Cricketer dons Palestinian flag on helmet

The Jammu and Kashmir Police on Friday ordered a preliminary enquiry after a cricketer from south Kashmir wore a helmet with the Palestinian flag during a private cricket tournament match in Jammu, a police spokesperson said. A video and photos of the cricketer, Furqan Ul Haq, were circulated online after he was seen displaying the flag on his helmet during the Jammu and Kashmir Champions League here on Thursday. "Yesterday, a video circulating on social media showed a cricket player, Furqan Ul Haq, resident of Tangipura, Puvwama, playing cricket at KC Door in Muthi, while displaying a Palestine logo on his helmet," the spokesperson said.

CM's copter: Media protest on January 4

Members of journalists fraternity on Friday announced a protest in Sector 17 Chandigarh, here on January 4 after the cyber cell of the Ludhiana police booked 10 persons including some YouTubers and an RTI activist for allegedly spreading "rumours and misleading information" about the alleged "misuse of the chief minister Bhagwant Mann's helicopter during his foreign tour last month. The said announcement was made after a meeting of journalists held by Bathinda Press Club on Thursday.

and people affected. Instead, it stated that verification was ongoing and that detailed figures would be submitted separately by the state government — an omission that drew sharp reaction from the court.

Advocate Rishi Anand, appearing for intervenor Varun Gaikwad, told the bench it was "shocking" that the government continued to officially acknowledge only four deaths when newspapers, on the very day the petition was filed, had reported 11 confirmed fatalities with photographs of victims. Persisting with a lower figure, he argued, appeared to be a deliberate attempt to minimise the scale of the tragedy and raised serious questions about the credibility of official data.

The High Court also declined to entertain a plea by another intervenor seeking restrictions on media reporting to prevent public panic, signalling that transparency, not suppression, was essential in a public health emergency of this magnitude.

Parallel to judicial scrutiny, the National Human Rights Commission has taken suo motu cognisance of the incident and sought a detailed report from the state's Chief Secretary within two weeks, underlining the gravity of the situation.

The legal proceedings have transformed the Indore water crisis from a civic failure into an institutional reckoning, with courts and rights bodies demanding clarity on accountability, transparency and the true human cost of contaminated drinking water. As the next hearing approaches, the central question remains unresolved: how many lives were lost before the system acknowledged the disaster — and why did it take judicial intervention to seek the truth?

Cabinet secy says no plans to change land acquisition policy

NEW DELHI

With land acquisition emerging as one of the biggest impediments in the timely execution of infrastructure projects in the country, Cabinet Secretary TV Somanathan said the government has no plans to change its policy for acquiring land.

He said that in the over 3,300 projects worth Rs 85 lakh crore that were taken up during review meetings of the Pro-Active Governance and Timely Implementation

(PRAGATI), chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, 7,735 issues were raised, and 7,156 of them were resolved.

PRAGATI is a review mechanism to expedite projects that have been delayed for various reasons. Regular issues are resolved at the ministry level, while complex and critical issues are escalated for review by it.

Somanathan said PRAGATI has a multi-tier follow-up mechanism that ensures the timely implementation of decisions.

Confirming that a case has been registered, Kangra Superintendent of Police (SP) Ashok Ratan said that all the allegations are being thoroughly investigated. Medical records, video evidence and statements of all concerned are being examined, he said.

War over Kashmir can erupt anytime: J&K's top clergyman

After Mirwaiz Umar Farooq was forced to remove Hurriyat faction chairman tag from his X-handle, the Kashmir's top clergyman Mirwaiz Umar on Friday warned of war erupting in Kashmir "despite unilateral changes in 2019".

In his tweet via his X-handle, Mirwaiz said, "The reality is that the Kashmir conflict continues to keep the region in an unsettled state that can erupt anytime. That is why wars are paused, not ended, and dia-

logue finds no takers. The year-end witnessed another tragedy — the massive blast and loss of life in New Delhi."

"Yet beyond these incidents, in which Kashmiris find themselves at the receiving end of suspicion and attacks in parts of India, not much has changed for them. The trust deficit between them and New Delhi has widened, not shrunk. Enforced silence is projected as acquiescence. Wounds remain open, problems unaddressed, and an elected government of a UT complains of being powerless.

A sense of hopelessness prevails, along with an existential crisis of losing one's identity through demographic change since the state was downgraded to a Union Territory, constitutional guarantees withdrawn, and rules and laws tweaked," Mirwaiz Umar

added.

He recalled that bygone year witnessed the banning of the Awami Action Committee — a socio-political institution that reached out to people in need, advocating peace, dialogue and resolution — along with Ittihadul Muslimeen, which were part of the Hurriyat Conference. Much of that space has now been extinguished. "Today we are operating in an environment where any expression of views contrary to the state, or any disagreement, is increasingly criminalised, branded as 'anti-

national'" and penalised," he observed.

"No public space is available to us, and mediums of communication, including most local media, are not ready to provide any space for voicing expressions of people's demands or views. I do not have the privilege of addressing press conferences. I cannot move without getting official clearance, and people cannot meet me without seeking permission. My access to the pulpit of Jama Masjid — the spiritual heart of Kashmir — is also curtailed. Even last Friday, I

was placed under house arrest, and again this Friday too. In

fact, last year I was under house arrest for fourteen Fridays. Arbitrary house arrests have become a recurring feature in my life. All this is deeply suffocating — not only for me, but for an entire society that increasingly feels voiceless. So when pressed to make changes to my social media profile — as Hurriyat constituents are banned under UAPA, displaying the title would be considered illegal and the platforms barred to me," he said.

