Reservation should be implemented in institutions: Congress

Congress has appealed to the Govt. to implement reservation in institutions

New Delhi. Citing the recommendations of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Education headed by Rajya Sabha member Digvijay Singh, the Congress has appealed to the Central Government to implement reservation for Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST) and Other Backward Classes (OBC) in private higher educational institutions. The report of the Parliamentary

Committee on Education headed by Digvijay Singh was presented in Parliament today. The committee has recommended that Parliament should pass a law under which 15 percent reservation for SC communities, 7.5 percent for ST and 27 percent for OBC should be made mandatory in private higher educational institutions. Congress General Secretary Jairam Ramesh, in a statement, has demanded the implementation of 15 percent reservation for SC community, 7.5 percent for ST and 27 percent for OBC in private higher educational institutions.

Will be applicable in crimes with 5 years+ punishment; Bill opposed

New Delhi: There was an uproar in the Lok Sabha on Wednesday during the introduction of three bills related to the removal of the Prime Minister, Chief Minister and Ministers of the Central and State Governments, who are in jail in corruption and other serious cases, by the President, Governor and Lieutenant Governor. As soon as Union Home Minister Amit Shah made a statement for permission to introduce the bill, papers were thrown at him from the opposition. After this, the proceedings were adjourned till three o'clock.

The Constitution (130th) Amendment Bill

Through the Constitution Amendment Bill, changes will be made in Article 75 of the Constitution. It says- 'A minister, who, while in office, is accused of a serious crime, in which the punishment can be five years or more in prison. If such a minister is arrested or detained continuously for 30 days, then he can be removed from the post by the President on the advice of the Prime Minister till the 31st day of custody.' According to the bill, even in the event of not getting advice from the PM till the 31st day, the minister will automatically become ineligible.



Lok Sabha - the Constitution (One Hundred and Thirtieth Amendment) Bill, 2025; Government of

Union Territories (Amendment) Bill, 2025 and Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization

(Amendment) Bill, 2025. The introduction of the bill was opposed by AIMIM's Asaduddin Owaisi, Congress's Manish Tewari, RSP's NK Premachandran, SP's Dharmendra Yadav and Congress' KC Venugopal. They described it as against the basic structure of the Constitution, fundamental principles, parliamentary democracy. Amit Shah also responded to the allegations of opposition MPs during this time. He said that the bill has been brought so that the values of morality remain intact. He also said that he too had gone to jail while being a minister in Gujarat and he had resigned from his post. He did not hold any constitutional post until he was freed from all the charges. Also on the bill being brought in a hurry, Shah said that the bills will be sent to the joint committee for further consideration

During this, he will flag off two trains and also address public meetings. The Prime Minister's Office said on Wednesday that Prime Minister Narendra Modi will reach Gaya in Bihar at



around 11 am on August 22, where he will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of several development projects worth about Rs 13,000 crore. He will flag off two trains and address a public meeting. On this occasion,



he will also flag off the Amrit Bharat Express (Gaya to Delhi) and the Buddha Circuit Train (Vaishali to Koderma). After this, he will visit and inaugurate the Auntha-Simaria bridge project on the Ganga river. This bridge is

built on NH-31 at a cost of Rs 1,870 crore, which will provide direct connectivity between Mokama and Begusarai in Patna. This new six-lane bridge is built parallel to the old Rajendra Setu due to which heavy vehicles will no longer have to cover an additional distance of 100 km. Apart from this, the Prime Minister will also inaugurate the four-lane section of Bakhtiyarpur-Mokama NH-31.

The Rajya Sabha on Wednesday passed the Indian Institute of Management (Amendment) Bill, 2025 by voice vote, paving the way for setting up the country's 22nd and Assam's first Indian Institute of Management (IIM) in Guwahati. The central government will provide capital assistance of Rs 550 crore for this. This bill has been passed by the Lok Sabha a day earlier on Tuesday. According to the gov-



ernment, IIM Guwahati will be the second IIM in Northeast India after Shillong. This bill also provides the status of an institute of national importance to the IIM to be established in Guwahati. Through this, the aim is to reduce regional disparities in

