Chief Minister approves 95 new projects to strengthen the canal network

Chief Minister Yogi
Adityanath on Wednesday
approved 95 new projects
aimed at further strengthening the state canal system during a comprehensive review meeting of
the Irrigation and Water
Resources Department.
He said these projects
would significantly boost
the agricultural sector by
ensuring timely and reli-

able irrigation for farmers. Once completed, the projects, worth ?39,453.39 lakh will restore irrigation capacity across 36,000 hectares, directly benefiting nearly 9 lakh farmers and rural communities. In addition, 273 hectares of departmental land will be safeguarded. The Chief Minister instructed officials to complete all sanctioned works within the



stipulated timeframe, emphasizing that there must be no compromise on quality.Officials informed the meeting that the 95 canal restoration projects include closing gaps in the canal network, construction of head and cross regulators, siphons, falls and other concrete structures. The projects

also encompass improvements to internal and external canal sections, lining and filling of reaches, reconstruction of damaged culverts, construction and repair of bridges and culverts along canal tracks and installation of kerbs on canal routes. Renovation of inspection buildings, office structures and watermills, as well as the construction of boundary walls to protect departmental land, are also planned.
These interventions will significantly enhance the irrigation network's capacity and ensure an uninterrupted water supply across various regions. Farmers in Purvanchal, Terai, Bundelkhand and Western Uttar Pradesh are expected to benefit the most.





band will suffer "mental agony" from his wife humiliating him in front of his friends and mistreating his employees. According to the judges, "The spouse works for his family. The unrebutted evidence of the wife's behavior with employees will hurt him."

Fadnavis warns against fake **SC** certificates



Delhi: Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis said a Scheduled Caste certificate obtained falsely by a non-Hindu, Buddhist, or Sikhish individual will be revoked. If they have government jobs or other reservation advantages, they will be punished. Fadnavis warned in the legislative council that a false SC certificate will nullify an election. He also said the state administration will introduce robust rules to combat religious conversion through compulsion and cheating in response to a calling attention motion. Amit Gorkhe (BJP) said that "crypto Christians" were abusing religious freedom and taking advantage of SC reservations. "Crypto Christians" were people who secretly practice Christianity but identify with another religion. They appear to be SC and receive reservation advantages like government jobs, he added. Fadnavis stated that the Supreme Court ruled on November 26, 2024, that only Hindus, Buddhists, and Sikhs can claim Scheduled Castes category reservation.

Indian authorities cannot authorize foreign kid adoption: HC

Delhi: The Bombay high court ruledthat the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act and adoption regulations do not allow Indian couples to adopt foreign children, even if related. While dismissing a petition by a Pune-based couple, the division bench of justices Revati Mohite Dere and Neela Gokhale stated that the JJ Act and adoption regulations do not allow relatives to adopt a foreign-citizen child unless it is a 'child in need of care and protection' or a 'child in conflict with law'. The 2011-married couple sought to adopt the woman's sister's six-yearold kid in the US. They petitioned the Pune district court adopt their 'relative'



because Muslims have no adoption statute. While their plea was pending in district court in 2024, the Central Adoption Resource Agency them as prospective adoptive parents or issue a preadoption. approached the high court.



Strategic sale of **IDBI** Bank expected by October

Delhi : Two senior government sources said the long-pending strategic disinvestment of IDBI Bank will completed in October, and financial bids will be called soon as the sale process nears its close. "IDBI Bank stake sale will be completed by October," a senior government source stated.

The Inter-Ministerial Group (IMG) on disinvestment met on July 9 to examine the draft Purchase Agreement, a key step before seeking higher authority approvals.

Delhi: NH-148A project to connect Delhi-Noida-Direct (DND) Flyway to Sohna and reduce Delhi congestion is likely to be finished by September. They said 93% of the project is done. The extended highway will traverse Ballabgarh near Faridabad, NH-19, and minimize travel time from east, north, and south Delhi to Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, and Maharashtra. The ramp to Ashram crossroads is virtually finished, while the Sarai Kale Khan side is



being built.