He eyewitnesses said the boy remained on the track for around 30 seconds as nearly 40 wagons of the freight train passed over him. Once the train crossed, he stood up and ran away. The shocking scene left people present at the spot speechless, as the boy emerged completely unharmed. Those who witnessed the

incident later caught hold of the boy and thrashed him for risking his life. Overwhelmed, the child broke down and hugged the people who had beaten him. A video of the incident has also surfaced and is being widely shared.

Piyush is the son of Rajkumar Kesari, rickshaw puller who lives in Ward Number 9 of Azad Nagar in Sivadraja town. Locals said the

Wednesday in Sivadraja town under the Sivadraja police station area. The boy, identified as Piyush Kesari, had gone kite flying with his friends near a railway crossing close to the Dedicated Freight Corridor down line, a short distance from Sivadraja railway station.

According to eyewitnesses, Piyush ran towards the track while trying to catch a kite. As he reached the railway line, one

of his legs got stuck in the track. At the same time, a fast-moving freight train approached. Panicking on seeing the train extremely close, the boy lay down between the tracks, face

down, in an attempt to save his life.

Those who witnessed the

incident highlights the serious risks posed by children playing near railway tracks during kite flying.

Following the incident, residents demanded increased monitoring near railway crossings and tracks. They also urged the administration to raise awareness among children and parents to prevent such life-threatening incidents in the future.

A 10-year-old boy in Uttar Pradesh's Chandauli district narrowly escaped death after lying flat on a railway track as a high-speed freight train passed over him. Remarkably, the boy did not suffer even a scratch, leaving onlookers stunned and many calling it a miracle. The incident took place on

GRP Arrests Liquor Smuggler at Station

The Government Railway Police (GRP) arrested a liquor smuggler at Kanpur Railway Station during a checking drive on Platform 1. The accused, identified as Adil, was caught with illegal liquor worth approximately ₹10,000. Station House Officer GRP Om Narayan Singh and sub-inspectors led the operation. Legal proceedings are underway against the accused.

Protests Over Killings of Hindus in Bangladesh

Farmer Dies of Cold While Irrigating Field

A 35-year-old farmer, Anjani Chauhan, died from extreme cold while irrigating his wheat field in Keertupur village, Bansdih. He collapsed in the field due to the severe cold wave. Family members took him to Bansdih PHC, where doctors declared him dead. Police have sent the body for postmortem. A student union coordinator informed the authorities.

DRM Inspects Station Ahead of Magh Mela

In preparation for the Magh Mela-2026, DRM Uday Singh Meena of the DDU Junction conducted a surprise inspection of passenger facilities. He reviewed holding areas, ticket counters, waiting halls, foot overbridges, sanitation, lighting, and security arrangements. Additional measures like mobile UTS counters and the RailOne app will be deployed for crowd management and passenger convenience.

WEATHER HAVOC | Cold wave intensifies as mercury drops, dense fog alert expected in 34 Districts

Cold wave returns to UP

LUCKNOW

Weather conditions across Uttar Pradesh have taken a sharp turn, with biting cold returning after the weakening of a western disturbance. The resurgence of cold northwesterly winds has led to a significant drop in both day and night temperatures, intensifying cold conditions across large parts of the state.

According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), strong cold winds blowing at speeds of 10-15 km per hour, combined with persistent fog, have increased the chill factor even in areas that briefly received sunlight. Residents across urban and rural regions reported severe cold throughout the day on Friday, with reduced visibility affecting early morning movement.

The weather department has issued an orange alert for dense fog in 34 districts, particularly across eastern, southern, and Terai regions of the

state. In addition, a cold day warning has been issued for eight districts, including the state capital Lucknow, where daytime temperatures are expected to remain unusually low. IMD officials stated that temperatures across Uttar Pradesh are likely to decline further over the next three days. Both maximum and minimum temperatures may fall by 3 to 4 degrees Celsius, as cold winds from the Himalayan region continue to dominate weather patterns.

On Friday, Barabanki and Hardoi recorded the lowest

minimum temperature, dropping to around 6 degrees Celsius, making them the coldest locations in the state. Meanwhile, Bareilly reported the coldest daytime temperature at 13.3 degrees Celsius, reflecting the severity of the cold wave.

Dense fog reduced visibility

Schools closed till 5th January, Many accidents reported

Severe cold wave and dense fog have paralyzed Uttar Pradesh, prompting Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath to extend school closures for all boards up to Class 12 until January 5, 2026. The extreme weather has caused immense logistical disruptions, highlighted by an Air India flight from Delhi that had to circle Lucknow 17 times before diverting back due to zero visibility at the airport. Across the state, over 100 trains are significantly delayed and numerous flights have been cancelled, while tragic fatalities have been reported due to the hazardous conditions. In Etawah, a driver was burnt alive after his truck collided with another vehicle in thick fog, and in Firozabad, two men died of suffocation while sleeping in a generator room to escape the chill.

to near zero in several districts, including Kanpur, Agra, Gorakhpur, and Amethi, causing disruption to road and rail movement during early hours. Meteorological officials have advised commuters to exercise caution, especially during morning and late-night travel.

Senior meteorologist Dr. Atul Kumar Singh said that the weakening of the western disturbance has allowed cold winds to strengthen, leading to a steady fall in nighttime temperatures. He added that cold day conditions may persist in parts of central and eastern Uttar Pradesh if cloud cover and fog continue.

The IMD has urged district administrations to remain alert and take necessary precautions, particularly for vulnerable populations such as the elderly, children, and homeless residents, as cold conditions are expected to intensify further in the coming days.