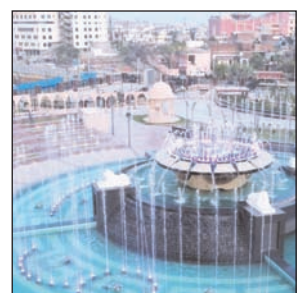

HC stays conviction order of Abbas in hate speech case

Prayagraj. Allahabad High Court has stayed the conviction order of Abbas Ansari in hate speech case and has cancelled the order of lower court refusing to stay the sentence and conviction order. This order has been given by a single bench of Justice Sameer Jain on the review petition of Abbas Ansari. The stay order passed on conviction will remain till the appeal is pending before the District Judge. The High Court has said in its order that the comment made in this order will not affect his pending appeal against the sentence. The court has also directed to decide the appeal independently. Abbas Ansari, former MLA of Suheldev Bharatiya Samaj Party (SBSP) from Mau Sadar seat of Uttar Pradesh and son of mafia Mukhtar Ansari, has got a big relief from the Allahabad High Court. The High Court suspended the conviction order of Abbas. Abbas Ansari had filed a revision petition in the High Court against the lower court's order refusing to stay the sentence. The court had reserved the decision on July 30 after the arguments of both the sides were completed. Today its decision was given by Justice Jain. On May 31, the MLA Court Mau had sentenced.

Two accused of murderous attack sentenced to 7 years

Firozabad. The court on Wednesday sentenced two accused of murderous attack to 7 years of imprisonment each. They were fined. If they do not pay the fine, they will have to undergo additional punishment. Anil Kumar, a resident of village Nanemou of Thana Nasirpur, was shot and injured on 10 March 2018 when he protested against the abuses of the goons. He was sitting with his sister and mother. The injured's sister Neelam filed a case against Anil alias Chhote son of Ramveer and Sonu son of Avran Singh of the same village. After investigation, the police filed a chargesheet against both of them.

Action taken in presence of officers, uproar over encroachment removal in Civil Line

Challan of 100 vehicles including Sales Tax Commissioner's car

Prayagraj. The Municipal Corporation launched a large-scale encroachment removal campaign from Subhash Chowk to Nawab Yusuf Road in Civil Lines area. During this, there was a lot of uproar on the spot. The entire team of the Municipal Corporation along with the traffic police force was also present in this campaign. More than 100 vehicles were challaned during the campaign. At the same time, many vehicles were towed away from the spot as they were parked in no parking zone. On the spot, the Sales Tax Commissioner's car was found parked in the mid-



dle of the road, which was challaned. During the action, there was chaos in the entire area. Traders and shopkeepers protested against the Municipal Corporation team and created a ruckus and argued. Many shopkeepers alleged that the action was taken without prior notice, which affected the business. However, officials say that warnings had already been given several times, despite this the encroachment was not

removed. Sales Tax Commissioner's car was challaned. During the joint action of PDA and Traffic Police, it became a topic of discussion when the Sales Tax Commissioner's car was found parked in the middle of the road. The car was parked in the no parking area for more than an hour, which disrupted traffic.

The traffic police, following the rules, challaned the Commissioner's



car. However, an attempt was made to tow it but it could not be towed due to the large vehicle. Vehicles lined up in the middle of the road. This action was mainly taken to remove encroachment in front of shops located on both lanes from Subhas Chowk to Nawab Yusuf Road and against vehicles parked in no parking areas.

There is a jam situation in this area every day. Vehicles are parked on the

roadside, at many places vehicle repair work is being done on the roads itself, due to which pedestrians have to face a lot of trouble. Municipal Corporation officials said that many times traders in Civil Lines were warned to follow the rules, but due to continuous negligence, this strict step had to be taken.

The Additional Commissioner of PDA was present on the spot and monitored the entire

operation. The traffic police maintained traffic control during the operation and took strict action against vehicles parked in no parking zones and issued challans. According to the PDA, this campaign will continue in the future as well. In view of the ever-increasing encroachment and traffic chaos, the rules will now be strictly enforced. He clarified that if any shopkeeper or vehicle owner is found violating the rules in future, punitive action will be taken against him. The local people have supported this action of the Municipal Corporation and said that the problem of traffic jam has been going on for years in major commercial areas like Civil Lines.

Father's body recovered 60 hours after throwing daughters in river, girls still missing

Orai. In an incident that happened three days ago in Madhogarh Kotwali area, the body of that young man was recovered from the river on Wednesday after about 60 hours, while the search for the two little girls is still on. Three days ago, a young man reached Juhikha bridge of Sirsa Kalar police station area

with his two little daughters. He first threw both his daughters in the river stream and immediately after that he himself committed suicide by jumping into the Yamuna river. About 60 hours after this incident, the body of a young man was recovered on the river bank near Khargui bridge of Sirsa Kalar police station

area on Wednesday. This place is about 40 kilometers away from the incident spot Juhikha bridge, where the flow of the river swept the body away. Local people saw the body lying on the river bank and immediately informed the police. The police team reached the spot and took the body in their possession.

