MYSURU Toll rises to 3 in helium cylinder blast

The death toll in the helium cylinder blast that occurred near the Mysuru Palace has risen to three, police said on Saturday. Lakshmi (29), a resident of Kamakshipalya in Bengaluru, succumbed to her injuries while undergoing treatment in KR Hospital, taking the toll to three, late on Friday, police officials said. She had suffered grievous injuries in the blast, including severe abdominal trauma, and despite intensive treatment, she could not be saved," a senior police officer said. Earlier, Saleem, the helium balloon seller, was killed on the spot on December 25. On Friday, another injured woman, identified as Manjula, also died while undergoing treatment at KR Hospital.

CHANDIGARH 'Hry BJP govt giving jobs to outsiders'

Haryana Congress president Rao Narendra Singh on Saturday launched a sharp attack on the ruling BJP government over its recruitment process asking whether "the youth of Haryana have become so incompetent that the government is compelled to give 70 to 80% of government jobs to candidates from other states." Stating that this is a direct assault on the rights of hardworking youth of Haryana, Singh said in a statement here that under a well-planned policy of the BJP government, large numbers of candidates from outside the state are being selected in recruitments for posts such as tutor, patwari, clerk, assistant engineer, civil judge, HCS, medical colleges, and the technical education department.

JAIPUR Cops rescue 53 tribals held hostage

Rajasthan police rescued 53 tribal laborers, including 13 women, held hostage in Solapur, Maharashtra. Lured from Pratappgarh with promises of high wages in Indore, the victims were instead sold to landlords for sugarcane farming. Brokers allegedly took advances totaling Rs27.5 lakh for the "sale" of these workers. The laborers reported being starved, beaten, and denied wages for two months. The ordeal ended after several workers escaped and alerted authorities. Following a complaint at Ghantali station, a special police team traveled 950 kilometers to liberate the group. A case has been registered against the middlemen.

Kharge flags SIR, Church attacks in CWC meeting

NEW DELHI

Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge on Saturday flagged the issue of "voter deletion" during the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in nine states and three UTs.

Kharge, backing Lok Sabha Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi's campaigns against alleged "vote theft", said that SIR is a "conspiracy to restrict" democratic rights.

"Today SIR is a matter of serious concern. It is a well-thought-out conspiracy to restrict democratic rights. Rahulji has repeatedly presented evidence of 'vote theft' before the country with facts and examples," Kharge said during his opening remark at the CWC meet.

"The collusion between the BJP and the Election Commission is well-known to all. Therefore, we must ensure that the names of our voters are not deleted," he added.

Kharge called party

members to ensure that the votes of marginalised communities are not removed or transferred to other booths.

"We must ensure that the names of people from poor and vulnerable sections, especially Dalits, Adivasis, Extremely Backward Classes, and minorities, are not removed from the voter list. Nor should they be TRANSFERRED to other booths. For

this, our BLAs will have to go door-to-door with the voter list," he said.

Kharge further called party members to start working unitedly for the upcoming Assam, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and Puducherry Assembly elections in April-May 2026 Kharge also raised the issue of the BJP "misusing" government agencies against the Opposition.

"Over the past 11 years, the country has seen how agencies like ED, IT, and CBI are being misused. The BJP and Sangh Parivar are engaged in tarnishing the image of our leaders on the NATIONAL HERALD issue. We are fighting a legal battle. 'Satyameva Jayate'—this is what Rahulji always says, and we will emerge victorious," he said.

Kharge concluded his speech by highlighting violence against Hindu minorities in Bangladesh and recent acts of vandalism during Christmas across the country.

"The attacks on Hindu minorities in Bangladesh in recent months have worried the entire country. We strongly condemn this. One more thing is on my mind. Two days ago, on the occasion of Christmas, people from the BJP, RSS, and related organisations in many areas worked to disrupt brotherhood and harmony. This has tarnished our image in the eyes of the world," he said.

Medical services hit in HP as docs go on strike

SHIMLA

Medical services, barring emergency services, were affected across several hospitals in Himachal Pradesh as resident doctors went on an indefinite strike on Saturday against the termination of services of a doctor who entered into a brawl with a patient.

The doctors maintained that the termination of the medic within 48 hours was unjustified and that there was resentment brewing among the medical fraternity.

Meanwhile, patients and attendants, especially those coming from remote locations, faced difficulties due to the unavailability of doctors.

The peak winter cold and unavailability of accommodation due to heavy tourist rush around the New Year are adding to their trouble, Thakur said, urging the government and the doctors to resolve the matter at the earliest in the interest of patients.

Reports of health services being affected due to the strike have poured in from Shimla, Dharamshala, Nahan, Hamirpur, Una and several other districts.

Doctors' strike won't last long: HP Health Minister

Shimla: Amid disruptions faced by patients in Himachal Pradesh's hospitals, including the main referral hospital, Indira Gandhi Medical College (IGMC), following the doctors' strike, state Health Minister Col. (Retd) Dhaniram Shandil on Saturday assured that medical services remain intact and the strike is unlikely to continue for long. Speaking to ANI, the Health Minister acknowledged that doctors have gone on strike but said the government had already taken steps to ensure uninterrupted emergency and indoor services across all health institutions.

Gandhi Medical College (IGMC) and several other government hospitals across the state had gone on casual leave en masse on Friday.

Announcing an indefinite strike from Saturday, the RDA

maintained that during the strike, routine services, elective operation theatres and Out Patient Departments (OPD) would remain closed and only emergency services would remain functional.

BJP uneasy as 15000 sadhus face SIR scrutiny in Ayodhya

The Special Intensive Revision of electoral rolls has thrown up an unexpected challenge in Ayodhya, where hundreds of sadhus and saints have filled voter forms in keeping with monastic traditions, raising fears of possible deletions from the voter list and causing unease within the BJP.

Ayodhya is home to more than 15,000 sadhus and saints residing largely in the Nirvani Ani, Digambar and Nirmohi akharas. During the SIR process, many of them entered the names of their gurus or Hindu deities in the column meant for the father's name. In the mother's name column, entries such as Kaushalya, Sita, Janaki, Durga and Saraswati were frequently written.

Sadhus are widely seen as a core support base of the BJP in the temple town, and party leaders privately concede that large scale rejection of such forms could have electoral implications. The concern has been amplified as the SIR exercise in Uttar Pradesh concluded on Friday with the deletion of nearly 2.89 crore names from the voter list, though the exact number of sadhus affected remains unclear.

Nirvani Ani Akhara mahant Sitaram Das, who filled his SIR form on December 10, said he consciously chose not to mention his biological parents. "I have renounced family life and follow the virakt tradition. Virakt means severing all blood relations. For us, there is no mother, no father and no gotra. God is everything. I



wrote Janaki Mata's name in the mother's column because she nurtures the entire universe," he said.

The practice of mentioning names linked to the Ramayana period is not new in Ayodhya. It was first adopted by former BJP MP and late Hindu Dharm Peethadheeshwar Dr Ram Vilas Das Vedanti, who had written Janaki Mata's name in the mother's column. Over time, saints from Digambar Akhara and Hanuman Garhi followed the same practice.

According to the Ayodhya Development Authority, the city has 60 wards and a population of around 24.7 lakh, comprising 12.6 lakh men and 12.1 lakh women. More than 15,000 residents are sadhus and saints living in temples, monasteries and akharas across the city.