CM's directive puts district officials on guard for winter relief

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Tuesday issued a series of directives to district administrations across Uttar Pradesh to intensify relief efforts in response to the severe cold wave gripping the state. The Chief Minister's instructions came alongside the decision to extend the closure of all schools up to Class 12 until January 5.

The CM specifically ordered officials to ensure that no individual is found sleeping in the open. He mandated surprise inspections of all government-run night shelters (rain baseras) to ensure the availability of adequate bedding, blankets, heaters, clean drinking water, electricity, and security. He emphasized that all basic facilities at these shelters must be fully functional.

Further, the district administrations have been

directed to organize the widespread distribution of blankets and the setting up of bonfires with priority given to the poor, destitute, and homeless. The Chief Minister warned of strict action against any officer found negligent in executing these winter relief measures, underscoring the administration's responsibility to protect citizens from the harsh weather.

STF probe leads to suspension of three ARTOs in bribery case

Transport Department initiates departmental inquiry, officers attached to headquarters

The Uttar Pradesh government has suspended three Assistant Regional Transport Officers (ARTOs) following allegations of accepting bribes to allow overloaded trucks to pass through multiple districts. The suspended officers include Rajiv Kumar Bansal (Lucknow), Pushpanjali Mitra (Fatehpur), and Ambuj (Raebareli). All three have been attached to the Transport Department headquarters, and a departmental inquiry has been initiated.

The action comes after the Special Task Force (STF) registered FIRs on November 12 in connection with an alleged bribery syndicate operating across several districts of

Bundelkhand, including Hamirpur and Mahoba. The FIRs were lodged in Madiaspur (Lucknow), Lalgarh (Raebareli), and Unnao, naming 25 individuals, including transport department officials, staff members, and

Earlier, on November 29, the Transport Commissioner had suspended three other officials, including a PTO and enforcement staff, in the same case. Additional enforcement supervisors, constables, and drivers from Lucknow, Unnao, and Raebareli have also been suspended.

Outrage over indecent act at historic Imambara

A viral video of a youth urinating in Lucknow's historic Imambara Bhulbhulaiya on January 1, 2026, has sparked severe outrage within the Shia community.

The Afham-e-Jama Society has petitioned the District Magistrate, demanding strict legal action and improved security measures to protect the religious sanctity of the site. Lucknow Commissioner Vijay Vishwas Panj has intensified the probe and directed the Lucknow Development Authority (LDA) to immediately submit all relevant records. Acting on government instructions issued on December 22, 2025, the commissioner has been asked to complete the investigation and submit an action-taken report.

₹1,400 cr irregularity case in monument construction



Vigilance case registered in 2014 sees renewed momentum after government directive

The investigation into the ₹1,400 crore memorial construction scam in Lucknow and other districts of Uttar Pradesh has gathered momentum after nearly 11 years. The case, registered by the Vigilance Department in 2014, pertains to large-scale financial irregularities in the construction of monuments and parks between 2007 and 2011.

Around 57 officials and employees from the LDA and the State Construction Corporation were earlier brought under the scanner.

The alleged scam involves procurement irregularities, particularly in stone purchases, for projects such as the Ambedkar Social Transformation Site, Kanshiram Memorial, Gautam

Buddha Park, and eco-garden developments in Lucknow and Noida.

Around 57 officials and employees from the LDA and the State Construction Corporation were earlier brought under the scanner. Direct action is now being prepared against the then Superintending Engineer Vimal Kumar Sonkar and then Chief Engineer Triloki Nath, both retired.

Police aspirants demand age relief in recruitment

Letters sent to CM after recruitment notification sparks discontent

The ongoing Uttar Pradesh Police constable recruitment has triggered political intervention after several NDA legislators and a state minister wrote to the Chief Minister demanding a three-year age relaxation for general category candidates. The demand follows the release of the recruitment notification for 32,679 constable posts, which fixed the age limit for general category applicants between 18 and 22 years.

State Minister Dr. Arun Kumar, Nishad Party MLA Anil Kumar Tripathi, and BJP MLA from Haidergarh Dinesh Rawat have formally urged the Chief Minister to grant age relaxation, citing earlier assurances.

UP's first sports university nears completion

MEERUT

Uttar Pradesh's first sports university, named after hockey legend Major Dhyan Chand, is under construction in Meerut's Salawa area and is expected to be fully completed by March 2026, according to university authorities. The project, launched in January 2022, has crossed nearly 77-78 percent completion, even as academic activities have already begun.

Despite the delay beyond the originally scheduled timeline, student admissions have taken place and classes are being conducted from temporary facilities. The university's administrative office is currently functioning from the Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel University of Agriculture and Technology in Modipuram, while practical sports training



is being carried out at the Kailash Prakash Stadium in Meerut. The sports university is being developed over 91.38 acres at an estimated cost of around ₹700 crore. So far, more than ₹97 crore has been released for construction. The permanent campus will include academic and administrative blocks, hostels for students, an auditorium, central library, guest house, and residential facilities for staff.

University officials said an Academic Council meeting scheduled for January 10 will decide on new courses for the 2026-27 academic session.

Shankh air to launch low cost domestic flights

Shankh Air, a new domestic carrier headed by Shrawan Kumar Vishwakarma, is scheduled to commence flight operations from Lucknow in March 2026. Having received a No Objection Certificate from the Ministry of Civil Aviation, the airline will initially connect ten cities, including Delhi, Mumbai, Varanasi, and Ahmedabad.

Distinguishing itself from competitors, Shankh Air claims it will reject dynamic pricing, meaning fares will remain stable during peak morning or evening hours and even during major festivals. The airline will utilize Airbus A320 aircraft, starting with three planes and targeting a fleet of twenty-five by 2027.