Kaushambi: With the involvement of department officials, ration dealers are looting the government rations provided to the poor by the government. The practice of adulteration is openly taking place in ration shops throughout the district. Despite complaints, officials are merely watching the spectacle, preventing the poor and vulnerable from receiving their full rations. The

ration dealers are profiting by black-marketing the surplus ration, from which the Supply Department officials are collecting monthly collections. It is reported that the Supply Department officials have been collecting 5,000 from each ration dealer every month for the past several years. When will this recovery be stopped and when will the adulteration of rations distributed from ration dealers' shops be stopped To find out the

truth, visit Balipur Tata village in the Chail tehsil area. The team of **Akhand Bharat** Sandesh newspaper saw the truth of the ration dealer's shop, where the ration dealer was openly giving less ration at the time of distribution. He was cheating the card holders in weighing the ration. Card holders are getting less government ration. People say that no hearing is being held on the complaints, which gives the impression that the district sup-

ply office is involved in recovery. Due to recovery from ration dealers of the entire district, there is arbitrariness in the ration distribution system of the district. Thousands of card holders are troubled. Instead of the villagers getting the benefits of the scheme, the officers of the supply office are getting rich by taking advantage of the scheme. The recovery which started 40 years ago has not stopped yet. Recovery from ration

dealers has become a tradition of the department. When will the recovery of crores of rupees per month by the supply office be stopped The officers of the supply office who became rich after collecting from ration dealers on the ration meant for the poor will be investigated by the Anti-Corruption Organization. After Umashankar's death, his wife, Raj Dulari, began demanding a share in the remaining property of her father-in-law, Motilal Kesarwani Nehru. Motilal Kesarwani Nehru had given the remaining house to his wife, who later gave it to his four sons, who still occupy it. The house was registered in the Nagar Panchayat in the names of those four sons. Kailash Kesarwani was the Chairman of the Nagar Panchayat at that time, but his wife, Sunita Kesarwani, has been forcibly implicated in this case, along with former MLA Sanjay Gupta. However, the Chairman of the Nagar Panchayat has no role in the transfer of a house, nor does the MLA have any role. The entire process of transfer is completed by the Executive Officer. The Executive Officer at the time of the transfer was not included in the lawsuit; instead, the current Executive

Uma Shankar sold both his houses after which Uma Shankar died. After his death, Uma Shankar's widow, wife and son and daughter started claiming the one house left by their grandfather Motilal Nehru. the remaining one house. Shashi Tharoor has always disliked 'statist Congress'

Power is in the words. Language has mystical powers. I enjoy playing with words. Those words are hot. You can be moved to tears by words. You can find humor in words. Moreover, there are few things that can convey the planet and all its inhabitants as vividly and comprehensively as words. During the 2009 austerity drive of the Congress-led UPA administration, Tharoor was embroiled in controversy for his response to a query regarding flying "cattle class" to Kerala. His statement, "Absolutely, in cattle class out of solidarity with all our holy cows!" caused a political storm following his response. Tharoor, an accomplished writer of numerous best-selling books on Indian society and politics, was forced to clarify that he did not want to offend economy class passengers after the Congress party swiftly censured him. After 16 years, Tharoor is now again in trouble for comments he made in an interview. In response to a Malayalam report that he had claimed, "We have many leaders, but many feel that there are no ordinary workers," Tharoor clarified that he had really said, "several workers feel there is an absence of a leader in Kerala's Congress." "You should not think that I have no option to spend my time. I have options," Tharoor added earlier in the interview. I have speeches, books, and invitations to speak all around the globe. Some saw his comments as a covert signal to the highest levels of Congress that he was thinking about other political paths. Amidst the upcoming Assembly elections in the state next year, Tharoor is now facing accusations of "crossing the line" from the top leaders of the Congress's faction-ridden Kerala unit, putting him in the center of a maelstrom. Because of this, Shashi Tharoor has been named this week's ThePrint Newsmaker. Actually, Tharoor's essay praising the new industrial policies of the Left-led Kerala government had already been a hot topic before the interview controversy erupted. Tharoor had stated that, during the course of 18 months last year, Kerala's startup ecosystem was valued at an astounding \$1.7 billion, which is five times higher than the worldwide average for the same time period. While the fact that this change has started happening under an LDF government run by communists is shocking, it is not totally unexpected. "The path to growth and prosperity for their people lies in capitalism, entrepreneurship, and initiative, not in red flags, strikes, and agitations," he said in the post, comparing the Communists in Kerala to their West Bengali counterparts at the turn of the century. While he disagrees that the state's industrial climate has changed generally, Tharoor defended himself by saying that "when something good emerges, even if only in one area, it is petty not to acknowledge it" in response to attacks from Kerala Congress officials over the piece. Tharoor. a former UN diplomat, has had a tumultuous political career with the Congress since his 2009 victory in the Lok Sabha elections from the Thiruvananthapuram constituency. Mostly because he had a habit of saying things that went against the party line. However, he consistently gets himself into problems by more than simply his words. In 2009, as the UPA was implementing its austerity measures, Tharoor and then-External Affairs Minister SM Krishna came under fire from the government for allegedly residing in a five-star hotel in Delhi while their official quarters were still being prepared. Tharoor lost his position in the Manmohan Singh government's council of ministers in 2010 due to the scandal surrounding the sweat equity provided to Sunanda Pushkar, his then-girlfriend and later-wife, by a consortium that owned the Kochi club of the Indian Premier League. His ordination as a junior minister was renewed in 2012. Tharoor was thrust into his gravest professional crisis in January 2014, when Pushkar was discovered dead in a luxurious Delhi hotel room—months prior to the Lok Sabha elections.