A senior BJP leader from the Akwadh region termed the situation a serious concern for the party. Speaking on condition of anonymity, he said many saints were unaware that incorrect entries could lead to rejection of their forms. "If their forms are rejected,

sonally appealed to the saint community in Ayodhya to fill

in the names of their real parents. Some have done so, but their number is very small," he said.

Ayodhya mayor Girish Pati Tripathi said the matter has been taken up with the Uttar Pradesh Chief Electoral Officer. "We have spoken to the CEO, who has taken the issue seriously and issued specific instructions for Ayodhya. At present, there is no major problem," he said.

Deputy District Election Officer Aniruddh Pratap Singh said that while mentioning parents' names in the SIR form is mandatory, flexibility is being exercised in the case of sadhus residing in monasteries and temples. "The signature of the form applicant is being treated as sufficient proof. Saints who are unable to give their mother's name do not need to submit documentary proof related to the name entered in that column," he said.

He added that the filled SIR forms are sent to the sub divisional magistrate for scrutiny, where mapping with the 2003 voter list is carried out. "If discrepancies are found, notices are issued to the voters concerned for correction," Singh said.

Vigilance SSP suspended on graft charges

CHANDIGARH

The Punjab government on Saturday suspended the senior superintendent of police (SSP), vigilance, Amritsar, Lakhbir Singh on the charges of alleged irregularities in the tenders related to development works in the Ranjit Avenue area involving misappropriation of crores of rupees.

According to media reports, Singh was suspended and a social activist Mandeep Mann booked after an inquiry conducted by a senior officer detected irregularities in the use of development funds. The probe found that the funds released for infrastructure and development in the said area were allegedly misappropriated.

Reports said that a further probe is also underway so as to ascertain the extent of financial irregularities and find out other people's involvement in the case. However, according to unconfirmed reports, there were irregularities to the tune of about Rs 55 crore in the said case.

It may be recalled that Singh was appointed SSP, Vigilance in March this year and he had led the team that arrested senior Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) leader Bikram Singh Majithia in June this year in a drug-related money laundering case.

Family members of TMC MP and MLA summoned for SIR hearing

KOLKATA

Trinamool Congress (TMC) MP Kakoli Ghosh Dastidar and TMC MLA Nabin Chandra Bag's family members called for SIR hearing on the first day.

Both the Parliamentary and the Legislator slammed Election Commission (EC) for allegedly working at the behest of Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

Notably, Dastidar's mother Ira Mitra (90) and her sister Piyali Mitra are voters of Madhyamgram in north 24

parganas and her sons Biswanath and Baidyanath are voters of south Kolkata. A total of 32 lakh voters have been summoned by the EC across the state for the primary hearing.

"All of my family members are genuine voters. My mother and sister are registered at the booth where I am registered. My sons are well established doctors and have been voting for several years. EC is working on BJP's instruction and genuine voters' name is not on the list," said Dastidar.

Officers write to Nitish after Dy CM takes them to task

Bihar Revenue Service Association (BIRSA) has accused deputy chief minister Vijay Kumar Sinha of "humiliating" its members as revenue officers have written to chief minister Nitish Kumar, threatening to boycott public grievance redressal sessions in future if corrective measures were not taken immediately.

Sinha, who is also holding the portfolio of revenue and land reforms department, earned revenue officers' wrath after he issued a stern warning to them against collusion with land mafia in the state. He said that "erring" officials would be identified and brought to book. He has also started holding the "Bhumi Sudhar Jankalyan Samvad" (public grievance redressal

sessions) for addressing and related matters in districts.

Meanwhile, Bihar Revenue Service Association has lodged a formal complaint with the chief minister, accusing Sinha of humiliating revenue officials during public grievance redressal sessions. The offices alleged that Sinha was using language that undermined constitutional norms and administrative decorum.

In a letter sent to Nitish, the Association alleged that officers were being publicly humiliated and threatened in the name of swift justice.

Officers threatened if such "humiliation" were not stopped immediately, its officers would be forced to boycott such programmes in future. After assuming charge of the department, Sinha had held public dialogues in dis-

tricts such as Patna, Muzaffarpur and Purnea, where he listened to people's complaints in the presence of departmental officers.

Officers objected to the deputy chief minister's remarks allegedly made during public hearings such as "We will suspend you on the spot," "Answer here in front of the public," and "Immediate decisions will be taken."

The deputy CM, who claimed he was not aware of such a letter, asserted that "he would not succumb to any pressure and that action would be taken against those who were found indulging in wrongdoing.

Regarding officers' allegations of insulting and abusing members, deputy chief minister said that in public interactions, no one was abused or insulted.

Big-ticket investments likely to propel India's FDI in 2026

MUMBAI

Foreign direct investment into India is set to gather fresh momentum in 2026, underpinned by resilient macroeconomic fundamentals, large-scale corporate commitments, policy stability and a new generation of investment-linked trade agreements.

The government continues to review FDI policy on an ongoing basis, refining rules after consultations with industry. The DPIIT has held multiple stakeholder meetings this year, while Commerce and Industry



Minister Piyush Goyal has emphasised faster, smoother and more efficient approval processes, PTI reported on Saturday. India received FDI worth \$80.62 billion in 2024–25 despite global uncertainty, with gross inflows exceeding \$60 billion between January and October 2025. DPIIT has said inflows in 2026 could surpass last year's record. A key driver is the FTA with the European Free Trade

Association, under which Switzerland, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein have committed \$100 billion. On the pact's entry into force in October 2025, Swiss healthcare major Roche announced an investment of 1.5 billion Swiss francs in India. New Zealand has pledged a further \$20 billion under its forthcoming trade pact. Global majors are scaling up. Microsoft plans to invest \$17.5 billion by 2030, Amazon \$35 billion over five years, and Google \$15 billion to establish an AI hub. Apple and Samsung are expanding manufacturing, while ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel is increasing capacity.

Rupee may remain weak in 2026?

The Indian rupee is expected to show more weakness going ahead into 2026, according to a report by MUGF, a global financial group. It expects the Indian rupee to appreciate modestly above the 90 level in 2026, targeting 90.80 by the September 2026 quarter. "We have already been expecting INR to weaken and underperform, although we note FX outflow pressures have been more acute than we have anticipated thus far. "Our forecasts also imply continued INR weakness against key FX crosses such as EUR (Euro), JPY (Japanese yen) and CNY (Chinese Yuan)," the report read.

Resolution of RIL's \$247 mn dispute with GoI likely in 2026

Mumbai:

Reliance Industries, the operator of KG-D6 oil block since 2002, is contesting the government of India's \$247 million claim for additional profit petroleum from KG-D6 in an international arbitration. As this process enters its last leg, a resolution can be expected in 2026, Money Control has reported.

The dispute arose over GoI's post-facto stand to disallow a part of money already invested by the consortium of Reliance Industries, bp and Niko in the KG-D6 block for creating drilling and evacuation infrastructure, in spite of the NELP agreement allowing for full cost recovery to an operator.

Exploration for petroleum reserves is a high-risk busi-

ness, and the production sharing contracts under NELP explicitly allow an operator to first recover all its development costs fully, before the government's profit share begins – in addition to royalty as well as taxes. Accordingly, the government constantly overrules, approves and audits every expenditure incurred by the operator.

Under the PSC, a management committee is set up with two government representatives, who hold veto power on every decision. The operator consortium cannot implement any decision, or spend any money, without prior approval of the management committee.

Failure as engine!

