some countries say that tariffs are not good and nobody should resort to them.

'Delhi-Mumbai e-way delayed by 3 more yrs'

NEW DELHI

The 1,350-km Delhi-Mumbai Expressway (DME), one of India's largest highway projects, is now likely to be fully completed by 2027-28, Union minister for road transport and highways Nitin Gadkari told the Rajya Sabha on Wednesday. The project was originally scheduled for completion in 2024.

Responding to another question on the status of projects awarded under Bharatmala Pariyojana (Phase I), Gadkari said the remaining projects were scheduled to be completed in a phased manner by 2028-29.

data on national highway construction during the current financial year. In the first six months of the fiscal, 3,468 km of national highways were constructed, compared to a full-year target of 10,000 km.

Parl passes insurance bill

Parliament on Wednesday passed a Bill to raise FDI in the insurance sector to 100 per cent from the current 74 per cent, which is expected to increase insurance penetration, lower premiums, and boost job creation. The Sabka Bima Sabki Raksha (Amendment of Insurance Laws) Bill, 2025, was cleared by the Rajya Sabha with a voice vote, a day after it was passed by the Lok Sabha. The House also rejected several amendments made by the Opposition to the Bill, including the one to send the legislation to a parliamentary panel for further scrutiny.

Nod to bill on 71 archaic laws

Parliament on Wednesday passed a Bill seeking to repeal or amend 71 obsolete and outdated laws with a view to enhancing ease of living for citizens. Piloting the Repealing and Amending Bill, 2025, in the Rajya Sabha, Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal said it aimed at removing outdated laws, correcting errors that had crept in during the law-making process and removing discriminatory aspects of certain laws. The Bill was passed by voice vote in the Rajya Sabha. It had been approved by the Lok Sabha on Tuesday.

PM, Shah must resign: Cong

The Congress on Wednesday demanded Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah's resignation after a Delhi court refused to take cognisance of the ED's money laundering charge against Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi in the National Herald case.

The opposition party also vowed to expose the "vendetta politics" against its leadership, asserting that the Congress cadre is agitated and is going to show its strength against the "misuse of agencies."

"We will keep fighting them both inside and outside Parliament and teach them a lesson," party president Mallikarjun Kharge said at a press conference.

In a relief to Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi and five others,

a Delhi court on Tuesday refused to take cognisance of the Enforcement Directorate's money laundering charge against them in the National Herald case, holding that the agency's probe stemmed from a private complaint and not an FIR.

Meanwhile, the Haryana Congress workers staged a

protest against what they alleged "political malafide intent of the BJP-led Central government" at Panchkula, near here, on Wednesday.

Party state president Rao Narendra Singh and leader of Opposition Bhupinder Singh Hooda held that the verdict exposed the BJP's political malafide intent.

Gurugram Police Arrests BJP Leader from Kaushambi for Posting False Information About a Womans Murder on X

Kaushambi: A BJP leader from the Charwa police station area of the district has been arrested by the Gurugram, Haryana police for posting false information about a woman's murder on X (formerly Twitter). The police had initially warned the BJP leader and asked him to remove the fake and false post, but the BJP leader did not comply, after which the Gurugram police from Haryana arrested him from Kaushambi and presented him before the court after completing the necessary paperwork. The incident took place a week ago on December 9, when a BJP



leader from Kaushambi district posted on the social media platform X about the gang rape and murder of a woman. The incident was claimed to have taken place in Gurugram, Haryana. The Gurugram police investigated the matter and found the post to be false. The Cyber Police Station West registered a case against the accused. It was stated that this post was intended

arrested the accused on Tuesday. Gurugram police identified the accused as Hariom Mishra alias Shaurya Mishra, a resident of the Charwa police station area in Kaushambi district, Uttar Pradesh. The accused is reportedly the district vice-president of the BJP Yuva Morcha (BJP Youth Wing). Police officials said that on December 11, they received information about this post being circulated on Shaurya Mishra's X media handle. Upon investigation, the matter was found to be false. The Cyber Police Station West registered a case against the accused. It was stated that this post was intended to disrupt social and religious harmony. Police officials said that the accused, 25-year-old Hariom Mishra, holds an LLB degree. He is a resident of Charwa village. During questioning, he stated that he saw a similar post while using social media. He copied it and posted it from his X account. Even knowing that the post was objectionable and would hurt social and religious sentiments, he still shared it on social media. During the investigation, the accused was contacted by phone and warned about this. Despite this, he did not remove the objectionable post, after which he was arrested.