Sigra stadium set to host national volleyball championship

The Senior National Volleyball Championship will commence on January 4 at Sigra Stadium in Varanasi, with matches scheduled across four courts.

The eight-day tournament will see participation from 1,022 male and female players representing 73 teams from different states and regions of the country.

According to officials, preparations for the championship

have been completed at Dr. Sampurnanand Stadium, Sigra, where players, officials, and technical staff will be accommodated during the event.

Teams arriving in Varanasi will be housed in designated hotels and facilities arranged by the organizers to ensure smooth conduct of the competition.

Ahead of the tournament, selection trials for the national team were also held at Sigra Stadium.

BJP MLA Dr. Shyam Bihari Lal passes away

Dr. Shyam Bihari Lal, the BJP MLA representing the Faridpur constituency, passed away following a massive heart attack on Friday, January 2, 2026. The tragic incident occurred at the Bareilly Circuit House during an official meeting chaired by Livestock Minister Dharampal Singh.

According to reports, the MLA suddenly collapsed while the meeting was in progress. Colleagues and aides immediately rushed him to Medicity Hospital, but he could not be revived and breathed his last during treatment. Notably, Dr. Lal had celebrated his birthday just one day prior to his sudden demise. His passing has triggered a wave of mourning within the Bharatiya Janata Party and across the Bareilly region.

Dense fog has enveloped Prayagraj city for the past three days. The fog continued today, Friday. The cold winds and biting chill have disrupted daily life. On Thursday, there was a brief period of weak sunshine in the afternoon, but it was ineffective against the intense cold. Doctors advise people to only leave their homes if absolutely necessary. The maximum temperature recorded on Thursday was 20.4 degrees Celsius, while on Wednesday it was 16.2 degrees Celsius. This means that the maximum temperature increased by 4.2 degrees Celsius in 24 hours. Today, Friday, the



minimum temperature will remain between 11 and 12 degrees Celsius. The visibility in the morning was so poor that nothing was visible even at close range. The fog was so thick at Prayag Junction, Allahabad University, and the Civil Lines area that people couldn't see anything nearby. This is why the speed of vehicles has been reduced to

40 to 50 km/h due to the fog. At Prayag Junction, a passenger who arrived in the morning to catch the AJ Passenger train boarded a train going to Ayodhya. Later, when he realized it was the wrong train, he got off at Phaphamau station. The dense fog at the station made it difficult to see, and he mistakenly boarded the wrong train.

Indian students flouting cautionary advisories

To prevent violent attacks against Indian students and other Indians, the current Biden administration has provided security, both on and off campus, and in the community at large. But do some Indian students put themselves in harm's way by flouting cautionary advisories on dangerous areas? Four Indian students have been killed in two weeks according to a news report dated 2 February 2024. They were 19-year-old Shreyas Reddy Benigher from the Linder School of Business, Ohio, Neil Acharya of Purdue University, Vivek Saini from Panchkula in Haryana. The latest is Sameer Kamath, an Indian-American pursuing his doctorate in mechanical engineering at Purdue University again. In addition, Akul Dhawan was found dead of hypothermia outside the University of Illinois UIUC in Champaign. G Dinesh of Telangana and Nikesh of Andhra Pradesh were found gassed to death in their flat in Connecticut. Kuchipudi and Bharat Natyam dancer Amarnath Ghosh, age 34, was shot to death in St Louis Missouri. Paruchuri Abhijit of Boston University was found dead in his car, making up the ninth death so far in 2024. There is at least one death of an Indian every day across the US, says an American community leader Mohan Nannapaneni, founder of volunteer-based non-profit organisation TEAM Aid. These are mostly students and H-1B employees who have recently come to America. Are some Indian students lonely and feeling alienated far from home? Do some of them, unable to fit in socially or cope academically, persist in their studies there due to societal and parental pressures emanating from back in India? Though more often than not, Indian students who go to American universities are exceptionally bright and are there on earned scholarships. But are they mature and experienced enough in the Western cultural mores and milieu to avoid bullying and ridicule? Sometimes, there are underlying mental health issues even amongst gifted students which are activated by the pressures of academics and fitting in. Some die of physical illness and natural causes. Perhaps the lack of seeking timely medical attention in an alien medical system is to blame. Again, this is a phenomenon that affects foreign students even here in India, because many tend to neglect themselves in the absence of relatives to keep an eye on them. In January 2024, a young girl graduate student Jaahni Kandula was run over by a speeding policeman Officer Kevin Dave in a police car at a street intersection crosswalk in Seattle. To compound matters, the manslaughter caused by the police car being driven at 119 kmph was laughed off by another Seattle Police Officer Daniel Auderer, who said Kandula's life had 'limited value'. He dismissed the proposition that officer Dave was at fault and that a criminal investigation was necessary.

The Ministry of External Affairs in India has said a total of 403 Indian students have died abroad from various causes since 2018. The largest number of deaths occurred in Canada followed by

Britain. Several voices in India are being raised against the necessity of sending Indian students to study abroad. Perhaps the answer lies in sending them to better regulated and safer places such as Singapore where the spectre of racism is largely absent. It seems that most of the White world, including Australia and New Zealand, has a racist problem that their governments are struggling to quell. The lure of obtaining lucrative jobs in Europe and America by studying and graduating from their universities.