Has Trump Abandoned Ukraine In Favour Of Russia?

Donald Trump has spent only a month in his second term as the US President. However, he has disrupted the international order, weakened the Western alliance and created a sense of insecurity and uncertainty among its members, surprising even some of his supporters. There has been a paradigm shift in US foreign policy under Trump. He is now closer to Moscow than Washington's traditional allies. He has embraced the Kremlin's narrative on Ukraine and has sidelined US allies. Although senior members of the Trump administration have denied that the US has abandoned Kyiv and ignored its European allies, Trump himself has not made any serious attempts to pacify Ukrainians and Europeans. His closeness to Russia has been on display since he talked for 90 minutes on the phone with Russian leader Vladimir Putin, in which they agreed to start negotiations to end the Ukraine war, which will mark its third anniversary on Monday. Trump did speak to Zelenskyy soon after that call with Putin, but a nervous Ukrainian President warned that excluding his country from the talks would be "very dangerous". Events after that only made Ukrainians feels sidelined. Trump's Vice President, JD Vance, met European leaders in Munich two days later. But his comment that Europe will not be included in the peace talks only helped fuelled the speculation that they were being left out of the future of Ukraine, which is closer to their homes and in which they have invested a lot of money and effort since



the Russian invasion. Vance's meeting with Zelenskyy did not go well either as the Ukrainian leader refused to give access to the country's vast reserves of critical minerals unless he was given security guarantees. That angered Washington. Ending the Russia-Ukraine war was Trump's major campaign promise. But hardly anyone expected him to brazenly take Russia's side and even blame Ukraine for the conflict, which he did. Last Tuesday, a US delegation led by Secretary of State Marco Rubio met the Russian delegation headed by Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov in Saudi Arabia, to discuss peace. Ukraine was not invited. Putin—who had been shunned by the US and its allies since the invasion of Ukraine—was delighted. A frustrated Zelenskyy dismissed the Riyadh talks as worthless. Trump did not like those comments and called the Ukraine President a dictator, even accusing him of starting the war. Zelenskyy said the US President was living in a Russian-made "disinformation space". This infuriated Trump, who does not take kindly to any criticism. He described Zelenskyy as "a modestly successful comedian" who "talked the United

America into spending \$350 Billion, to go into a War that couldn't be won, that never had to start, but a War that he, without the U.S. and 'TRUMP,' will never be able to settle." Trump's behaviour towards Zelenskyy is in stark contrast to Biden's, who had backed Ukraine against Russia with all the possible military and financial aid. President Biden travelled to Ukraine many times since the Russian invasion in February 2022 to display his administration's full support. He also promised NATO membership Ukraine at a future date. Russia was severely punished for invading Ukraine. The US joined hands with its allies to isolate Moscow. Russia faced tough sanctions and its assets in the West were seized. International Criminal Court issued an arrest warrant against Putin for alleged war crimes in Ukraine. There were even plans to put Putin and his close allies on Nuremberg-style trials. Until a year ago, Ukraine's leader was talking about even liberating all its territory, including Crimea, which Russia annexed in 2014, with the help of Western military equipment. Ukraine even succeeded in occupying the