Together, these beliefs have created a culture

Our collective disconnect from public cleanliness, even as the country spends massive resources on cleanup efforts, underscores the gap between our pride in 'Swachh Bharat' and our behaviour in public spaces. Globally, cultures like Japan's have woven cleanliness into their social fabric through spiritual and cultural practices. For instance, Japanese fans at the 2022 FIFA World Cup in Qatar gained worldwide admiration for cleaning the stadium after they won the World Cup. This wasn't a publicity stunt but a practice embedded in Japanese customs through the teachings of Shintoism and Buddhism, which view cleanliness as both a spiritual duty and a social obligation. Buddhist teachings, with their emphasis on purity and respect for the natural world, view cleanliness as essential to honouring the 'spirit', believed to inhabit every aspect of nature. Meanwhile, Zen Buddhism teaches mindful cleaning as an act of humility and self-discipline. Together, these beliefs have created a culture where maintaining cleanliness is as much an act of respect as it is of personal discipline. In India, we already practice similar values within the sanctuaries of our religious spaces. Gurudwaras around the world are exemplary in their commitment to cleanliness as a form of service, humility, and communal respect. Inside a gurudwara, volunteers of all backgrounds and ages perform 'sewa', including tasks such as washing used plates in the langar (community kitchen), cleaning the floors, and even cleaning the shoes of visitors. This devotion to cleanliness extends to the practice of washing hands and feet before entering the main prayer hall, ensuring both physical and spiritual purity. The ethos of cleanliness at religious places demonstrates that when society connects cleanliness with values of service, humility, and respect, it becomes a powerful practice. The care and respect people show in these spaces reflect values that can and should transcend religious contexts. The reverence with which people approach cleanliness in gurudwaras, where they freely clean for others as a form of humility and selfless service, could also extend to broader public spaces. By bringing these values from religious spaces into daily life, society can foster a shared sense of responsibility and pride in maintaining public cleanliness. In Japan, the commitment to cleanliness is nurtured from a young age, embedded in the education system itself. In Japanese schools, 'osouji' or cleaning time, is a daily activity where students, alongside their teachers, clean their classrooms, hallways, and even toilets. This practice, seen as integral to a student's development, teaches responsibility, respect for shared spaces, and the value of hard work. Unlike in many parts of the world where cleaning is seen as menial labour, in Japan, it is a way to build character and instill pride in maintaining a clean environment. Through 'osouji', students learn to respect others and being mindful of one's surroundings. By actively participating in cleaning from an early age, they understand that keeping spaces clean is everyone's duty, not just the responsibility of janitorial staff. This daily practice has led to a culture where respecting public spaces becomes second nature, as children grow up viewing cleanliness as part of their civic duty and self-respect. If India's education system were to adopt similar practices, we could see a generation raised to treat public spaces with the same reverence as private ones, paving the way for a culture that supports the Swachh Bharat mission at every level. For this cultural shift to happen, it's essential to begin with education. If we want to raise future generations who respect their surroundings, the journey must start in schools. By placing a broom in each child's hand, schools can cultivate an understanding.



Why India Needs Public-Private Partnerships In Healthcare

FDCs at private healthcare facilities, and patient counselling. However, the PPSA faces challenges in coordination, data management, patient tracking, resistance from private providers, and low uptake of FDCs. Recently, a collaboration between the PPSA and a for-profit organisation showed promise. These companies provide services such as drug delivery, sample collection, patient counselling, and online consultations. For instance, a pilot project, assessed by the Indian School of Business's Max Institute of Healthcare Management, explored the impact of this collaboration on FDC uptake

in Surat and Ahmedabad, Gujarat. Under the pilot, PPSA services remained intact, while the for-profit partner delivered FDCs directly to patients' homes. Patients uploaded their prescriptions online and received monthly refills, along with reminder calls. The results were encouraging: patients reported a preference for the convenience and privacy of home delivery, leading to a significant rise in FDC uptake. The willingness of private providers to share e-prescriptions reduced the need for monthly travel to clinics, ensuring continuous medication use. According to a report by the Indian School

of Business, the percentage of patients prescribed FDCs by private providers increased from 42.46 percent to 55.89 percent during the pilot. Public health workers employed by the PPSA played a critical role in educating patients, ensuring medication adherence, reducing stigma, and coordinating care. This example highlights the importance of generating more evidence on the impact of existing private sector engagement models, while also exploring novel approaches to healthcare delivery. As India undergoes an epidemiological shift from acute, communicable diseases to NCDs and chronic

conditions, new models for private sector engagement are essential. These models should focus on population health management, care continuity, and value-based approaches to healthcare financing and delivery. Moreover, technological advancements in artificial intelligence and data science can enhance the effectiveness and reach of these partnerships.