India must shed its discomfort with insolvency and bankruptcy if it is to foster a confident, risk-taking economy, according to Sanjeev Sanyal, a member of the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister.

Speaking to ANI, Sanyal said a healthy economic system requires "continuous churn", in which inefficient firms exit and new enterprises emerge. Such renewal, he argued, is vital for sustaining long-term growth and competitiveness.

He said the failure of even large companies should not be viewed as a systemic weakness. Recalling the stress faced by Indian banks in 2017, Sanyal said the decision to allow several major corporates to go bankrupt ultimately strengthened the economy. The clean-up, he



noted, left the corporate sector more resilient and disciplined. Using aviation as an example, he said the collapse of Jet Airways created room for other carriers to expand. Companies that fail to comply with rules or maintain standards, he added, should be allowed to close.

Sanyal also urged society not to begrudge success, while underlining the need for regulators to step in when dominant firms misuse their power or distort competition.

Married Woman Murdered by Husband, Father-in-law, and Mother-in-law, All Arrested

Kaushambi. In Kherwa Majra Baraula village under Manjhanpur police station, a married woman was poisoned to death by her in-laws on Thursday night. The woman died a painful death after suffering intensely. The husband, mother-in-law, and father-in-law were constantly demanding dowry. When the dowry demands were not met, the greedy husband, father-in-law, and mother-in-law repeatedly beat and tortured the woman. The atrocities of the in-laws reached their limit on the night of December 25th when the husband, mother-in-law, and father-in-law poisoned and murdered the woman. The woman's mother, Sunita Devi, a resident of Chandupur Amrayan, Sarai Akil police station, informed the Manjhanpur police and demanded that a case be registered for the murder of her daughter and that the accused be arrested. The Manjhanpur police registered case number 449/25 under sections 80(2)/85 of the BNS and 3/4 of the DP Act. The police arrested the husband, Rajesh Gupta, son of Arjun Prasad Gupta; the father-in-law, Arjun Prasad Gupta, son of Chhotelal Gupta; and the mother-in-law, Rajkumari, wife of Arjun Prasad Gupta, all residents of Kherwa Majra Baraula village, Manjhanpur police station. After legal proceedings, the police sent the accused to court.

Youth beaten in dispute over removing parked motorcycles outside a shop

Kaushambi: On Friday evening, in Garhi Bazar Raksoli under the Paschim Sharira police station area, some people had parked their motorcycles outside a tea and snack shop and were having refreshments inside. The goons also damaged the motorcycles parked outside the shop with sticks and rods. When Brijesh protested, he was verbally abused and threatened with death. The victim has filed a complaint at the Paschim Sharira police station, requesting that an FIR be registered and action be taken.

Police teams investigate robbery of cloth merchant

On Friday evening, masked robbers looted cash at gunpoint from a wholesale cloth merchant's shop located on the Lucknow-Pratapgarh National Highway. The incident has spread panic among the traders in the area. Nawabganj police, who arrived on the scene, were busy identifying the culprits based on CCTV footage late into the night. Dinesh Kesarwani runs a wholesale cloth shop called 'Virat Traders' near the Lal Gopalganj intersection on the Lucknow highway. On Friday, at around 6:15 pm, three robbers



arrived on a motorcycle, parked their vehicle some distance from the shop, and entered on foot. All three had their faces covered with cloth and were carrying pistols. As soon as they

entered the shop, one of the robbers pointed a pistol at Dinesh Kesarwani's younger brother, Dilip Kesarwani, who was at the counter. The robber went straight to the cash

register and took all the cash. After committing the crime in just a few moments, the three robbers went outside and fled towards Kunda on a black motorcycle. The sudden incident terrified

the shopkeeper and the people present in the shop. As soon as the news of the robbery spread, nearby traders gathered at the spot. Upon receiving the information, Nawabganj Station House Officer Raghavendra Singh and Lal Gopalganj in-charge Saurabh Pandey reached the spot with police force. The police examined the CCTV camera footage installed in the shop to identify the culprits and determine their escape route. ACP Suv Shyam Ji Pramila Singh said that the robbers escaped with approximately one lakh rupees. The investigation is underway. On Saturday, the day after

the incident, Police Commissioner Joginder Kumar, DCP Ganganagar Kuldeep Singh Gunawat, Crime Branch and SOG, along with police from Soraon and Nawabganj police stations, reached the spot. DCP Ganganagar Kuldeep Singh Gunawat said that the incident occurred when the businessman's agent returned to the shop after collecting money from the Pratapgarh area.

Seven teams have been formed to investigate the case. CCTV footage is being examined. The culprits will be arrested and appropriate action will be taken soon.

Citizens struggling to obtain birth and death certificates; disarray at the Tehsil office exacerbates the problem

Ghazipur: Citizens in the Mohammadabad Tehsil area of the district are facing immense difficulties in obtaining birth and death certificates. Despite months passing, birth certificates for newborns and death certificates for deceased family members are not being issued, leading to widespread anger among the people. Citizens allege that even when the Municipal Council sends the files to the Tehsil office, the arbitrary and negligent behavior of the officer in charge of issuing birth and death certificates, Vijay Srivastava, is causing the problem to worsen. Hundreds of applications are pending, but they are neither being processed on time nor are applicants being given accurate information. The situation is particularly frustrating when people visit the Tehsil office to inquire about the status of their applications. It is reported that the officer in charge is often unavailable at the office, and even when he is present, he fails to provide satisfactory answers. This is causing difficulties for parents of newborns in accessing government schemes, school admissions, and other essential services, while the lack of death certificates is causing significant problems for families in matters related to pensions, insurance, banking, and other necessary tasks. Local citizens say that this serious problem is either not reaching the attention of higher authorities, or it is being deliberately ignored. If this disarray is not addressed promptly, the situation could become even more critical. The people have appealed to the District Magistrate and other concerned higher authorities to immediately review the process of issuing birth and death certificates, take action against negligent employees, and ensure a transparent and time-bound system so that the general public can get relief.