Attack on Gwadar: Crucial lessons for Pakistan

Striking Gwadar has immense geopolitical significance, as such attacks are designed to scare away whatever investment and economic activities are being carried out in the coastal city and also reveal the vulnerability of CPEC. Image Courtesy: AP. The attack on Gwadar's Port Authority Complex on March 20, 2024, is yet another reminder of the grim trajectory of militancy in Pakistan. Within days of a major terrorist attack in North Waziristan, in which seven Pakistan Army soldiers, including two officers, were killed, militants targeted a facility that houses government offices, including those of security agencies. On March 18, between the two

attacks, the Pakistan Air Force conducted strikes on multiple targets in Spera district of Khost Province and Barmal district of Paktika Province, in Afghanistan. The Pakistan Foreign Office had issued a press release stating that, in addition to the outlawed Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), commanders of the Hafiz Gul Bahadur Network (HGB) were also the "prime targets" of these airstrikes. The Majeed Brigade, affiliated with the banned Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA), claimed responsibility for the attack. The lethal Guerrilla Cell Majeed Brigade formed in 2011 is named after a guard of former Prime Minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto, who was killed while attempting to assassi-

nate the PPP founder. It is known for mostly targeting security forces and Chinese interests in Pakistan. A press release from Inter Services Public Relations said that a group of eight terrorists attempted to enter the Port Authority Colony but were successfully thwarted by security forces personnel. "Our troops employed for security responded immediately and effectively engaged the terrorists, and in ensuing fire exchange, all eight terrorists were sent to hell," said the statement. They also reported the deaths of two Pakistani soldiers in the attack while stating that the security forces in Pakistan 'remain determined to thwart attempts at sabotaging

peace and stability of Balochistan'. In yet another incident on March 21, two soldiers were killed after a suicide bomber struck military convoy on Tank Road in Dera Ismail Khan. It is reported that the attack also injured at least 22 personnel. These incidents reveal that, far from being neutralised, separatist militants remain a potent threat in Pakistan.

Previous Incidents

This is not the first time Gwadar and its environs have been targeted by insurgents. Here, separatism and geopolitics combine in a lethal cocktail as militants target Chinese interests in what is supposed to be the 'jewel in the CPEC crown'.

The demystification of MS



There are two kinds of people. One who likes salted caramel, the other, sugary sweet tarts; one who loves to hike, the other to lounge at a beach; one who loves cats, the other dogs. There are two kinds of people the world over, and then there is MS Dhoni. He studies the dialogues of an advert that he has to deliver, just as closely as he reads and decodes his opponents; he thrives under the spotlight of leading his side, just as much as he loves his almost reclusive solitude; he is reticent at most times in the public eye, as much as he taunts playfully and holds a room when surrounded by his people; he lets the whole world watch his every move on a cricket field, as much as he guards his innermost thoughts; who is cool and calm under the pressure of a last-ball finish, as much as he is enraged enough to storm onto the field when he had no business being there, to confront an umpire; who is extremely rigid about the seemingly banal things in life like the way he likes his dosa, or the juice he drinks, and yet is so carefree when it comes to the seemingly big things - like renouncing his captaincy.

I remember covering the series when Sourav Ganguly famously finished a press conference to say the words "Just one last thing, lads..." and dropped his retirement bomb. That sent a shock wave back then, but you expected the theatrics with dadi, as he is fondly called otherwise. That was the era of drama and one-upmanship. It was the need of

that hour, that time. And then of course, someone like MS came along. There were too many stark differences between the dadi era and the Dhoni era that followed, but we won't go into any of that. That is not at the heart of this narration. But there's a reason I bring up the dadi announcement, made at a time when social media was not the monster it is today. So I get the intent behind that and the manner in which it was made. Living in a time now when every movement of a public figure is somehow caught on camera and splashed across social media platforms, MS Dhoni's abstinence from the same, is remarkable. To understand this you somehow have to understand the man. And the only way you can truly get him, is if you interact with him face to face. There is no WhatsApp culture with MS (surprise, surprise). I worked

with the Chennai Super Kings franchise for close to five years. That is a long time when you look at career goals and what you want to do, because there has to be constant evaluation and recalibration. This obviously doesn't apply to the man who held on to the same position at CSK for 17 long years. I think I was lucky to be a part of a set up back then with all the senior hands in the system at their peak. Age was not on their side, but the vigour was sky-high because the franchise had just come out of a 2-year suspension. I guess to this day, if you ask anyone who walks down the corridors of Chepauk or the India Cements building, the 2018 season would be remembered as one of the best years for this group. A miracle season that only MS could have manifested. I'll circle back to this in just a bit. Chennai Super Kings, I realise

now, is the equivalent of Gryffindor of Harry Potter world - the House that every young wizard entering the Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry, desires to be a part of. It's the right of passage. And it sounds about correct doesn't it? CSK has witnessed a lot of wizardry over the years too. So I only have gratitude. Not because of getting an opportunity to work with CSK alone, though I am certain that is on everyone's bucket list. But because I got to spend time and get glimpses into what made MS, well MS. I just want to share what I believe makes MS think the way he does. I want to connect the dots so you get a picture - maybe not the complete one - but a semblance of it, to fathom just why the hero you grew up idolising, or who inspired you to take up the sport, or who made you the leader you are today, does what he does and in the way he does it in. We talk of MS making things happen on the field. We see him controlling and taking charge of the moments that somehow define the game and the end result. I think a lot of that comes from the way he thinks off the field too. Staying in control of the little things that eventually lead him to the big one. He resides in the small moments yes, but his sight is always on the bigger picture. Even the night after that 4th IPL title win, MS was already in the future. The squad had executed a fantastic turnaround from the horror season that 2020 was. That win in 2021 was a superb one, given the