Former MLA Vijay Mishra's son Vishnu gets bail from High Court

Akhand Bharat Sandesh Prayagraj. Allahabad High Court has approved the bail plea of Vishnu Mishra, son of former MLA Vijay Mishra from Bhadohi, accused of possessing illegal weapons. This order has been given by the court of Justice Rajbir Singh on the second bail plea filed by Vishnu Mishra. The case is from Gopiganj police station area of Bhadohi. In 2022, an FIR was registered against Vishnu Mishra under the Arms Act at Gopiganj police station. His first bail plea in this case was rejected by the High Court on 14 May 2024. Earlier, cases have been registered against Vishnu Mishra under several serious sections including rape. During the investigation of a case registered in



2020, the police had received information that he was hiding at Chandan Tiwari's house in Anapur village. A pistol was recovered from there and during the raid, Vishnu escaped by dodging the police. On August 4, 2022, on his information, the police recovered a nine mm pistol, four magazines, 375 cartridges and an AK-47 rifle from a petrol pump in Amwa, Bhadohi. On the basis of this recovery, the second case was registered. In

this, the High Court has given relief to Vishnu Mishra. This was the whole case. In 2022, an FIR was registered against Vishnu Mishra in Gopiganj police station of Bhadohi under sections 3/7 -25 and 29-B of the Arms Act. Many cases are already registered against Vishnu Mishra under other sections including rape. A case of rape of a singer was registered against former MLA Vijay Mishra and Vishnu Mishra. Vijay Mishra is currently lodged in Agra jail while son Vishnu is lodged in Lakhimpur Kheri jail. On August 4, 2022, the police recovered five nine-mm cartridges, a nine-mm pistol, four magazines, 375 cartridges and an AK-47 rifle from a closed petrol pump at Amwa in Gopiganj.

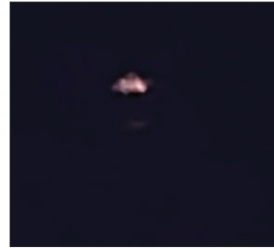

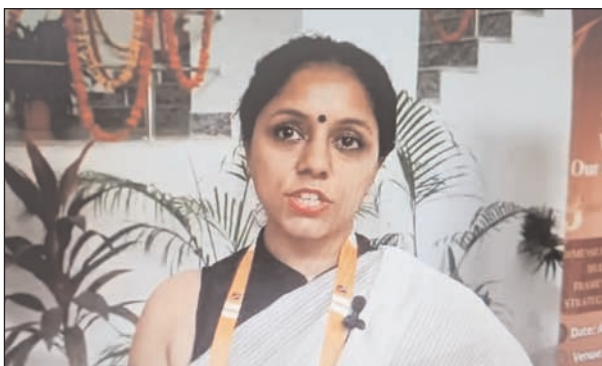

Shashi Tharoor has always disliked 'statist Congress'