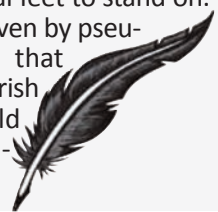

Editorial

Halal certification is turning into a scam. It's creating a Muslim-only economy

Halal is the latest Islamic fad. The internet is buzzing with content on Halal living, Halal dating, and even Halal sex. Halal certification is a booming global industry created by New Islam. A religion that has so far been proudly political is becoming brazenly commercial too. And why not, when catchphrases like "Islam is the complete way of life"—making detailed prescriptions for politics, economy, and every imaginable aspect of life—go unchallenged? In an ongoing Supreme Court case, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta submitted that while nobody had any objection to Halal certification for meat, nowadays even cement, iron rods, and bottled water were being certified as Halal. Since such certification comes at a cost—charged by private agencies in the Halal certification business—even customers who have no interest in such labels are being made to pay higher prices for the commodities thus certified. Halal certification preys on the naïveté of the newly prosperous Muslim masses. The Indian economy has been steadily growing, and Muslims have shared in this prosperity as much as anyone else. But this upward mobility has to be matched by enhanced self-esteem and social respectability, which, for a Muslim, still comes through overt piety and demonstrative religiosity. The Halal industry sows such fervour and reaps a good harvest from it. In the process, not entirely unwittingly, it also fosters a narrow and rigid religious attitude among Muslims—one that leads, inevitably, to radicalisation. The growth of the Indian economy has placed unprecedented purchasing power in Muslim hands too. And though the Halal certification business is aimed at tapping into the vast and growing Muslim market, it is bound to have some insidious and unforeseen consequences. For one, it will result in economic separatism, creating a Muslim-only parallel economy. In effect, it will lead to the systemic economic boycott of other communities. Stray calls to boycott Muslim street vendors, which keep circulating on social media, are a red herring compared to the harm the Halal market is insinuating into the political economy. Its normalisation and mainstreaming will have far-reaching consequences for inter-community relations—even greater than what Muslim Personal Law or vote bank politics have had so far. If a non-Muslim were to buy and sell in the Halal market, he would have to comply with the terms prescribed by Sharia, as interpreted by the agents of Halal certification. In such a market, they would be second-class citizens. Dhimmis. We would have the economic version of an Islamic state. Having suffered from the Two-Nation Theory, are we now sleepwalking into a Two-Economy reality? The path is nearly charted as a parallel economy develops around Islamic banking, Halal stocks, Halal mutual funds, Halal investments, and Halal travels. This trend will eventually lead to demands for the Halal certification of India itself as a country fit for Muslims. Then for the Constitution as a document that doesn't conflict with Sharia. And, as has already been happening informally, Halal certification for political parties—determining whether it is right for a Muslim to vote for some of them. One wonders, why should the religious lens be used to look at everything from iron rods and cement to electric wires and batteries? How will someone who looks at iron and cement through an Islamic filter see people of other religions? An outlook like this, even if genuinely Islamic, would have no place in the modern world. But as I will show in the latter part of this article, this isn't even Islamic. It has no precedence in history or theological feet to stand on. It's pop Islam—faux piety, driven by pseudo-Islamic power theology that seeks to paint the world in garish green. It divides the world between Islamic and non-Islamic and posits .



Deep State is the convenient bogeyman of modern politics. It's entered India too

Circa 1900: Rudyard Kipling wrote *Kim*, placing the eponymous hero at the centre of the Great Game of espionage between the British Empire and Russia in the 19th century. The book is set after the Second Anglo-Afghan War, which ended in 1881, but before the Third, likely in the period 1893–98. Kim, short for Kimball O'Hara, is an impoverished Irish orphan who lives on the streets of Lahore and works for Mahbub Ali, a Pashtun horse trader. He later befriends an aged Tibetan lama, accompanies him on his journey along the Grand Trunk Road, learns about the Great Game, and is eventually recruited by Mahbub Ali, who works for the British Secret Service in their quest to extend influence in both Afghanistan and Tibet. Whether or not the Great Game—the expression used by British imperialists to describe the perceived expansion of Russian influence in Afghanistan, Central Asia, and Tibet—actually existed, the fact remains that surveys were undertaken, expeditions mounted, spymasters recruited, and novels written, even as soldiers lost their lives. Taking a cue from Viceroy George Curzon, all pro-establishment papers—from the Civil and Military Gazette of Lahore to *The Pioneer* of Lucknow, *The Statesman* of Calcutta (now Kolkata), and *The Times* of India of Bombay (now Mumbai)—concurred that Tsarist Russia posed a real threat to the jewel in Britain's crown. A hundred and twenty years later, histo-



rians remain sceptical of Curzon's assertions. Is the hue and cry about the Deep State similar to the Great Game? Whether or not it exists, whether it operates in all countries, and whether the 'deep state' of one country is connected with others through the dark web or entrenched corporate interests remains unclear, as the discourse is more ideological than empirical. Sometimes, those who claim to be part of the deep state ascribe to themselves a larger-than-life role in state affairs—for example, AS Dulat and Asad Durrani in their 2018 book *The Spy Chronicles: RAW, ISI and the Illusion of Peace*. Their claim to be arbiters of one of the most tense and difficult relationships in the region has been widely critiqued by reviewers. The term first gained wide currency in the context of Türkiye as *derin devlet*, which literally translates to "deep state" in English. In Türkiye, it refers to a non-elected military elite dominating elected governments, especially when they attempt to dismantle the secular foundations of the Republic, established by Mustafa Kemal Pasha after

the abolition of the caliphate in 1923. In Pakistan, "deep state" refers to a government controlled by powerful military leaders, as documented by Stephen Cohen in *The Idea of Pakistan* and Ishfaq Ahmed in *Pakistan: The Garrison State*. Elected governments in Pakistan have rarely exercised real control over defense and foreign policy. In the US, Democrats and Republicans accuse each other of controlling the 'deep state.' Democrats claim the pro-Republican arms lobby and military-industrial complex constitute the deep state, while Republicans argue that Ivy League universities promote 'wokeism' and diversity, equity, and inclusion narratives that, according to Donald Trump, undermine America's greatness. Trump has accused the deep state within the Democratic regime of election interference, citing the Freedom Medal awarded to George Soros as evidence. However, skeptics argue that if the deep state were so powerful, how could Daksh Patel dismantle it simply by firing 'interns and associates' whose tenure is co-terminus

with that of President Biden? Ultimately, the deep state serves as a convenient scapegoat for anything that goes wrong or for political parties losing popular support. If Republicans and Democrats are battling it out in Washington, India faces a similar scenario, with Left liberals and Right nationalists accusing each other of leveraging the 'deep state' to gain or retain power. Publications like *The Caravan* and *Organiser Weekly* lead these respective narratives. Left liberals claim the RSS is India's deep state, while Right nationalists accuse the Ford Foundation and George Soros' Open Society Foundations of attempting to discredit the democratically elected Modi government. Left liberals find support in the speeches of Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi, while Right nationalists, led by Vice President Dhankhar, minister Kiren Rijiju, and BJP spokespersons like Sambit Patra, vehemently counter these claims. In a pre-budget article for *The Indian Express*, economist Surjit Bhalla, a former member of the PM's Economic Advisory Council, alleged that India's deep state comprises "major industrialists, senior IAS babus, and their friendly influencers in the media", slowing down economic growth. This claim was firmly repudiated, point by point, by Vivek Kaul in *Newsland*, who questioned the logic behind such allegations.

Kaul argued that neither the IAS, corporates, nor the media benefit from econom-

ic deceleration. Instead, he pointed out that the real cause of economic slowdown is the compulsion of all political parties—BJP, Congress, and AAP—to allocate budgetary resources to freebies rather than long-term investments in social and physical infrastructure, which are crucial for sustained economic growth. Journalist Josy Joseph, in his book *The Silent Coup: A History of India's Deep State*, argues that the deep state is actually led by the IPS. He claims that in the name of combating terrorism in Punjab, Jammu and Kashmir, and the Northeast, as well as 'Left-wing extremism' (LWE) in Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra, Jharkhand, and Andhra Pradesh, the triumvirate of the NIA, CBI, and ED have consolidated unchecked power, with neither the legislature nor the judiciary exercising adequate oversight. He documents human rights violations of individuals caught in the crosshairs of state action. Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist Steve Coll offers another perspective, alleging that India's deep state mainly comprises serving and retired IFS officials. However, if the IAS, IPS, and IFS were truly dominant, why would they have allowed the creation of the Department of Military Affairs under the Chief of Defence Staff, effectively relegating the Defence Secretary (an IAS officer) to a largely ceremonial role? A completely contrarian view is presented by Sandhya Ravishankar, news editor at NDTV Profit.