Occasional protests were witnessed that were germane

Occasional protests were witnessed that were germane due to the death of long-time dissident leader Navalny in an Arctic jail, the arrest of some opposition leaders, and the disqualification of others. But the Russians are at war, which might be the key to understanding. Some might oppose it, as is natural, and would want a change in the leadership. But when the question of Russian nationalism and patriotism confronts them, they want a leader who can withstand the external pressures and win it for them. Russian history attests to that. The Russians have an uncanny ability to handle pain and adversity. This also explains Putin's wide margins of victory, apart from the fact that this has been a trend all

along with weak, not so popular, and credible opposition candidates or parties. The there-is-no-alternative (TINA) factor also operates in such a scenario. Regime change agendas of the West and continuous tirades against their strongest opponent add to his appeal. Ironically, the West is equally responsible for Putin's victory. Well, Russia says it has its own democratic governance model. Apart from the Russian pride and Putin redeeming their pride back after the greatest humiliation in the wake of the disintegration of the Soviet Union, the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war is being perceived, at a popular level, as the war by the West against Russia as the Grey Zone warfare and one-sided narratives predominate their respective global

How the US stance on India's CAA is misplaced, misinformed

When India took steps to implement the Citizenship

Amendment Act, not many countries took a deeper look at it. Not much opposition was visible among the Indian public. Why did the US State Department unconsciously react to it? Did such a knee-jerk reaction serve any American interest? Did it benefit any community that the US State Department perceived as a potential victim of CAA?

Without any doubt, such a reaction only supplements the growing areas of mistrust between India and the United States in recent times. It serves only one purpose. It helps create cracks in the painstakingly constructed strategic partnership between the two countries by successive administrations in Washington and New Delhi. American stand on the Indo-Canadian Nijjar episode, Washington's inaction over anti-India separatist groups targeting Hindu temples and Indian consulates in the US, India's neutrality over the US-Russian Cold War in Ukraine, its hesitation to be fully on board with the US in containing China, India's selective participation in the US-sponsored Indo-Pacific Economic Forum, New Delhi's strong position to defend the interests of the developing countries in WTO negotiations, and several other



factors have come in the way of realising the full potential of strategic partnership. American policymakers are aware of modern Indian history. The US reaction to CAA is perhaps not "misplaced, misinformed, and unwarranted". The expression of "concern" and desire to carefully "monitor" the implementation of the CAA by the US government are based on cautious calculation and strategic considerations. The Indian government officials have conveyed multiple times to their US counterparts the rationale behind the CAA, and the Ministry of Home Affairs has made it amply clear that the implementation of the CAA will not adversely affect the Muslim citizens of India. The American diplomats residing in India are also aware that CAA has been politicised to serve the interests of the opposition parties. The main reason the US State Department is reportedly "concerned" over a purely domestic issue in India is the American irritation over India's determination to maintain its strategic autonomy, notwithstanding its desire to sustain strategic companionship with Washington on selected issues. Despite about a quarter of a century of US efforts to make India a very close strategic partner that would support US positions on international affairs, Washington's ambition remains distant.

India has adopted a measured stand on the Ukraine War, has not abandoned its strategic relations with Russia, maintains its strategic partnership with Iran, and follows a foreign economic policy that suits India's interests the most. However, India, at the same time, has not done anything that would adversely affect the US. The US policy community needs to appreciate that India does not support the Russian war efforts in Ukraine, India does play an active role in addressing the unconventional warfare in the Red Sea, and though not part of US-led international efforts, India does support the idea of managing the aggressive role of China in the Indo-Pacific by being part of the Quadrilateral Security Initiative.

Kaushal Kishor, resident of Gram Dihua, Majra Akouna, Surtgaj block, Ramnagar tehsil, Mohammadpur Khala police station, Barabanki district stated in his petition that 12 trees on the bund near Madraha village, Hetmapur were illegally cut on 19 December

2025. According to the petition, the trees were cut secretly by Santaram, son of Ishwar Din, resident of Gram Madraha, Majra Akouna. The complaint says the felling was done without permission, directly damaging government property. (No action despite reporting) Kaushal Kishor said that the incident was immediately reported to PRB 112, the Irrigation Department and the Forest Department officials. Despite this, no concrete or effective action has been taken. Officials reportedly only inspect the site and leave, while no punitive action has been taken against the accused, emboldening him further.

(Encroachment of bund land)

The complaint also

accused has cultivated about three meters of bund land on both sides, integrating it into his own field and sowing crops. This clearly constitutes illegal encroachment and violation of rules. (Potential future risk) Villagers warned that if action is not taken in time, it could adversely affect the structural integrity of the bund, irrigation management and flood safety in the area. Illegal felling and land encroachment may weaken the bund. (Demand for high-level inquiry) Kaushal Kishor has urged the Executive Engineer, Irrigation Department, Barabanki, to conduct a high-level investigation, take strict legal action against the guilty and immediately restore the illegally cut trees and encroached bund land to prevent recurrence.

Free Eye Camp at Hadiyakol Ashram, 1500 Successful Surgeries







Authorities in Germany are probing the cause of the fire. Meanwhile, Hruthik's family in Telangana has reached out to ministry of external affairs and the Indian Embassy in Germany to expedite the process of bringing his mortal remains back to his home village for the final rites.

Xi invites Lee for 2nd summit

Chinese President Xi Jinping on Friday invited Korean President Lee Jae Myung to a state visit in Beijing, highlighting China shift towards mending relations South Korea amid regional turbulence, 'Al Jazeera' reported. South Korea's national security adviser Wi Sung-lac said Lee will meet Xi in Beijing on Monday before traveling to Shanghai to visit the historic site of South Korea's provisional government during Japan's 35-year colonial rule.