Power is in the words. Language has mystical powers. I enjoy playing with words. Those words are hot. You can be moved to tears by words. You can find humor in words. Moreover, there are few things that can convey the planet and all its inhabitants as vividly and comprehensively as words. During the 2009 austerity drive of the Congress-led UPA administration, Tharoor was embroiled in controversy for his response to a query regarding flying "cattle class" to Kerala. His statement, "Absolutely, in cattle class out of solidarity with all our holy cows!" caused a political storm following his response. Tharoor, an accomplished writer of numerous best-selling books on Indian society and politics, was forced to clarify that he did not want to offend economy class passengers after the Congress party swiftly censured him. After 16 years, Tharoor is now again in trouble for comments he made in an interview. In response to a Malayalam report that he had claimed, "We have many leaders, but many feel that there are no ordinary workers," Tharoor clarified that he had really said, "several workers feel there is an absence of a leader in Kerala's Congress." "You should not think that I have no option to spend my time. I have options," Tharoor added earlier in the interview. I have speeches, books, and invitations to speak all around the globe. Some saw his comments as a covert signal to the highest levels of Congress that he was thinking about other political paths. Amidst the upcoming Assembly elections in the state next year, Tharoor is now facing accusations of "crossing the line" from the top leaders of the Congress's faction-ridden Kerala unit, putting him in the center of a maelstrom. Because of this, Shashi Tharoor has been named this week's ThePrint Newsmaker. Actually, Tharoor's essay praising the new industrial policies of the Left-led Kerala government had already been a hot topic before the interview controversy erupted. Tharoor had stated that, during the course of 18 months last year, Kerala's startup ecosystem was valued at an astounding \$1.7 billion, which is five times higher than the worldwide average for the same time period. While the fact that this change has started happening under an LDF government run by communists is shocking, it is not totally unexpected. "The path to growth and prosperity for their people lies in capitalism, entrepreneurship, and initiative, not in red flags, strikes, and agitations," he said in the post, comparing the Communists in Kerala to their West Bengali counterparts at the turn of the century. While he disagrees that the state's industrial climate has changed generally, Tharoor defended himself by saying that "when something good emerges, even if only in one area, it is petty not to acknowledge it" in response to attacks from Kerala Congress officials over the piece. Tharoor, a former UN diplomat, has had a tumultuous political career with the Congress since his 2009 victory in the Lok Sabha elections from the Thiruvananthapuram constituency. Mostly because he had a habit of saying things that went against the party line. However, he consistently gets himself into problems by more than simply his words. In 2009, as the UPA was implementing its austerity measures, Tharoor and then-External Affairs Minister SM Krishna came under fire from the government for allegedly residing in a five-star hotel in Delhi while their official quarters were still being prepared. Tharoor lost his position in the Manmohan Singh government's council of ministers in 2010 due to the scandal surrounding the sweat equity provided to Sunanda Pushkar, his then-girlfriend and later-wife, by a consortium that owned the Kochi club of the Indian Premier League. His ordination as a junior minister was renewed in 2012. Tharoor was thrust into his gravest professional crisis in January 2014, when Pushkar was discovered dead in a luxurious Delhi hotel room—months prior to the Lok Sabha elections.



Muslims want waqf reforms too. It's not an issue for political acrimony

When the Waqf Amendment Bill 2024 was first tabled in the Lok Sabha on 8 August last year, it triggered fears within the Muslim community, as it was perceived to have been introduced without adequate consultation with stakeholders. After all, the issue of waqfs—Muslim institutions through which property is bequeathed for religious or charitable purposes—is sensitive because it involves socio-religious spaces such as qabristans, masjids, idgahs, and madrasas. As such, the government and Parliament were exhorted to adopt procedures that allayed rather than stoked the fears of

Muslims. In this backdrop, the decision to refer the bill to a joint committee of both Houses of Parliament was welcome. The 31-member committee, drawn from across party lines, received 97,27,772 memoranda overall. There were representations from various ministries and departments—including Minority Affairs, Law and Justice, Railways, Housing and Urban Affairs, Road Transport, and Culture (Archaeological Survey of India)—as well as state waqf boards and experts, ensuring a diversity of opinions. As such, the government and Parliament were exhorted to adopt pro-

cedures that allayed rather than stoked the fears of Muslims. In this backdrop, the decision to refer the bill to a joint committee of both Houses of Parliament was welcome. The 31-member committee, drawn from across party lines, received 97,27,772 memoranda overall. There were representations from various ministries and departments—including Minority Affairs, Law and Justice, Railways, Housing and Urban Affairs, Road Transport, and Culture (Archaeological Survey of India)—as well as state waqf boards and experts, ensuring a diversity of opinions. It is not entirely

correct to state that waqf reforms are being externally foisted. Rather, to a large extent, the demand for waqf reforms has emerged from within the Muslim community also. The Ministry of Minority Affairs received numerous complaints from Muslims on the maladministration of waqf properties, which manifested in voluminous litigations. The ministry's analysis of grievances received from April 2023 found that 148 complaints pertained mostly to encroachments, illegal sales of waqf land, delays in surveys and registration, and complaints against waqf boards and mutawallis.

Has Trump Abandoned Ukraine In Favour Of Russia?