Russian territory of Kursk, which it had thought would be used as a bargaining chip during negotiations with Moscow. But all that now looks like a distant dream. With Trump back in the White House, Ukraine fears that Russia will be allowed to keep all the occupied territory as part of the deal to end the war. Kyiv is now likely to be denied NATO membership. That could be a promise to Russia to end the war. The US under Trump has now even opposed calling Russia an aggressor in a G-7 statement being prepared to mark the third anniversary of the war. The US team removed the phrase from the first draft, which was prepared by Canada, the current holder of the group's presidency. It is not just Ukraine, America's European allies are also now nervous about the intent of Trump. Since the Second World War, they enjoyed the US security umbrella under NATO. But now they are unsure if the US under Trump will honour Article 5 of the NATO, which is triggered when a member state comes under attack. It implies that an attack on one member is an attack on all. There is even fear in Europe that Donald Trump may sign a deal with the Russian leader Vladimir Putin that will lead to the withdrawal of US forces from Baltic states and effectively kill the NATO alliance. That could be similar to the non-aggression treaty signed by the Soviet Union and Nazi Germany on August 23, 1939, sending shockwaves to other European countries and prompting Hitler and Stalin to annex neighbouring countries. It is another matter

that Hitler invaded the Soviet Union two years later, putting an end to the treaty. European members of NATO may call themselves major powers, but they can't match Russia's military might without US support. Even after losing more than a hundred thousand men and lots of military equipment in the Ukraine conflict, Moscow remains a strong power, mainly because of its nuclear arsenal. So Why Has Trump Changed The Narrative? Trump has always been an admirer of strongmen like Putin. Even during his first term, he developed a rapport with him. He also dislikes Zelenskyy, whom he sees as more of a roadblock in ending the Ukraine conflict. As a former businessman, Trump sees things from the perspective of profitable deals. Western sanctions have hit Russia, but American companies have also suffered business losses, running into billions of dollars. He would like to reverse that. And despite Ukraine's resistance, Trump believes Zelenskyy will have to give access to critical minerals in return for any future US support. Some in the Trump administration suggest Kyiv should provide Americans with those minerals in return for the US military and financial aid already received by Ukraine. Trump has blamed European leaders for not doing enough to end the Ukraine war. He has also complained for a long time that Europe has lived off the US for too long and it must pay for its security. Europeans have increased their defence budgets but not enough to survive without US support.

Adani gets Rs 11,000cr for 30% JV share

Delhi: Adani Enterprises will sell its remaining 30.4% ownership in AWL Agri commercial to Wilmar International of Singapore and institutional investors for Rs 11,080 crore, exiting one of its first commercial endeavors from the turn of the millennium. In January, it sold 14% of AWL Agri Business (formerly Adani Wilmar) for Rs 4,856 crore through the offer for sale (OFS), signaling its exit from non-core infrastructure operations. The Ahmedabad-based Adani Group sold Adani Capital, Adani Housing, and the Myanmar port project. AWL stated on Thursday that Wilmar will buy Adani Enterprises' 20% interest in Fortune edible oil and Kohinoor basmati rice manufacturer for Rs 7,148 crore, increasing its ownership to 64% from 45%. In another transaction, institutional investors would buy Adani Enterprises' remaining 10.42% interest for Rs 3,934 crore. Wilmar and institutional investors pay Rs 275 per share for share transfer, compared to Rs 276.5 for Jan OFS. AWL shares on BSE rose over 8% to Rs 284 intraday on Thursday, ending at Rs 278, up 6.1%. AWL will no longer be an Adani Enterprises associate after these transactions, pending Wilmar anti-trust approvals. Adani Enterprises, the group's flagship company, plans to invest AWL divestiture revenues in airports, green hydrogen, roads, and copper activities, where it sees growth potential. The corporation has indicated airports will be a "full-blown consumer story" rather than FMCG.






UNSC endorses Trump's Gaza peace blueprint

Also authorises stabilisation force

The UN Security Council adopted a draft resolution backing US President Donald Trump's Gaza peace plan and authorising creation of an international stabilisation force, a move Trump hailed as a "moment of true historic proportion".

The US-drafted resolution passed on Monday with 13 votes in favour, while China and Russia abstained. It endorses Trump's Comprehensive Plan to End the Gaza Conflict, unveiled on September 29, which envisions Gaza as a "deradicalised, terror-free zone" focused on redevelopment and long-term stability.

The resolution also welcomes the creation of a 'Board of Peace' (BoP), described as a transitional administration with international legal status to coordinate reconstruction and funding under the plan. Trump said he would chair the board. which would include "the most powerful and respected leaders throughout the world".