Oz territory plans assisted dying norms

Melbourne: The first place in the world to legalise voluntary euthanasia 31 years ago could this year become the last part of Australia to secure the same legal reform as the Northern Territory government on Friday announced plans to legislate for doctor-assisted dying for a second time.

The Northern Territory's world-first laws passed in 1995 were overturned by the Australian Parliament two years later and after four terminally ill patients were legally helped to die.

Since then, all six Australian states have passed assisted dying laws and the Australian Parliament has lifted the ban on the two territories, Northern Territory and Australian Capital Territory, passing such laws of their own. —AP

Deir Al Balah: A grandmother and her grandson, 5, burned to death in Gaza when their tent caught fire, as Palestinians battle harrowing winter in flimsy makeshift housing and the humanitarian crisis deepens. The nylon tent in Yarmouk caught fire on Thursday night from cooking, a neighbour said.

Maduro open to US talks on drug trafficking

Caracas: Venezuela is open to negotiating an agreement with the US to combat drug trafficking, the South American country's President Nicolas Maduro said in a pre-taped interview on Thursday, but he declined to comment on a CIA-led strike last week at a Venezuelan docking area the Trump administration believed was used by cartels.

Maduro, in an interview with Spanish journalist Ignacio Ramonet, reiterated the US wants to force a government change in Venezuela and gain access to oil reserves through months-long pressure campaign that began with a military deployment to the Caribbean Sea in August.

"What are they seeking? It is clear they seek to impose themselves through threats, intimidation and force," Maduro said, adding, it is time for both nations to "start talking seriously, with data in hand." The US government knows, because we've

told many of their spokespeople, if they want to seriously discuss a deal to combat drug trafficking, we're ready," he said.

"If they want oil, Venezuela is ready for US investment, like with Chevron, whenever they want it, wherever they want it and however they want it." Chevron Corp is the only major oil firm exporting Venezuelan crude to the US. Venezuela has the world's largest proven oil reserves. —AP

Khawaja, set to retire, criticises racial stereotypes

SYDNEY

Veteran Australia batter **Usman Khawaja** has announced he will retire from international cricket after the fifth Ashes test in Perth due to back spasms and then missing the Brisbane test with the injury.

He didn't go quietly
The Pakistan-born Khawaja, who was the first Muslim to play for Australia, used his retirement announcement Friday to criticize the "racial" stereotyping he experienced during his career.

It will be the 39-year-old Khawaja's 88th and final test - played at the ground where he began his first-class career. Khawaja scored his first Ashes century at the SCG with 171 against England in 2018.

It was also at the SCG where he revived his career at age 35, scoring two centuries against England. That prompted one of the great late-career revivals, as Khawaja hit seven centuries in his next two years back in the side.

But Khawaja's position had come under scrutiny and criticism this season after being unable to open in the first Ashes test in Perth due to back spasms and then missing the Brisbane test with the injury.

He was then initially left out in Adelaide until Steve Smith's vertigo allowed Khawaja to return, before an 82 in the first innings there ensured he would stay in the side for the fourth test in Melbourne. Australia, with a 3-1 lead going into the fifth test, has retained the Ashes.

Khawaja said he felt he was treated "a little bit different, even to now," because of his Pakistan and Muslim background.

"Different in the way I've been treated, different in how things have happened."

Once the racial stereotypes came in, of me being lazy, it was things I've dealt with my whole life. Pakistani, West Indian, colored players...we're selfish, we only care about ourselves, we don't care about the team, we don't train hard enough.

he said at a media conference in Sydney. "I had back spasms, it was something I couldn't control. The way the media and the past players came out and attacked me... I copped it for about five days straight. Everyone was piling in.

"Once the racial stereotypes came in, of me being lazy, it was things I've dealt with my whole life. Pakistani, West Indian, colored players...we're selfish, we only care about ourselves, we don't care about the team, we don't train hard enough."

Khawaja was criticized in the days leading up to the Perth match for golfing twice and not taking part in an

"I can give you even more examples of guys who have had 15 schooners (large glasses of beer) the night before a game and have then been injured, but no one said a word because they were just being Aussies. They were just being lads. But when I get injured, everyone went at my credibility and who I am as a person."

Khawaja said he knew the end of his career was imminent

"I guess moving into this series, I had an inkling this would be the last series," he said. "I'm glad I can go out on my own terms."

Khawaja has scored 6,206 runs at an average of 43.49 in his 87 tests with 16 centuries and 28 half-centuries.

Gillespie reveals he felt humiliated in Pakistan job

Ex-head coach states reasons for leaving the role

KARACHI

The sacking of Tim Nielsen as high performance red-ball coach was among a number of issues with the PCB which left him "completely humiliated", says former Australia great Jason Gillespie, looking back at his short nine-month stint as Pakistan head coach.

In April 2024, the Pakistan Cricket Board had appointed Gillespie as the head coach in red-ball cricket and former South African batter Gary Kirsten was roped in for a similar role in white-ball formats.

However, Kirsten's resigna-

tion in October later that year followed Gillespie's in December, when Nielsen was communicated by the PCB that his services would not be needed before the tour of South Africa 2024-25.

A former head coach of the Australian team, Nielsen was appointed as the high performance red-ball coach in August 2024.

"I was coaching the Pakistan Test side. The PCB sacked our senior assistant coach with ZERO communication with me about it - as Head Coach I found this situation completely unacceptable," Gillespie wrote on X when asked by a

user why he had left his role with the Pakistan Test team.