Donald Trump has spent only a month in his second term as the US President. However, he has disrupted the international order, weakened the Western alliance and created a sense of insecurity and uncertainty among its members, surprising even some of his supporters. There has been a paradigm shift in US foreign policy under Trump. He is now closer to Moscow than Washington's traditional allies. He has embraced the Kremlin's narrative on Ukraine and has sidelined US allies. Although senior members of the Trump administration have denied that the US has abandoned Kyiv and ignored its European allies, Trump himself has not made any serious attempts to pacify Ukrainians and Europeans. His closeness to Russia has been on display since he talked for 90 minutes on the phone with Russian leader Vladimir Putin, in which they agreed to start negotiations to end the Ukraine war, which will mark its third anniversary on Monday. Trump did speak to Zelenskyy soon after that call with Putin, but a nervous Ukrainian President warned that excluding his country from the talks would be "very dangerous". Events after that only made Ukrainians feel sidelined. Trump's Vice President, JD Vance, met European leaders in Munich two days later. But his comment that Europe will not be included in the peace talks only helped fuelled the speculation that they were being left out of the future of Ukraine, which is closer to their homes and in which they have invested a lot of money and effort since



the Russian invasion. Vance's meeting with Zelenskyy did not go well either as the Ukrainian leader refused to give access to the country's vast reserves of critical minerals unless he was given security guarantees. That angered Washington. Ending the Russia-Ukraine war was Trump's major campaign promise. But hardly anyone expected him to brazenly take Russia's side and even blame Ukraine for the conflict, which he did. Last Tuesday, a US delegation led by Secretary of State Marco Rubio met the Russian delegation headed by Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov in Saudi Arabia, to discuss peace. Ukraine was not invited. Putin—who had been shunned by the US and its allies since the invasion of Ukraine—was delighted. A frustrated Zelenskyy dismissed the Riyadh talks as worthless. Trump did not like those comments and called the Ukraine President a dictator, even accusing him of starting the war. Zelenskyy said the US President was living in a Russian-made "disinformation space". This infuriated Trump, who does not take kindly to any criticism. He described Zelenskyy as "a modestly successful comedian" who "talked the United

States of America into spending \$350 Billion, to go into a War that couldn't be won, that never had to start, but a War that he, without the U.S. and 'TRUMP,' will never be able to settle." Trump's behaviour towards Zelenskyy is in stark contrast to Biden's, who had backed Ukraine against Russia with all the possible military and financial aid. President Biden travelled to Ukraine many times since the Russian invasion in February 2022 to display his administration's full support. He also promised NATO membership to Ukraine at a future date. Russia was severely punished for invading Ukraine. The US joined hands with its allies to isolate Moscow. Russia faced tough sanctions and its assets in the West were seized. The International Criminal Court issued an arrest warrant against Putin for alleged war crimes in Ukraine. There were even plans to put Putin and his close allies on Nuremberg-style trials. Until a year ago, Ukraine's leader was talking about even liberating all its territory, including Crimea, which Russia annexed in 2014, with the help of Western military equipment. Ukraine even succeeded in occupying the

Russian territory of Kursk, which it had thought would be used as a bargaining chip during negotiations with Moscow. But all that now looks like a distant dream. With Trump back in the White House, Ukraine fears that Russia will be allowed to keep all the occupied territory as part of the deal to end the war. Kyiv is now likely to be denied NATO membership. That could be a promise to Russia to end the war. The US under Trump has now even opposed calling Russia an aggressor in a G-7 statement being prepared to mark the third anniversary of the war. The US team removed the phrase from the first draft, which was prepared by Canada, the current holder of the group's presidency. It is not just Ukraine, America's European allies are also now nervous about the intent of Trump. Since the Second World War, they enjoyed the US security umbrella under NATO. But now they are unsure if the US under Trump will honour Article 5 of the NATO, which is triggered when a member state comes under attack. It implies that an attack on one member is an attack on all. There is even fear in Europe that Donald Trump may sign a deal with the Russian leader Vladimir Putin that will lead to the withdrawal of US forces from Baltic states and effectively kill the NATO alliance. That could be similar to the non-aggression treaty signed by the Soviet Union and Nazi Germany on August 23, 1939, sending shockwaves to other European countries and prompting Hitler and Stalin to annex neighbouring countries. It is another matter

that Hitler invaded the Soviet Union two years later, putting an end to the treaty. European members of NATO may call themselves major powers, but they can't match Russia's military might without US support. Even after losing more than a hundred thousand men and lots of military equipment in the Ukraine conflict, Moscow remains a strong power, mainly because of its nuclear arsenal. So Why Has Trump Changed The Narrative? Trump has always been an admirer of strongmen like Putin. Even during his first term, he developed a rapport with him. He also dislikes Zelenskyy, whom he sees as more of a roadblock in ending the Ukraine conflict. As a former businessman, Trump sees things from the perspective of profitable deals. Western sanctions have hit Russia, but American companies have also suffered business losses, running into billions of dollars. He would like to reverse that. And despite Ukraine's resistance, Trump believes Zelenskyy will have to give access to critical minerals in return for any future US support. Some in the Trump administration suggest Kyiv should provide Americans with those minerals in return for the US military and financial aid already received by Ukraine. Trump has blamed European leaders for not doing enough to end the Ukraine war. He has also complained for a long time that Europe has lived off the US for too long and it must pay for its security. Europeans have increased their defence budgets but not enough to survive without US support.