In a social media message, Trump said the vote would be remembered as "one of the biggest approvals in the history of

Netanyahu applauds, Hamas rejects UN adoption

ISRAELI Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Tuesday applauded the United Nations' approval of the Trump administration's blueprint to secure and govern Gaza, while Hamas rejected the plan as a foreign instrument of control. "We believe that President Trump's plan will lead to peace and prosperity because it insists upon full demilitarisation, disarmament and the deradicalisation of

the United Nations" and would "lead to further peace all over the world". The vote comes ahead of his meeting with Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman at the White House.

UN Secretary-General António Guterres called the Council decision an "important step" in consolidating the ceasefire and urged all parties to comply. He praised the continued mediation efforts of Egypt, Qatar, Turkiye, the US and regional nations, stressing the need to advance towards a political process aimed Gaza," Netanyahu's office wrote on X on Tuesday.

HAMAS said that force's mandate, including disarmament, "strips it of its neutrality, and turns it into a party to the conflict in favour of the occupation." NEW DELHI/DHAKA

Bangladesh on Tuesday remained calm but tense as security forces kept a tight grip on the streets across major cities. following the Awami League's call for a "nationwide total shutdown" to protest the death sentence handed down to its chief and former prime minister Sheikh Hasina.

No incident of violence was reported, while traffic in Dhaka and other major cities stayed thin and public movement was limited amid fears of possible unrest following Monday's highprofile verdict. "The transport flow is thin as the people preferred to stay indoors," a transport operator in Dhaka said.

Many offices and educational institutions recorded low attendance as people chose to stay indoors amid uncertainty.

Heavily armed police, Rapid Action Battalion personnel and paramilitary units continued round-the-clock patrols, especially around government buildings, party offices and key intersections. Authorities kept security cordons in parts of the capital, while checkpoints and barricades remained in place.

With a direct letter sent to nations, host country Brazil is shifting the UN climate conference into a higher gear.

The letter sent late Monday comes during the final week of what has been billed as a historic climate summit, the first ever in the Amazon rainforest, a key regulator of climate because trees absorb carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas that warms the planet.

The letter comes ahead of the speeches of high-level ministers on Tuesday. Headliners include representatives from influential European countries like Ed Miliband, energy secretary of the United Kingdom, and Deputy Prime Minister Sophie Hermans of the Netherlands. More leaders will also speak from small island states and developing countries like Barbados and Bangladesh, both facing loss of land as seas rise because of climate change. The letter asks leaders to declare NDC by Dec: Yadav India will submit its revised Nationally Determined

Contribution (NDC) for the 2035 period by December, Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav said on Monday, while calling on developed nations to achieve net-zero targets well ahead of their current deadlines. Addressing the high-level segment of the COP30 climate summit here, Yadav said climate change was "real and imminent", driven by unsustainable patterns of growth and development.

India has urged global leaders to step up efforts to protect big cats, saying that securing the future of these species will ensure a safe, long-lasting life for mankind. Puducherry holds fort

Puducherry put up a stiff resistance in the second innings thanks to half-centuries from Aman Khan and Sidhaant Addhatrao as they pushed the Ranji Trophy Elite Group D match to the fourth day at the Wankhede Stadium on Tuesday

The sixth-wicket partnership of 137 runs off 191 balls between Aman and Sidhaant was the saving grace for Puducherry in a match where the visitors were only delaying the inevitable after conceding a gargantuan first-innings lead of 498 runs.

Aman Khan's 86 off 44 balls was the highlight of the Puducherry innings and he was well supported by sidhaantwho scored 51 off 54 balls. Puducherry ended the day at 231/6 in 45 overs.

Come the second innings following on, it seemed Puducherry were going down the same track as their first innings performance.

Ajay Rohera was caught at first slip by Sarfaraz Khan off Tushar Deshpande for no score as Mumbai began the demolition job.

Shardul Thakur then bagged the second wicket of Paras Ratnaparkhe for 1 by Akash Anand as the Mumbai pacers got into the groove.

Then Mohit Kale and Neyan Kangayan put on a semblance of a resistance as they stitched together a partnership of 35 odd runs.

Kale was the more aggressive of the two as he was going at a strike rate of 88 reaching 22 off 25 balls with four boundaries. Puducherry were 40/2 after the completion of 11 overs in their second innings.

They reached 53/2 in 14 overs as Kale and Kangayan brought up their 50-run part-

Mulani broke the 66-run partnership between Kale and Kangayan as he sent the former packing caught by substitute Sairaj Patil for 35.