As of today, India's healthcare system stands at a crossroads; by fostering collaboration between the public and private sectors, it can build a more robust, responsive system that benefits both patients and providers.

Jammu and Kashmir - A period of transformational change, depending on who is asked



People stood in long queues to cast their vote in an Assembly election in Jammu and Kashmir after a gap of ten long years. PM Modi called it Naya Kashmir as he aimed his dart at the 'teen khandaan', the three dynasties—Congress, JKNC and PDP. It's been a long ten years in the Valley. There have been other decades marked by turbulence. But none like the past decade—a period of transformational change, depending on who is asked. The ten years carry a lot of weight and significance. On 18 September, Kashmiris, for the first time, voted not for a state but a Union Territory. The region's status changed in 2019, following the abrogation of Article 370 by the Modi government. Many other firsts are also taking place during these keenly watched elections: Established political parties being pitched against several Independent candidates, who are backed by organisations like the banned Jamaat-e-Islami; the entry of Engineer Abdul Rashid; and the absence of stalwarts such as Mehbooba Mufti. It led to the political landscape of Jammu and Kashmir becoming fiercely competitive, which is why the Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir is ThePrint's Newsmaker Of The Week. The main parties in the fray are the INDIA bloc's National Conference (NC) and Congress, the People's Democratic Party (PDP) and the Bharatiya

Janata Party (BJP). During the last election BJP and PDP had entered into an alliance. This election also has the second-highest number of Independent candidates since 2008. These elections carry a lot of political weight for the BJP, even beyond the region. The Modi government has been showcasing the abrogation of Article 370 as one of its key achievements. After the recent delimitation exercise, Kashmir has 47 seats and Jammu has 43. Twenty-four Assembly seats in seven districts went to polls on Wednesday. Delimitation led to an increase in seats in Hindu-dominated Jammu and nine seats being reserved for the Scheduled Tribe community, the BJP is

hoping to be a formidable force in Jammu even as it continues to face several challenges in the region. When it comes to the Kashmir valley, BJP has very little influence. For the National Conference too, these elections carry a lot of importance. Former CM of Kashmir and chairperson of NC, Omar Abdullah, lost to Engineer Rashid during the Lok Sabha elections. After making several statements about not contesting elections unless statehood is restored to J&K, he has decided to take the plunge. BJP has also brought up statehood multiple times. On 7 March this year, while launching an 'Integrated Development of Hazratbal Shrine' in Jammu and Kashmir, Prime Minister

Narendra Modi made a strong emotional pitch to the people of J&K. He guaranteed to his "family in J&K" that "under no circumstances would development grind to a halt" in the UT. Modi continued the same rhetoric on Thursday at the rally in support of BJP candidates in Srinagar's Sher-e-Kashmir Stadium. He spoke about BJP's promise to restore Jammu and Kashmir's statehood, empowerment and development. The withdrawal of Article 370 and statehood have emerged as major issues in these elections. Employment is also another significant concern. Quite naturally, the people in the region are divided regarding Article 370. There is deep dissatisfaction in some cir-

cles regarding its abrogation.

And as candidates canvas the region, a sense of fear lingers in the air. Dressed in a beige suit with a floral print and an off-white dupatta around her head, 36-year-old PDP leader Iltiqa Mufti waves to a group of women in a small village in Anantnag. An old woman holds her hands and tells her she wants to whisper something in her ears—her family member is languishing in jail due to a UAPA charge. Most political parties have promised to look into the issue of 'innocent Kashmiris' imprisoned under UAPA and PSA. This air of dissatisfaction has played a significant role in connecting people with the election process. There was a 61.38 per cent turnout of voters in Jammu and Kashmir for the first phase of polling. It overtook the record-breaking turnout for the Lok Sabha elections this year, which was 58.46 per cent. The fact that scores of people are coming out to vote shows how voting itself has become an act of resistance and solidarity. This is in contrast to the last 30 to 40 years. Earlier, such discontent was used to support separatism and extremism, which led to appeals, threats and warnings to boycott the elections. But this time the long queues of voters did not allow that to. But the most important feature of these elections is that they have been quite peaceful.