The Hindutva Pitch of the BJP: Will Bihar Pay Attention This Time?

Prime Minister Narendra Modi attacked the opposition, calling members of the party who support "jungle raj" anti-Indian and anti-faith. Furthermore, he said that the state's citizens would hold anybody who insults Maha Kumbh in contempt forever. Political circles were captivated by his attention on Maha Kumbh, which he displayed barely two days before Maha Shivratri, as the event was coming to a close. For what reason did Modi bring up the holy event, which has been going on for almost two months, Was all he was doing was addressing the Opposition's strong criticism of what they saw as poor administration during the world's largest religious gathering, the Maha Kumbh, and the two stampedes that occurred there. Did he want Maha Kumbh to be a part of the National Democratic Alliance's Bihar election platform? It is quite probable that Modi, who had begun the NDA's Bihar election campaign with Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, purposefully

brought up the controversy surrounding Maha Kumbh in order to strengthen the Hindu support among the OBC. Many also saw it as an effort to win over religiously inclined female voters. Meanwhile, political scientists claimed Modi didn't really need to mention Maha Kumbh. In contrast to Uttar Pradesh, religious and communal appeals do not have the same impact on elections in Bihar. A transformative governance agenda has traditionally had a greater impact on the state. Rather than a rising embrace of the Hindutva ideology of the BJP, observers pointed out that Bihar was shifting away from the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) led by Lalu Yadav owing to fears of his previous misrule. North Bihar is still firmly under the control of the NDA, and yatras, which were once used to communalize politics, have not been very successful. The Hindu Swabhimani Yatra, which Union Minister Giriraj Singh attempted last year but was unable to launch, is a prime example.

The trinity that failed women at Maha Kumbh. Holy, unholy, and the algorithm

Aasavage irony is unfolding in Uttar Pradesh right now. India's holiest gathering is a hunting ground for faceless remote predators. At the "once in 144 years" Maha Kumbh Mela underway in Prayagraj, where millions congregate to wash away their sins in the Ganga, an unholy alliance of voyeurs, traders, and technology has formed. They're transforming purification into portable entertainment. What's on sale? The privacy and bodily integrity of women devotees. And the price? Anywhere between Rs 800 and Rs 2,000, depending on the quality of violation. Indian women have been failed, yet again, by a new trinity: The holy, the unholy, and the algorithm. Last week, 13 FIRs were lodged against 140 social media accounts for posting objectionable videos of women, including those of female devotees taking a dip at the Kumbh. The bathing videos came to light during a separate investigation by the Ahmedabad Cyber Crime Police into videos sourced from a Rajkot hospital's gynaecology department. The investigation revealed that the three accused—Prajwal Taili, Praj Patil, and Chandraprakash Phoolchand—ran at least 22 Telegram channels where they sold clips of women, recorded and traded without their consent. The three men, a YouTuber from Prayagraj and two NEET aspirants from Maharashtra, ran their enterprise under an innocuous name "Megha Demos Group". The channels, with labels like "CCTV Injection Group", "Labor Room Injection Group", and "Ganga River Open Bathing Group", turned these transgressions into a menu of options. "Disturbingly, some content featured covert recordings from hospital labour rooms, medical examinations, and public areas like bus stands, marriage halls, and parlours," cyber crime officers told The