India's GST system is now a mess. Those who designed it also are confused

While this may seem like a trivialisation of GST, it actually lays bare how the system has now rebounded on its initial promise of bringing ease of doing business in the country. The Finance Minister's four-minute explanation on the taxation of popcorn highlighted how complex the system has become. It shouldn't take anybody that much time to explain the applicable tax rates on a single product. Since then, GST has been ridiculed, derided, lamented about, and generally panned by laypeople and even former government officials who worked on its implementation. So, what is the issue behind GST on popcorn? You see, as per the taxman, depending on your taste preferences, popcorn can either be a namkeen (salty) or a mithai (sweet)—forget that those two terms have never been used by anyone to refer to popcorn. Ready-to-eat popcorn,

salted and spiced for taste, and sold loosely attracts a GST rate of 5 per cent. That same popcorn, if packaged and labelled, attracts a rate of 12 per cent. One wonders what happens if the vendor tears open the packet and sells loose popcorn to the customer. Perhaps the universe will explode, who knows? Things get even trickier when you talk about caramel popcorn. Those who prefer this flavour will have to shell out 18 per cent GST, regardless of whether it is packaged or sold loose. Then some head to the movie hall and ask for salted and caramel popcorn mixed together. What happens to them? Over the week, one particular meme stood out among the lot. It was a picture of salted caramel popcorn packets with questions along the lines of "What now, taxman?" What now, indeed. Most of the memes were at Sitharaman's expense.

Tax cuts won't fix low growth. Govt must look beyond fiscal policy

The Modi government's main move in the Union Budget 2025 has been to cut personal income tax. As finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman said in her speech, it is meant to boost demand in the economy. However, the government doesn't expect a higher-than-usual increase in other non-debt receipts and has budgeted a decline in the deficit. The budgeted capital expenditure is the same as the revised estimates for 2024-25. The tax cut should be seen in the context of other fiscal policy moves the Modi government has made in the last decade to boost growth. Since 2016, the Indian economy has struggled to sustain rapid growth. From 2016 to 2019, it was in a relentless showdown, with GDP growth falling to 3.9 per cent in 2019-20. The GDP then fell sharply in 2020-21 due to the pandemic. After this sharp decline, high GDP growth numbers created a false sense of complacency, but the compound annual growth rate between 2019-20 and 2024-25 is only 4.8 per cent. The latest GDP estimates suggest that the economy is slowing down again—with growth clocking at 5.4 per cent in the July-September quarter of 2024. Even if we set aside the critiques of GDP estimation in India, growth remains a topic of concern in policy conversations. The government's response to an economic challenge depends on what it considers to be the root cause. The Modi government's actions over the past decade suggest that it seeks to address India's economic growth pangs through fiscal policy. Consequently, fiscal policy has done much of the heavy lifting in the government's growth strategy over the past decade. In the economic slowdown from 2016-17 to 2019-20, the government sought to maintain its expenditure. To do so without increasing the reported fiscal deficit, from 2017-18 to 2019-20, it

transformed a significant part of its on-budget expenditure into off-budget expenditure done by public enterprises. It also sharply raised cesses and surcharges on petroleum products, which are not shared with the states. These unusual tactics allowed the government to spend more, and expenditure continued to outpace GDP growth. These tactics also allowed the government to introduce new cash transfer schemes such as PM KISAN and increase allocations to existing schemes. In 2019, in an effort to stimulate investment, the government announced major tax breaks for corporates, especially in manufacturing. At the time, corporate tax collection had been growing rapidly while other taxes were struggling to deliver the budgeted increase. The tax cut led to a sharp reduction in the corporate tax to GDP ratio in the subsequent years. As the pandemic hit, fiscal policy became even more central. The pandemic allowed the government to suspend its concern for deficits and bring the off-budget expenditure to the Budget in 2020-21. For a few years, revenue expenditure as a percentage of GDP was higher than its pre-pandemic levels. Among other things, this allowed the government to increase subsidies and cash transfers, and introduce production-linked incentives for manufacturing in India. Total subsidies as a percentage of GDP have now gone back to their pre-pandemic levels. The most important change in expenditure since the pandemic has been in its composition. Of the Union government's total expenditure, the share of capital expenditure has increased. Its share rose from 12.5 per cent of total expenditure in 2019-20 to 22.2 per cent in 2023-24. In 2019-20, capital expenditure was 1.67 per cent of GDP. It rose to 3.21 per cent.

Why Syrians Are Between A Rock And A Hard Place

The replacement of the much-reviled Bashar al-Assad regime in Syria by a so-called "rebel force" that is actually just an Islamist offshoot of al-Qaeda and ISIS—which, remember, was headquartered in the Syrian city of Raqqa from 2014 to 2017—once again underlines how the turbulent history of that region is painted in countless shades of grey. As if the ongoing war between Israel and the equally Islamist Hamas left you in any doubt about that, of course. The Assads had ruled Syria with a mix of fear and murderous brutality for over 50 years. But that family, their Ba'ath Party and that general cohort were not religious fanatics. In fact,

they professed the sort of secular socialism which evolved into the crony socialism-cum-authoritarianism seen in many countries ruled by similarly inclined people and parties. Even India and the Congress Party of the mid-1970s were not unlike Syria during that same period. The difference, of course, is that the Emergency in India marked the apogee and also the end of authoritarianism. India never degenerated into a single-party rule—which appears to be the main cause of the rise of the Islamist factions all over West Asia today. Ironically, authoritarian secularism (and in Syria's case, also minority rule by the Shia Alawite tribe of the Assads) has

led to the ascent of doctrinaire Sunni Islam and power being captured by its adherents. As the news channels broke the news of the fall of Assad's government in Syria, I saw London's Oxford Street become an impromptu victory procession of cars with young men honking, shouting and hanging out of windows brandishing their homeland's distinctive opposition flag. It continued for well over an hour without any of London's uniformed finest visible. Maybe the Metropolitan Police were just relieved it was not yet another fraught pro-Gaza demonstration. But having lived in Syria during the regime of this just-ousted socialist dic-

tator's father, I had mixed feelings. How would those fashionably puffer-jacket-clad Syrians cheering in London fare under the country's new rulers whose roots are in the Salafijihadist school although they profess to have "moved" to a more accommodating position? Do Syrians not know what's happening in Afghanistan, whose Taliban rulers mouthed similar lines and then recanted? When my father was India's ambassador to Syria, the then President Hafez al-Assad ordered the Hama massacre in 1982, triggered by a long-brewing uprising in that city 200km north of Damascus by the Muslim Brotherhood.

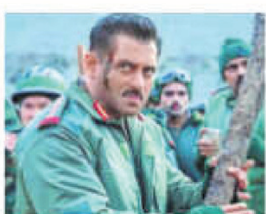

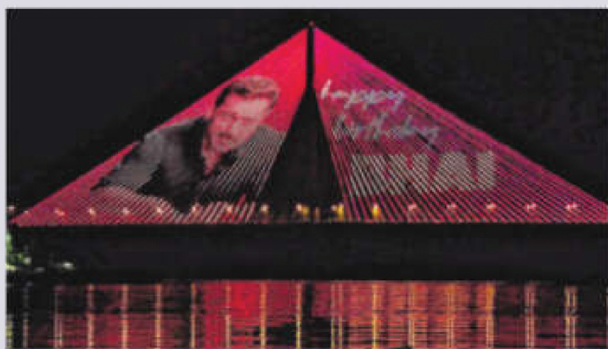
Bandra-Worli Sea Link illuminated

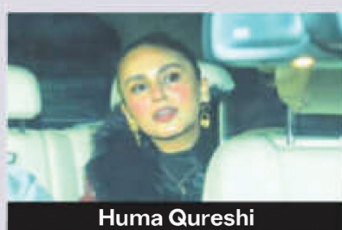


Battle of Galwan teaser out

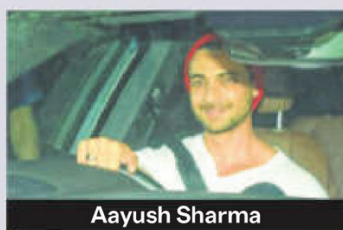

Italy nabs 9 for Hamas funding

ROME Italian authorities arrested nine people linked to three charitable organisations on suspicion of raising millions of euros in funds for the Palestinian militant group Hamas, anti-terrorism prosecutors said in a statement on Saturday.