Are flight bomb threats pranks or conspiracy? Cost of 'hoax' to Indian aviation is real

Indian aviation is going through serious turbulence. In about two weeks, more than 510 domestic and international flights have been hit by hoax bomb threats, causing delays, emergency landings, soaring costs for airlines, and panic in the skies. Indian carriers such as Air India, IndiGo, SpiceJet, and Vistara have taken the brunt, with a peak when over 100 flights were targeted. That's why these hoax threats on flights are Newsmaker of the Week. Since the threats started in mid-October, the government and law enforcement agencies have been working urgently to identify the perpetrators and to stop further incidents. Despite various leads, a few arrests, and suspicions of Sikh radicals being involved, they have yet to find conclusive answers. In the meantime, airlines are following strict protocols to handle such threats. An airline source said that when a bomb threat is reported, it is immediately relayed to designated security agencies as well as the air-

line's security team. Following protocol, the aircraft in question is directed to an isolation bay, where security officials take over. "Passengers and crew are evacuated, after which the aircraft undergoes a thorough inspection by their (security agency) teams. These checks are conducted on the aircraft, luggage, and cargo to ensure complete safety," the source added. Just days after the threats started, central intelligence agencies traced some of them to IP addresses in London and Germany. A few arrests have been made, too. On 16 October, Mumbai Police detained a 17-year-old school dropout from Chhattisgarh who allegedly issued threats to four flights on 14 October to frame a friend over a money dispute. Last week, a 25-year-old unemployed man from Delhi was also arrested for making similar threats. Delhi Police officials claimed the man admitted to making the threats just to draw attention to himself.

Film stars get a headstart like no other when it comes to public

The event attracted nearly three lakh supporters as well as eyeballs—if the large number of TV viewers are considered—and Vijay made it clear he has his eyes set on the 2026 assembly elections. Laying down the contours of his party's political values, he invoked the likes of Periyar, Ambedkar, Kamaraj, Anjalai Ammal, and Velu Nachiar. He implied that the BJP is his ideological enemy and the DMK, his political adversary. But he tied himself in knots by idolising Periyar, arguably the greatest iconoclast ever in terms of smashing and disfiguring Hindu gods, and in the same breath, swearing by respect for all religions and castes. Be that as it may. Film stars get a headstart like no other when it comes to public engagement. Directors allow them the latitude to tailor scripts, accommodating one-liners intended to hint at their views on the ruling dispensation, even if some of these lines are inane or incoherent. A doctor or lawyer, for example, may be equally successful.

Yet, he doesn't have the kind of mass reach and appeal that an actor enjoys. Indeed, cinema pans out to a very large audience. Karl Marx said religion is the opium of the masses. What he said has over the years come to be extended to cinema and cricket in the Indian context. But then, despite the head start and natural advantage over other wannabes, not all film stars are successful in the rough and tumble of politics. If MGR, and Jayalalithaa who inherited his mantle, were successful, Vijay Kant, Kamal Hassan and Rajnikant either turned out to be damp squibs or got cold reception from the masses in the political arena. Which testifies to the fact that politics is a different ball game. Regional parties in India have had a chequered history and record. Only the Trinamool Congress, founded by

the firebrand as a breakaway faction of the Congress party, has enjoyed unalloyed success in West Bengal. Mamata Banerjee hasn't allowed any other regional party to spring up, much less take roots in West Bengal in the last more than 15 years. In Bihar, the two major regional parties, the JDU and RJD, take turns to rule and sometimes join hands to rule. In Maharashtra, which is going to polls soon, there were two principal regional parties, the NCP and Shiv Sena. Both of them have split amoeba-like, through a process called binary fission, to spawn two more political parties claiming to be the original with the parent being the clone. The point is that having more than one regional political party leads to them fighting each other, thereby yielding space to the mainstream political party. In Tamil Nadu, the DMK and its breakaway group the AIADMK have been ruling the state for more than half a century now.