Times of India. This lucrative venture raked in Rs 8 lakh a year. To the credit of UP Police, their social media monitoring team has moved swiftly, and identified 15 more accounts across Facebook, YouTube, and Instagram participating in this ecosystem of exploitation. The state government has now banned cameras at bathing ghats, deploying CRPF and state police personnel to enforce this prohibition. In 2019 too, the Allahabad High Court had banned the publishing of photos and videos of women at the Kumbh Mela: "The court said no pictures of women bathing or taking a holy dip should be shared. It also warned that action would be taken if the order was broken. This rule applies to both print and visual media." This violation and commodification of women's bodies at the Maha Kumbh represents a betrayal across three interconnected spheres. It's not as if Indian women are unfamiliar with such trespasses—that's our daily reality. But the Kumbh videos expose a particularly perverse intersection of faith, trade, and technology. First, there is the sacred: In a space of spiritual liberation, the crowd provides both cover and target for predators. Elaborate systems. At Indian temples and other places of worship prevent photography to protect idols and deities. Those regulations don't extend to the bodies of women who show up at these sites. Then comes the betrayal by the profane, a carefully constructed marketplace where every assault is catalogued, priced, and traded. What's most chilling about the Kumbh videos is the clinical efficiency of their distribution. The "Megha Demos Group" operated with the precision of a tech startup, complete with a freemium business model. Finally, there is the betrayal by technology, where algorithms.

Nephew stabs uncle to death over petty quarrel

Hathnikund barrage releases over 1.78 lakh cusecs of water

NEW DELHI/ YAMUNANAGAR: The Yamuna River, which had remained calm for nearly six weeks, surged into spate following heavy rainfall in the hilly regions of Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand. As a precaution, all 18 gates of the Hathnikund Barrage in Yamunanagar district were opened for the first time this monsoon season, releasing a massive discharge of 1,78,896 cusecs of



water downstream. The released water is expected to reach national capital Delhi within the next 30-48 hours, raising the river's water level and posing a potential flood risk to low-lying areas. Delhi Rain Chaos: Waterlogged Streets, Massive Traffic Jams Hit City After Sudden Change in Weather

Officials of the Haryana irrigation and water resources department (IWRD) sounded alert sirens before opening the barrage gates and issued warnings to residents and farmers to stay away from the riverbanks and keep their livestock at a safe distance.

The district administration, as well

as the Delhi government, has been informed of the situation.

Haryana IWRD superintendent engineer at Yamunanagar, R S Mittal stated that due to heavy rainfall in the hilly catchment areas, water levels rose sharply, necessitating the release. "This is the first time this season that all 18 gates of the Hathnikund Barrage have been opened. Supply to canals has been stopped to manage the increased flow," Mittal said. A discharge of over one lakh cusecs is considered low flood, 1.5 lakh cusecs is termed medium flood, and anything above 2.5 lakh cusecs is classified as high flood.

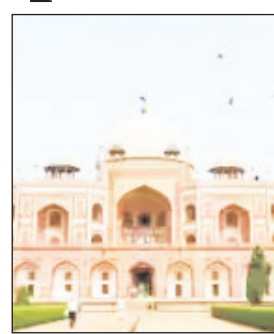

The gate pass must be made online quickly; if it is not generated, the payment will be delayed by 2-3 days," and asked her to transfer Rs 5 to initiate the gate pass process. The complainant transferred Rs 5 from her son's bank account. She then received Rs 10 from the accused.

Ready-made garment exports rose 4.75 per cent year-on-year to \$1.34 billion in July, while cumulative exports for April-July stood at \$5.53 billion, up 7.87 per cent from \$5.13 billion in the same period last year.

Consumer authority slaps Rs 10 lakh fine on Rapido for misleading ads, unfair trade practices

NEW DELHI: The Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) has imposed a penalty of Rs 10 lakh on ride-hailing platform Rapido for disseminating misleading advertisements and engaging in unfair trade practices. The action was taken suo motu by the authority following investigation into the company's advertisement claim: "Guaranteed Auto. Auto in 5 mins or get Rs 50".



The CCPA, in its order issued on Wednesday, directed Rapido to immediately discontinue the misleading advertisements and compensate consumers

who were not provided the promised cashback. Each affected consumer is to be paid Rs 50, as originally advertised. It also instructed the company to file a compli-

ance report within 15 days. According to CCPA, Rapido's misleading advertisement ran for over 18 months in multiple regional languages and across more than 120 cities.

"Therefore, the CCPA finds it necessary to impose a penalty to safeguard the interests of consumers," it said. As per the order, between April 2023 and May 2024, 575 complaints were filed against Rapido on the National Consumer Helpline and these covered issues such as non-refund of amounts, overcharging, service deficiency, and failure to provide promised

benefits. Of these, five complaints were directly related to the misleading "guaranteed auto" claim, which could only be redeemed against bike rides and expired within seven days. The authority found that these terms were neither clearly stated nor prominently displayed. In its defence, the company submitted that the terms and conditions were clear that customer.