The fifth-wicket partnership between Kangayan and Anand Singh Bais lasted for just 16 runs as Kotian trapped the former leg before for 42 as Puducherry were reduced to 85/4 in 25.2 overs

Anand Singh didn't last long himself as he holed out to Tushar Deshpande off Mulani's bowling and was dismissed for just eight. Puducherry slipped to 91/5 at that stage and were staring at a huge innings defeat.

Thereafter, Aman Khan and Sidhaant used the long handle to good effect as they built a 81-run partnership as Puducherry reached 172/5 in

37 overs. Aman brought up his fifty as well as he got to 55 off 29 balls with four hits to the fence and five over it at a strike rate of 189.

"This is not the first time a spin-friendly track has been prepared. No one raised this question (before) because India was winning. And, winning and losing is part of the game. It's not that the team has not lost before or it has lost for the first time. I don't think it's (defeat) a big worry for me," said the 35-year-old pacer, who announced the launch of 'CricGiri' app, of which he is the co-founder.

Staying true to batters' quirks and routines during net sessions, India's Sai Sudharsan and Dhruv Jurel on Monday faced spinners while wearing only one pad to counter the turning deliveries, a method that comes with an element of

As is the case with most unorthodox practices, there was a method to the madness during this nearly three-hour optional session at the Eden Gardens. For left-hander Sudharsan,

the decision to remove his right pad was aimed at ensuring a big front-foot stride without any protection on that leg. Sudharsan did not play the

Eden Test, and there is no guarantee he will get a start in Guwahati either.

Batting against left-arm spinners and off-spinners without a front pad meant he had to be especially cautious about avoiding blows on the shin bone or any exposed area that could lead to a fracture.

This is a very old-school training method, where

coaches insist batters use their bat more than their front pad to block the deliveries.

With pads on, batters tend to fall back on conditioned reflexes, bringing the front pad across as the first line of defence and often ending up in front-foot leg-before posi-Removing the front pad in

nets forces the batter to rely on the bat instead

Another reason behind this drill is the current tendency among Indian left-handers to go on the back foot, as they struggle to read spinners from the hand and try to play with the turn. The practice encourages batters to step out of the crease and smother the spin.

Similarly, Jurel was also seen without his right pad as he worked on the reverse sweep on one of the centre

strips. For a right-hander, the execution of the stroke demands a big stride forward with the right leg.

This again is an exercise designed to ensure correct movement while minimising the risk of injury.

During the optional session, head coach Gautam Gambhir kept a close watch on Sudharsan, one of the contenders to replace Shubman Gill, who may have to sit out the second Test due to neck spasm. All-rounder Nitish Reddy has been taken out of the ongoing India A series against South Africa A in Rajkot.

Ambidextrous spinner

Medal-winning archers endure night-long ordeal in Dhaka

KOLKATA

Indian archers endured a night of chaos when their return to the country from Dhaka after the Asian Championships was delayed by a day due to a cancelled flight, forcing them to stay at a "substandard shelter" after navigating through the violence-hit Bangladeshi capital

Eleven members of the 23strong squad, including two minors, were left stranded

without security.

for nearly 10 hours at the airport amid repeated flight delays and a "complete absence of support" from the airline on which they were booked. The group, which included

senior pros Abhishek Verma, Jyoti Surekha and Olympian Dhirai Bommadevara, had reached the Dhaka airport on Saturday for their 9.30pm flight to Delhi, only to be told after boarding that the aircraft had developed a technical snag and would not take

It was at a time when Dhaka witnessed violence on the streets as it awaited a special tribunal's verdict against deposed Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina in a case of alleged crimes against humanity.

The archers, seven of them women, remained inside the terminal till 2am with no clarity. When the cancellation was finally announced, passengers were informed that no alternate flight would be arranged that night.

The moment the team

stepped out of the airport, their ordeal escalated.

They were herded into a "window-less local bus" and taken nearly half an hour away to a makeshift lodge which was like a "Dharamshala", the country's most decorated compound

male archer Verma alleged. The 36-year-old said the place where the team was taken "was not even a proper hotel", but a cramped dormitory with six beds in one room for the women and

only one filthy toilet.

"The 'dharamshala' that was given in the name of the guest house was very pathetic. In one room there were six double beds... There was only one toilet and the condition of the toilet was very bad," he told PTI.

"It was such that I don't think anyone could have taken a bath there," Verma, who has consecutive Asian Games silver medals (2018 and 2022), alleged.

Their attempts to make alternative arrangements also could not work out.