"There were a number of other issues which left me completely humiliated," he added. Nielsen's axing, before Pakistan's tour of South Africa, was perhaps the final blow to a rapidly disintegrating relationship between Gillespie and the PCB, which ended with him refusing to board the flight from Adelaide to South Africa and eventually resigning.

In between his resignation and the exit of Kirsten, Gillespie had also served as the interim white-ball coach. Gillespie was succeeded by former Pakistan cricketer Aaqib Javed across formats, who was also serving on the selection panel.

While he was with the Pakistan team, Gillespie felt he was "completely and utterly blindsided" by the PCB. He told ABC Sport, "There were certainly challenges. I went into the job eyes wide open, I want to make that really clear."

The Bangladesh Cricket Board on Friday announced it will host India for a three-match ODI as well as T20I series to be played in September this year.

However, it is not clear if BCCI will agree to travel to Bangladesh in prevailing conditions with no stable government in place. According to a media release by the BCB, the three ODIs will be played on September 1, 3 and 6, while the T20Is will be played on September 9, 12 and 13.

The Indian team will reach Bangladesh on August 28 for their limited-overs affair.

In July last year, India's tour of Bangladesh was called off indefinitely and the six-match white-ball tour was deferred for more than one year. "The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) have mutually agreed to defer the white-ball series, three ODIs and three Twenty20 Internationals, between Bangladesh and India in August 2025 to September 2026," BCCI had informed in a statement.

The indefatigable duo of Rishabh Pant and **Mohammed Siraj** is expected to be the big talking point on Saturday when the selectors pick a 15-member Indian ODI squad for a three-match series against New Zealand starting January 11 in Vadodara.

While no major shake-ups can be foreseen in the squad that beat South Africa in a preceding series a few weeks ago, two specific concerns could be addressed by the Ajit Agarkar-chaired selection committee.

The first point could be Pant's position as the second wicketkeeper with Ishan Kishan showing his hitting prowess in the middle order for Jharkhand and Dhruv Chand Jurel also smashing a 'Daddy Hundred' for UP in the domestic circuit.

Whether it is Agarkar or head coach Gautam Gambhir, both have shown an inclination to select personnel based on team combination.

Therefore in T20 Internationals, they have gone for keepers who are openers in Sanju Samson and Kishan.

In ODIs, the same keeper is needed to primarily be a middle-order batter, coming in at No.5 or 6.

To be fair to Pant, since the arrival of Gambhir as head coach, he has played just one ODI between July 2024 to December 2025.

Sai Sudharsan fractures rib, could be out for six weeks

NEW DELHI

Young India batter **Sai Sudharsan** could be sidelined for more than a month after sustaining a rib fracture during a recent Vijay Hazare Trophy game against Madhya Pradesh, a BCCI source said on Friday.

Sudharsan, who isn't a part of India's white ball set-up, fractured the "anterior cortex of seventh right rib" while completing a diving run in Tamil Nadu's VHT game against Madhya Pradesh in Ahmedabad.

The 24-year-old is unlikely to be fit for Tamil Nadu's remaining Ranji Trophy games but a more realistic possibility remains that he will be available for Gujarat Titans in the IPL.

According to sources, Sudharsan reported to the Centre of Excellence in Bengaluru on December 29 and a scan report mentioned "a slender, undisplaced fracture of the anterior cortex of the right seventh rib." The area where he sustained the

fracture was the same spot where he got hit during a net session earlier in the tournament.

According to a COE report, "Sai is undertaking lower-body strength and conditioning work with appropriate protection to the injured rib to facilitate healing, and he has responded well to the pro-

gram." Upper-body training will be introduced once acute symptoms settle over the next 7-10 days, following which he will be gradually progressed into a structured upper-body strength and conditioning program," the report stated.

It is understood that an injury like this normally takes six to eight weeks to heal.

Marijne returns as India women's hockey chief coach

NEW DELHI

Dutchman Sjoerd Marijne was on Friday reappointed as the chief coach of India's women's hockey team, five years after guiding the side to a historic fourth-place finish at the Tokyo Olympics following which it has been battling a difficult transition phase.

Marijne would be replacing Harendra Singh, who had to resign in December last year due to the team's under-

whelming results and allegations of a "high-handed coaching approach".

The 51-year-old Marijne, who was associated with the team from 2017 to 2021, will be supported by Matias Vila as analytical coach. Also returning to the Indian hockey set-up is South African Wayne Lombard, who will once again serve as scientific advisor and head of athletic performance.

"It's great to be back. After 4.5 years, I return with fresh energy and a clear vision to

support the team's growth and help the players achieve their full potential on the world stage," Marijne stated in a press release issued by Hockey India.

Marijne, who had immense goodwill within the team and was widely credited for building a cohesive unit that revelled in each other's success, quit immediately after the Tokyo Games, citing family reasons. During his tenure, India also broke into the top 10 of world rankings.

Vila, a former Argentina mid-fielder, made his international debut in 1997 and represented his country at the Olympic Games in 2000 and 2004. He has been

involved in coaching for over two decades.

Lombard, on the other hand, will be supported by Roder Yila and Ciara Yila, both in the role of scientific advisor.

After the Tokyo high, the team was hit by a challenging transition period when key players like injury-ravaged captain Rani Rampal, Vandana Katariya and Deep Grace Ekka, retired from the game. The women's team eventually failed to qualify for the 2024 Paris Olympics

but finished on the podium in both the 2022 Commonwealth Games and the 2023 Asian Games, clinching bronze medals.

The team won a silver medal at last year's Asia Cup but it was not enough to ensure direct qualification for the World Cup this August in Belgium and the Netherlands. The side was also relegated to the Nations Cup after managing just two wins from its 16 games in the elite FIH Pro League last year.