AU\$90 million penalty: Qantas Airways fined for illegal sackings

Qantas: A judge in Australia fined Qantas Airways 90 million Australian dollars (\$59 million) for unlawfully dismissing more than 1,800 ground staff during the early stages of the Covid-19 pandemic. The penalty is in addition to the AU\$120 million (\$78 million) compensation the airline had already agreed to pay dismissed employees. Justice Michael Lee of the Australian Federal Court ruled that the dismissal of 1,820 baggage handlers and cleaners at

airports in late 2020 was the most serious breach of Australian labour laws in their 120-year history, according to the Associated Press. After Qantas's appeal was unanimously rejected by seven High Court judges last December, the airline confirmed its wrongdoing and agreed to pay AU\$120 million in compensation. The Transport Workers Union (TWU), which initiated the case, had sought the maximum penalty of AU\$121 million.

Pakistan flash floods: Over 320 dead in torrential downpours

Pakistan is grappling with relentless monsoon rains, as officials warn of even heavier downpours in the coming days. The death toll due to the flash flood continues to climb, killing at least 327 people in the country's north, bringing the nationwide toll to nearly 650 since the rains began on 26 June. On the Pakistan Meteorological Department issued a fresh alert, warning of heavier rainfall nationwide, from 17 to 21 August. It urged residents in the northwest to take "precautionary measures" amid fears of worsening floods. The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) said the downpours, which began earlier than usual this year, are expected

"When the Russians landed in Alaska, they were there to refuel. They had to offer to pay in cash to refuel their aeroplanes because they can't use our banking system," Rubio told NBC News. The Russian delegation was in Alaska for around five hours as part of a high-level summit with President Trump. While Trump confirmed that no ceasefire deal was reached, reports indicate Russia had



tabled an offer, with Trump encouraging Ukraine to consider it. However, no formal agreement emerged from the nearly three-hour meeting. On the broader sanctions debate, Rubio defended the current measures, stating, "every single sanction that was in place on the day he took over remains and the impact of all those sanctions remains."

He added that despite their severity, these sanctions have not altered the direction of the war in Ukraine. Responding to calls for stronger action, Rubio argued that imposing new sanctions could derail diplomatic engagement. "The minute we

take those steps, there is no one left in the world to go talk to the Russians and try to get them to the table to reach a peace agreement," he said. Online Gaming Bill 2025 passed in Lok Sabha

NEW DELHI: The Lok Sabha on Wednesday passed the Promotion and Regulation of Online Gaming Bill, 2025, amid protests by the Opposition. The legislation, which seeks to promote and regulate the online gaming sector, has drawn contrasting reactions — delighting the esports industry but sparking alarm in the multi-billion-dollar real money gaming market. The House was adjourned till Thursday following noisy protests, while the Rajya Sabha was adjourned till tomorrow. Despite the disruption, the Bill went through, creating a landmark moment for

one of India's fastest-growing industries. The legislation proposes the creation of a central regulatory body to oversee four key segments: esports, educational games, social gaming, and real money gaming. Among these, real money gaming platforms — such as poker and fantasy sports — face the biggest blow. The Bill's "Prohibitions" clause states: "No person shall offer, aid, abet, induce or otherwise indulge or engage in the offering of online money game and online money gaming service." It further bans banks and financial institutions from processing transactions for such platforms. Under the "Offences and Penalties" clause, service providers found offering real money games could face up to three years' imprisonment or fines of up to Rs 1 crore.

NEW DELHI: The 2025 Asia Cup will be played in the United Arab Emirates from September 9 to 28, the Asian Cricket Council (ACC) confirmed earlier this month, ending weeks of speculation over India's participation. The uncertainty had stemmed from the worsening political climate between India and Pakistan, with growing calls for boycotts of bilateral fixtures at global sporting events. India also announced their 15-member squad this week, with Pakistan doing so a few days earlier. Yet, the shadow



of geopolitics — which has repeatedly intersected with the Asia Cup — continues to loom large. **When Pakistan pulled out of Asia Cup in India** While India's absence from the 1986 edition in Sri Lanka remained the only time the Men in Blue skipped the tournament, Pakistan too had walked away from the continental event. strained political relations with New Delhi. It was a major setback at the time, not just for the tournament but for Asian cricket unity. The pull-out meant the event lost one of its most intense rivalries — India vs Pakistan. India retained the trophy that year, defeating Sri Lanka in the final, but the absence of Pakistan left a glaring void. The tensions persisted, and the scheduled 1993 Asia Cup was cancelled altogether due to continuing hostilities between the two nations.