The suspects are accused of sending €7 million euros (\$8.2 million) to “associations based in Gaza, the Palestinian territories, or Israel, owned, controlled, or linked to Hamas,” the statement said.

Among those arrested was Mohammad Hannoun, president of the Palestinian Association in Italy, prosecutors said, describing him as the “head of the Italian cell of the Hamas organisation.”

The EU has Hamas listed on its terror list.

Heatwaves, wildfires, droughts, storms cost world over \$120b: Report

Heatwaves, wildfires, droughts and storms cost the global economy more than US \$120 billion in 2025, underscoring the rising financial and human toll of climate change, a new report by UK-based non-governmental organisation Christian Aid said.

According to the analysis, extreme weather events intensified across continents this year, with the most expensive disasters concentrated in richer countries where insured losses are higher, even as poorer nations suffered widespread devastation with limited financial protection.

“These disasters are not natural. They are the predictable result of continued fossil fuel expansion and political delay,” said Joanna Haigh, Emeritus Professor at Imperial College London.

COSTLIEST CLIMATE EVENTS

The 10 most financially damaging climate events of

2025 each caused losses running into billions of dollars, with combined damages exceeding US \$122 billion, the report said.

Most of the figures reflect insured losses alone, suggesting the true economic impact is likely to be significantly higher, while human suffering often remains uncounted.

The US bore the largest financial burden, with wildfires in California topping the list as the single costliest event, causing an estimated \$60 billion in damage and over 400 deaths.

Cyclones and floods across Southeast Asia ranked second, inflicting \$25 billion in losses and killing over 1,750 people across Thailand, Indonesia, Sri Lanka, Vietnam and Malaysia. Devastating floods in China followed, displacing thousands, killing at least 30 people and causing \$11.7 billion in damage.

“No continent was spared from crippling climate disasters in 2025,” the report said, noting at least one major event struck each of the world’s six populated regions.

ASIA AMONG WORST HIT

Asia accounted for four of the six costliest disasters. Flooding in India and Pakistan killed over 1,860 people, cost up to \$6 billion and affected over 7 million people in Pakistan alone.

Typhoons in the Philippines caused over \$5 billion in damage and displaced around 1.4 million people.

Other severe events included drought in Brazil, summer wildfires in Spain and Portugal, and cyclones that hit Australia and Reunion Island off Africa’s coast earlier in the year.

While the top 10 disasters were ranked by financial losses, Christian Aid emphasised some most devastating

events occurred in poorer countries where insurance coverage is low and data is scarce.

POOR NATIONS BEAR THE HIDDEN COST

Flooding in Nigeria in May and in the Democratic Republic of Congo in April hit thousands, with Nigeria alone reporting up to 700 deaths. Prolonged drought in Iran and across West Asia threatened water supplies for around 10 million people in Tehran, raising the prospect of mass evacuation.

The report also highlighted unusually severe events such as record-breaking heat that sparked wildfires in the Scottish Highlands, burning 47,000 hectares, and Japan’s experience of both extreme snowstorms and record heatwaves in the same year.

Climate-related extremes were also recorded in Antarctica and the world’s oceans, with record sea temperatures and coral bleaching in Western Australia posing major threats to biodiversity.

CALL FOR URGENT ACTION

Christian Aid said the events of 2025 underline the urgent need to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, accelerate the transition away from fossil fuels and increase funding for climate adaptation in vulnerable regions. “This year has again shown the stark reality of climate breakdown,” said Patrick Watt, CEO of Christian Aid. “Violent storms, devastating floods and prolonged droughts are turning lives and livelihoods upside down. The poorest communities are first and worst affected.”

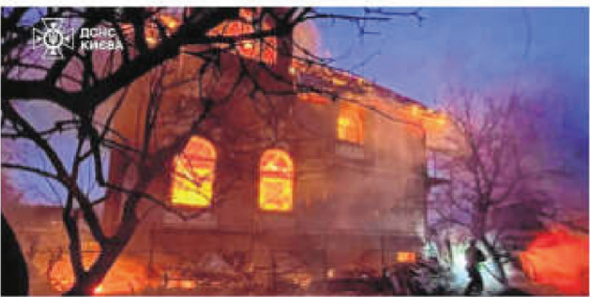
“The climate disasters are a warning of what lies ahead if we do not accelerate the transition away from fossil fuels. They underline the urgent need for adaptation, particularly in the global South, where resources are stretched and people are vulnerable to climate shocks,” he said.

PEACE TALKS | Zelenskyy heads to Florida to meet Trump

Prez: Kyiv strikes show Putin’s true attitude

KYIV Russia attacked Ukraine’s capital with missiles and drones early on Saturday morning, killing one person and wounding 27, a day before talks between Ukraine and the US, authorities said.

Explosions boomed across Kyiv for hours as ballistic missiles and drones hit the city. The attack began in the early morning hours on Saturday and was continuing as the day broke. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy is prepared to meet US President Donald Trump in Florida on Sunday for further talks on ending the nearly 4-year-old war. Zelenskyy told reporters he was on a plane en route to



Florida on Saturday afternoon, and would stop in Canada on the way to meet Prime Minister Mark Carney.

Russian Defence Ministry said it carried out a “massive strike” overnight, using “long-range precision-guided weapons from land, air and sea, including Kinzhal hypersonic aeroballistic missiles” and drones. It said it targeted

energy infrastructure facilities used by Ukraine’s forces and military-industrial enterprises. The ministry said the strike came in response to Ukraine’s attacks on “civilian objects” in Russia.

Poland scrambled fighter jets and closed airports in Lublin and Rzeszow near the border with Ukraine for several hours during the Russian

attacks, the country’s armed forces command said on X. There was no violation of Polish airspace. Civil aviation authority Pansa said the two airports had since resumed operations. It was unclear what caused the alert in Poland.

Zelenskyy said the main target was energy and civilian infrastructure in Kyiv. In some districts, there is no electricity or heating. “Today, Russia demonstrated how it responds to peace talks between Ukraine and the US on ending Russia’s war against Ukraine. They carried out massive attacks on Ukraine precisely as we move toward peace negotiations,” said Zelenskyy, speaking to reporters via audio note while travelling. “That is Russia’s response.”



FULL-SCALE ATTACK Switzerland cannot defend self: Army chief

Zurich: Switzerland cannot defend itself against a full-scale attack and must boost military spending given rising risks from Russia, the head of its armed forces said.

The country is prepared for attacks by “non-state actors” on critical infrastructure and for cyber attacks, but its military still faces major equipment gaps, **Thomas Suessli** told NZZ newspaper.