It is a unique state in that where the Dravidian movement, at loggerheads with the mainstream Hindu worldview, still holds sway over the masses. Rajinikanth, perhaps, saw the writing on the wall and quietly wriggled out of his commitment to enter politics at the appropriate time. Vijay is much younger and maybe made of sterner stuff. He might not adhere to the adage that if you can't beat them, join them. Time alone will tell. The upcoming 2026 Tamil Nadu assembly elections would see two stormy petrels, Annamalai of the BJP and Vijay, trying to rock the deep-rooted Dravidian parties. To BJP's credit, it has a distinct economic and social vision for the nation for good or bad, which while making a favourable impact in other parts of the country, falls flat in Tamil Nadu. Vijay is an unknown quantity.



Govt puts administration on high alert to prevent cold related deaths

LUCKNOW

With severe cold and dense fog tightening their grip over Uttar Pradesh, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has placed the state administration on high alert, directing officials to ensure that no person is forced to spend the night in the open. Chairing a video conference with divisional commissioners, district magistrates, police chiefs and urban local body officials, the Chief Minister ordered round-the-clock monitoring of relief arrangements during the cold wave.

The Chief Minister said that homeless people, the elderly, children and those suffering from illness are the most vulnerable during extreme winter conditions. He instructed that night shelters must be fully functional and equipped with essential facilities, including warm blankets, heaters, hot water, food and

basic medical care. Regular inspections of night shelters were made mandatory, with a clear warning that negligence at any level would invite strict action.

Emphasising field-level responsibility, the Chief Minister directed officers to conduct night patrols and personally verify arrangements on the ground. Bonfires must be arranged at public places such as bus stands, railway stations, markets, crossings and other crowded locations. Adequate supply of firewood should be ensured so that bonfires continue throughout the night, he said.

Cold wave disrupts life across state

Dense fog has engulfed more than 50 districts of Uttar Pradesh, severely reducing visibility and disrupting normal life. Several road accidents have been reported due to near-zero visibility, resulting in multiple casualties over the past few days. Air traffic has also been affected, with several flights cancelled or diverted, while more than 50 trains are running behind schedule. The meteorological department has warned that cold conditions may intensify further, although stronger winds could gradually reduce fog density in the coming days

lage-level teams to distribute blankets continuously among the needy and to promptly shift people found sleeping in the open to nearby shelters. He stressed that officials should not remain confined to offices but actively monitor implementation in the field to ensure relief measures are effective. Special instructions were issued regarding the protection of cattle during the cold wave. The Chief Minister said that cow shelters across the state must have proper arrangements such as straw bedding, covered sheds and

bonfires to protect cattle from extreme cold. Regular inspections of cow shelters were also ordered.

Referring to the sharp fall in temperatures and persistent fog in several districts, the Chief Minister noted that the weather department has warned of further intensification of cold conditions in the coming days. District magistrates have been directed to send daily status reports to the Chief Secretary and the Chief Minister's Office to ensure close monitoring of the situation.

Citing security, court moves Rahul Gandhi citizenship case to Lucknow

The Lucknow bench of the Allahabad High Court on Wednesday ordered the transfer of a criminal case against Congress leader Rahul Gandhi from a special court in Rae Bareli to a special court in Lucknow. The order was passed by a single-judge bench of Justice Brijraj Singh on a transfer petition filed by the complainant in the case, BJP worker S. Vignesh Shishir.

The case pertains to a criminal complaint filed by Shishir, questioning Rahul Gandhi's alleged British citizenship. The proceedings were ongoing in the special court (MP/MLA) in Rae Bareli. In his petition to the High Court, Shishir sought the transfer on grounds of security concerns and a per-

Accepting the petitioner's plea, the court directed that the case be transferred to a

This development comes amid ongoing allegations and counter-allegations regarding Rahul Gandhi's citizenship status, with Shishir claiming to have documents and emails from the British government supporting his claims.



President Donald Trump has expanded a US travel ban, barring nationals of five additional countries and people travelling on Palestinian Authority-issued documents from entering the United States. The decision took the total tally to 20.

The White House said on Tuesday the restrictions were intended "to protect the security of the US" and will come into force on January 1.

Full-entry restrictions will be imposed on people from Burkina Faso, Mali, Niger, South Sudan and Syria as well as Palestinian Authority passport holders.