“What we cannot do is defend against threats from a distance or even a full-scale attack on our country,” said Suessli, who is stepping down at the end of the year.

US air travel hit, 1600 flights cancelled and 7400 delayed

Thousands of flights across the US have been cancelled or delayed as the north-east braces for a severe winter storm during the peak holiday travel season. As of Friday night, 1,600 flights had been cancelled and 7,400 delayed, as per flight tracking website FlightAware.

The most affected airports are John F Kennedy International, Newark Liberty, and LaGuardia, which all serve the New York area. Boston, Chicago, and Toronto, Canada, are also impacted. The National Weather Service issued a winter storm warning from 16:00 local time on Friday until 13:00 on Saturday, with as much as 23cm of snow expected in New York and southern Connecticut.

On social media, airports



JetBlue Airways cancelled 229 flights, while Delta Air Lines scrapped 241 flights. Republic Airways and Southwest Airlines cancelled 180 and 151 flights respectively. About 100 scheduled flights by American Airlines and United Airlines were also cancelled.

On social media, airports

were warning travellers to check with their airline to determine the status of their flights.

The heaviest snow was expected between 18:00 local time and midnight. Drivers were warned of hazardous conditions and advised to bring an emergency supply kit, BBC reported on Saturday.

Maduro seeks talks with US

Caracas: Venezuelan President **Nicolas Maduro** has expressed willingness to hold talks with the US based on mutual respect, provided the US gives up interference in Venezuela.

In a televised speech on Friday (local time), Maduro said if the US side is willing to engage in dialogue with Venezuela on the basis of mutual respect and abandon its failed attempts to interfere in Venezuela over the past 25 years, he will welcome it and seek a path toward peace, cooperation and prosperity.

Rahman registers as B’deshi voter

Dhaka: BNP acting chairman Tarique Rahman on Saturday completed the formalities to enlist himself on Bangladesh’s voter list and obtain a national identity (NID) card, two days after his return from over 17 years of self-exile in London.

The 60-year-old leader of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party visited the Election Commission office in Dhaka under tight security, where he provided fingerprints and iris scans for biometric enrolment, news portal tbsnews.net reported.

Meanwhile, Awami League, banned by the interim government from contesting the elections, in an article, claimed Rahman is “receiving one privilege after another,

with repeated violations of the law”. “After the announcement of the election schedule, becoming a new voter is legally prohibited; yet questions have arisen about Tarique Rahman becoming a voter while that schedule was still in effect. Moreover, the day was a Saturday, a weekly govt holiday. So how was the law followed, and under whose instructions?” it asked.

African regional bodies reject Israel’s recognition of Somaliland

Nairobi: Africa’s regional governance bodies on Saturday rejected the recognition of Somalia’s breakaway region of Somaliland as an independent nation by Israel a day ago, the first by any country in more than 30 years.

Somaliland declared independence from Somalia in 1991 amid a descent into conflict and, despite having its own government and currency, had never been recognised by any nation in the world until Friday.

African Union chairperson Mahmoud Ali Youssouf said any attempt to undermine Somalia’s sovereignty risks peace and stability on the continent. The commission “firmly rejects any initiative or action aimed at recognising Somaliland as an independent entity, recalling Somaliland remains an integral part of the Federal Republic of Somalia.”

Massive crash on Japan’s highway kills 2, as holiday season starts

Tokyo: A massive crash involving 67 vehicles in snowy weather has killed two people and injured 26 on an expressway in Japan as the country kicked off its end-of-year holiday season.

The Gunma prefectural highway police said on Saturday the pileup on the Kan-etsu Expressway late on Friday started with a collision between two trucks in Minakami, about 160 km

northwest of Tokyo.

The initial crash blocked parts of the expressway, and cars coming from behind them were unable to brake on the snowy surface.

A fire erupted at the far end of the pileup, spreading to 20 vehicles, some of which were completely burned. The fire was extinguished about seven hours later, police said.

A 77-year-old woman from Tokyo died in a passenger car,

and a charred body was later recovered from the driver’s seat of a burned-out truck, police said. Of the 26 injured, five were in serious condition, police said. A warning about heavy snow was in effect late on Friday, when many Japanese started their year-end and New Year holidays.

Parts of the expressway remained closed for police investigation, removal and cleaning of the wreckage.

Taiwan hit by strong quake

A magnitude 6.6 earthquake struck off eastern Taiwan at 11.05 pm on Saturday, sending strong tremors through Taipei, New Taipei, and Yilan County. Data from the USGS showed the quake occurred at a depth of 67-72.8 kms, producing significant shaking across northern and eastern regions. Early reports showed no casualties.

Kash plan to shut FBI bldg final

FBI Director **Kash Patel** said FBI’s J Edgar Hoover building in Washington DC will be “shut down permanently” after previously discarding plans to move the bureau’s headquarters to Maryland, The Hills’ reported.

Instead, employees will report to the Ronald Reagan Building to occupy the former location of the US Agency for

International Development, which was dismantled by the Trump administration earlier this year.

“After over 20 years of failed attempts, we finalised a plan to permanently close the FBI’s Hoover headquarters and move the workforce into a safe, modern facility. Working directly with

President Trump and Congress, we accomplished what no one else could,” Patel said.

“This decision puts resources where they belong: defending the homeland, crushing violent crime, and protecting national security. It delivers better tools for today’s FBI workforce at a fraction of the cost.”



Xmas eve miracle \$2 lottery ticket wins \$1.8b jackpot

A Powerball ticket sold at a gas station in Arkansas, US, has won a massive \$1.817 billion jackpot in the Christmas Eve drawing, marking one of the biggest lottery wins in American history. The winning numbers were 04, 25, 31, 52 and 59, with the Powerball number 19. Lottery officials said the ticket was purchased at a Murphy USA outlet in Cabot, Arkansas.

The prize is the second-largest lottery jackpot ever in the US and the biggest Powerball



win of 2025, according to Powerball. The winner can choose a lump sum cash payout of \$834.9 million.

“Congratulations to the

newest Powerball jackpot winner! This is truly an extraordinary, life-changing prize,” said Matt Strawn, Powerball Product Group Chair and Iowa Lottery CEO.

“We also want to thank all the players who joined in this jackpot streak — every ticket purchased helps support public programs and services across the country.”

The winner’s identity has not yet been disclosed. Karen Reynolds, a spokesperson for the Arkansas Lottery, said the claims centre is closed for the

holidays and the winner is unlikely to come forward before Monday.

The jackpot followed 46 consecutive drawings without a top prize winner. The previous Powerball jackpot was won on September 6, when players in Missouri and Texas shared \$1.787 billion.

Officials said this is only the second time a Powerball jackpot has been won with a ticket sold in Arkansas, the first being in 2010. Powerball noted the last Christmas Eve jackpot win occurred in 2011. —AP

BANGKOK

Thailand and Cambodia signed a ceasefire agreement on Saturday to end weeks of fighting along their border over competing territorial claims. The agreement took effect at noon and calls for a halt in military movements and airspace violations for military purposes.

Only Thailand has carried out airstrikes, hitting sites in Cambodia as recently as Saturday morning, according to the Cambodian Defence Ministry.

The deal also calls for Thailand, after the ceasefire has held for 72 hours, to repatriate 18 Cambodian soldiers it

has held as prisoners since earlier fighting in July. Their release has been a major demand of the Cambodian side. Within hours of the signing, Thailand’s foreign ministry protested to Cambodia a Thai soldier sustained a permanent disability when he stepped on an anti-personnel land mine, which it charged

had been laid by Cambodian forces. The agreement was signed by the countries’ defence ministers, Cambodia’s Tea Seiha and Thailand’s Nattaphon Narkphanit, at a border checkpoint. It followed 3-day lower-level talks by military officials.

It declares the sides are committed to an earlier ceasefire that ended 5 days of fight in July and follow-up pacts. The original July ceasefire was brokered by Malaysia and pushed through by pressure from US President Trump, who threatened to withhold trade privileges unless Thailand and Cambodia agreed. It was formalised in more detail in Oct at a regional meet in Malaysia that Trump attended.

1-stop help desk for distressed Indian women in Canada

Toronto: The Consulate General of India in Toronto has established a ‘One Stop Centre for Women’, a dedicated support centre exclusively to assist women Indian nationals in distress.

The consulate has set up a 24x7 helpline, and said the new centre aims to provide critical and timely support to Indian passport holder women facing domestic violence, abuse, family conflict, abandonment, exploitation and legal challenges, among others.

One-Stop Centre for Women will provide coordinated, beneficiary-centred assistance by connecting aggrieved women to timely and right pathways of support. —PTI

England ends 18-match winless streak in Aus

MELBOURNE

England ended an 18-match winless streak in Australia and beat the home side by four wickets in the fourth Ashes test at the Melbourne Cricket Ground on Saturday.

England lost the first three tests to allow Australia to retain the Ashes in just 11 days of on-field action at Perth, Brisbane and Adelaide.

But England returned the favour by winning the MCG test Saturday inside two days, similar to Australia's opening win at Perth.

It was the first time the same series has had multiple two-day tests in 129 years.

The England winless streak had dated to the 2013-14 Ashes series, which Australia won 5-0. Since England won the 2010-11 Ashes 3-1, England had lost 16 matches and drawn the

other two of their 18 tests Down Under over a period of nearly 15 years.

Needing 175 second-innings runs to win and 98 after the tea break, England reached its target at 178-6 to clinch the match and send thousands of its long-suffering but faithful "Barmy Army" fans into frenzied celebration.

"It's obviously been a tough tour up until now," England captain Ben Stokes said. "The way that we did it was fantastic. It showed bravery, we were courageous in the way we operated."

England raced to 70-2 off the first 10 overs in its second innings, losing the wickets of Ben Duckett (34)

and Brydon Carse (6). Scott Boland removed Zak Crawley (37) and Jacob Bethell (40), who both made valuable contributions.

Joe Root (15) and Stokes (2) fell cheaply before Jamie Smith and Harry Brook guided the visiting side to a morale-boosting win ahead of the fifth and final test beginning Jan. 4 in Sydney.

Earlier Saturday, England bowled out Australia out for 132 in its second innings after lunch on Day 2.

On an MCG pitch offering substantial sideways movement for pace bowlers, England successfully chased down a target of 175 to win after 30

wickets had fallen in 4 1-2 sessions. The dismissal of opener Travis Head (46) was quickly followed by the departures of Usman Khawaja (0) and Alex Carey (4) in the next two overs as Australia slumped from 82-3 to 88-6 in the morning session.

Stokes (3-24) claimed the important wicket of Cameron Green (19) after lunch, caught at second slip, and Brydon Carse sliced through the tail to finish with 4-34.

"They got off to a flyer," Australia skipper Steve Smith said of England's second-innings runs chase. "If we got 50 or 60 more across both innings, we might have been there in the end."

Australia held an overall lead of 46 Friday after scoring 152, running through England for 110 in a dramatic first day.

Kevin Pietersen, Dinesh Karthik see selective criticism

MELBOURNE

England captain Ben Stokes on Saturday came down heavily on the overwhelmingly bowler-friendly Melbourne pitch on which 20 wickets fell on Day 1 of the just-concluded Boxing Day Test, saying such a track elsewhere in the world would have invoked a barrage of criticism.

Stokes' one-time teammate Kevin Pietersen and former India cricketer Dinesh Karthik too joined him in slamming the MCG pitch, and highlighted the selective criticism of Indian decks when spinners get wickets in a heap there. Stokes said it was not a pitch that suited the Boxing Day Test, even though his side won the match by four wickets.

"Being brutally honest, that's not really what you want. Boxing Day Test match. You don't want a game finishing in less than two days. Not ideal. But you can't change it once you start the game and you've just got to play what's in front of you," Stokes told the media after the match.

Further, Stokes indicated that if such a rain of wickets had happened elsewhere in the world then the critics would have sharpened their knives in a haste.

"But I'm pretty sure if that was somewhere else in the world, there'd be hell on. Not the best thing for games that should be played over five days. But we played a type of cricket that ended up getting the job done," he added.

Asked specifically if he was talking about spin-friendly pitches in Asia, Stokes replied rather tongue-in-cheek, "Your words, not mine."

The Australian and England bowlers combined to take 20 wickets here on Friday, while the hosts were

bundled out for 132 in their second innings in 34.3 overs in a little over one session on Saturday. The irony was not lost on Pietersen either.

"India ALWAYS gets hammered when wickets fall like crazy on day 1 of a Test and so I hope that Australia gets the same scrutiny! Fair is fair!" wrote former England skipper Pietersen on X.

The decision to leave 10mm grass on the MCG deck generated massive sideways movement, making batting here a lottery.

In all, 36 wickets tumbled in six sessions at Melbourne as the fourth Test ended inside two days with England winning by four wickets.

Australia stand-in captain

Steve Smith said the pitch offered a "little too much".

"(It was a) tricky one. 36 wickets, over two days, probably offered just a little bit too much," he said.

"It's tough as a groundsman, he's always looking for the right sort of balance, I suppose. Last year's wicket was an outstanding one. It went to day five (and the) last session."

"In an ideal world, every wicket does that and it's exciting for everyone, but maybe if you took it (down) from 10(mm) to 8(mm), it would have been a nice challenging wicket, but maybe a little bit more even, I suppose."

"(The) groundsman are always learning and you will probably take something from that, no doubt."

The entire Ashes series so far has seen action only on 13 days out of the total 20 match days. Earlier, the first Test at Perth too ended inside two days with the Aussies clinching it by eight wickets.

"MCG have produced an ordinary pitch here. Can't believe 2 out of the 4 ashes tests could end in 2 days. For all the hype, 4 ashes tests have happened in just 13 days," voiced Karthik.

Having drawn 2-2 in a five-Test away series in England, India have a couple of overseas assignments comprising two Tests each against Sri Lanka in August 2026, and a

tour of New Zealand in October, before hosting Australia for a five-Test affair in January-February 2027.

"Gambhir does have (a) strong backing within the power corridors of Indian cricket and obviously, if India retain the T20 World Cup or at least reach the final, he would be seamlessly continuing with his assignment. However, it would be interesting if Gambhir continues in Tests too," a BCCI source told PTI on conditions of anonymity.

"His advantage being (that there) aren't too many alternate options in red ball format since VVS Laxman isn't interested in coaching senior Test team," the source added.

The Indian dressing room, nowadays, is a confused arena with a lot of players not exactly feeling secured in the Gambhir regime unlike the Rahul Dravid era, when roles were defined. The players during Dravid's three years' tenure also got a long rope to prove their mettle.