The administration also moved Laos and Sierra Leone, which were previously subject




Gill sustains toe injury, likely to miss last tie

LUCKNOW

Out-of-form India vice-captain Shubman Gill has been ruled out of the last T20I game against South Africa with a toe injury, sources close to the team told PTI.

It is learnt that Gill has sustained the injury during training session and all precautionary measures are being taken to ensure his speedy recovery.

"Shubman had an extended batting session at the nets on the eve of the fourth T20 International. Towards the end of the session, he was hit on the toe while batting in the nets. He was in pain and was hobbling. It would have been difficult for him to play on Wednesday. Hence he didn't accompany the team as there was little chance of him playing this game.

"At this point it is difficult to say if he will play in Ahmedabad," a BCCI source told PTI on condi-

tions of anonymity.

With New Zealand T20Is being the last series before the T20 World Cup and the squad for that bilateral series and the marquee event set to be the same, the national selection committee as well as team management will like to take all necessary precautions with regards to one of their specialist top order batters.

Gill also missed the Test and ODI series against the Proteas due to a neck injury sustained on the second day of the opening game in Kolkata which required two-day hospitalization. He missed the Guwahati Test and the following ODI series where he was supposed to captain the team.

He was declared fit by the Centre of Excellence (COE) ahead of the T20I series even as critics have been questioning his place in the side ahead of Sanju Samson, who had hit three centuries in the preceding season.

Gill's returns for the

series has been low with 4 and 0 in the first two outings followed by a run-a-ball 28 in the third game in Dharamsala, where he didn't look in his elements.

However the entire coaching staff headlined by Gautam Gambhir has firmly backed their star batter to come good at the T20 World Cup starting February, next year.

Gill needs to improve on tackling straight deliveries: Bangar


Gill's vulnerability against straight deliveries has emerged as an area of concern and the India opener needs to improve his footwork to counter the issue, former batting coach Sanjay Bangar said.

Gill has managed 291 runs in 15 innings at a strike rate of 137.3, and Bangar pointed out that the opener's scoring rate drops against deliveries pitched on a straight line.

"In the beginning, his footwork was very positive. But if you remove three or four boundaries over 28 games, the issue has been on straight lines. Against straight deliveries, his strike rate has fallen quite low," Bangar said, urging the young opener to improve his footwork to counter this weakness," Bangar said on Game Plan on JioStar.

"Outside the off stump, his strike rate is good, but there have been a few edges as well. Overall, he has scored runs, but straight-line play is something he will want to improve.

"In the second (T20) game (against SA), the ball that got him out was a very good delivery. It could have dismissed any batter. His footwork has improved, and if he continues to play with clear footwork, he will be able to hit the same shots consistently, like the three or four boundaries we've seen."

FIFA slashes price of some WC tickets to USD 60

GENEVA

FIFA slashed the price of some World Cup tickets for teams' most loyal fans following a global backlash and some will get \$60 seats for the final instead of being asked to pay \$4,185.

It was a rare climbdown by the soccer body and its president Gianni Infantino after soaking up waves of criticism for World Cup strategies, including top-dollar prices and closer political alignment with U.S. President Donald Trump.

FIFA said Tuesday that \$60 tickets will be made available for every game at the tournament in North America, going to the national federations whose teams are playing. Those federations decide how to distribute them to loyal fans who have attended previous games at home and on the road.

The number of \$60 tickets for each game is likely to be from 400 to 750 per team, in what FIFA is now calling a "Supporter Entry Tier" price category.

Paceman Joffra Archer (3-29) took three big wickets, including two in three balls immediately after lunch, and spinner Will Jacks (2-105) dismissed Australia's two leading scorers to give England a slight edge Wednesday in conditions that were ideal for batting.

Carey shared partnerships of 91 with Khawaja, who replaced Steve Smith at late notice, 59 with Josh Inglis, 26 with Pat Cummins and 50 with Mitchell Starc to keep Australia's innings moving at around four runs an over. He was out just before stumps for 106, mistiming a slower ball from Jacks.

Mitchell Starc, voted player of the match in the first and second tests, continued his impressive form against England and was unbeaten on 33 at stumps.

The temperature topped 35 Celsius (95 Fahrenheit) on Wednesday and is forecast to get close to 40C (104F) on Day
